HOSPITAL (COLUMBUS COUNTY) - PERMISSION GRANTED TO CONSTRUCT

Bill Clark, Columbus County Hospital Administrator, requested the Board grant permission to the Columbus County Hospital Board of Trustees to proceed with the construction of a 12,000 square foot building to house a Medical Office Complex at the total project cost of ONE MILLION, ONE HUNDRED, EIGHTEEN THOUSAND, AND FOUR HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$1,118,400.00).

A motion was made by Commissioner Norris, seconded by Commissioner Gray and passed unanimously to grant permission to the Hospital Board of Trustees to construct a 12,000 square foot building to be used as a Medical Office Complex as requested.

COLLEGE (SCC) - RESOLUTION SUPPORTING INDUSTRIAL TRAINING CENTER

A motion was made by Commissioner Williams, seconded by commissioner Worley and passed unanimously to endorse the application for Southeastern Community College to apply to the Department of Community Colleges for the construction of a Business/Industrial Training Center.

<u> COLLEGE (SCC) - CAPITAL OUTLAY (VAN) BUDGET AMENDMENT</u>

A motion was made by Commissioner Worley, seconded by Commissioner Jacobs and passed unanimously to approve a budget amendment for Southeastern Community College to purchase a van that was omitted from the 1993-94 budget, in the amount of \$13,000 from Non-Departmental - Contingency, line item 10-660-9999 and expend in Southeastern Community College Capital Outlay, line item 10-680-9400.

<u>FIRE & RESCUE - NORTH WHITEVILLE FIRE PUBLIC HEARING SCHEDULED FOR</u> <u>ESTABLISHING A TAX RATE</u>

A motion was made by Commissioner Worley, seconded by Commissioner Williams and passed unanimously to schedule a public hearing for the North Whiteville Volunteer Fire Department on May 9, 1994 at 7:30 P.M. at the North Whiteville Fire Department, to consider a proposed tax rate for the district. FIREWORKS CELEBRATION - PERMISSION GRANTED TO TABOR CITY CHAMBER OF COMMERCE TO DISCHARGE FIREWORKS ON JULY 4TH

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A motion was made by Commissioner Norris, seconded by Commissioner Richardson and passed unanimously to grant authorization to the Tabor City Chamber of Commerce to possess, transport, receive, deliver and to cause to be discharged fireworks on the 4th of July at South Columbus High School in accordance with the North Carolina General Statutes 14-410.

<u>ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT – APPROVAL OF SHELL BUILDING TO BE CONSTRUCTED</u> IN THE INDUSTRIAL PARK

A motion was made by Commissioner Richardson, seconded by Commissioner Williams and passed unanimously to allow Steve Yost, Economic Development Director, to proceed with the proposal to build a 24,000 square foot shell building in the Industrial park for an estimated cost of \$188,000.00. The Department of Commerce will participate with a loan of \$150,000, and the balance will be financed by United Carolina Bank for a three (3) year term, with the County to pay the debt service on the mortgage.

<u>SOLID WASTE – LANDFILL TRANSITION PLAN ACCEPTED FROM MARLOWE,</u> <u>DREITZLER & ASSOCIATES</u>

A motion was made by Commissioner Richardson, seconded by Commissioner Williams and passed unanimously to accept the Engineering Proposal from Marlowe, Dreitzler & Associates for providing the Transition Plan for the Columbus County Landfill as required by the North Carolina Division of Solid Waste Management at a total cost as follows:

I. Transition Plan \$28,750	0.00	/
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II. Ground and Surface Water Monitoring 9,500.00

The motion further stated to direct Dempsey Herring, Assistant to the Administrator/Special Projects, to negotiate an estimated fee breakdown by Tasks, for the Landfill Transition Plan. A copy of the Transition Plan is on file in the office of the Clerk to the Board.

<u>BUILDING (SOCIAL SERVICES) – PUBLIC HEARING APPROVAL FOR A PROPOSED</u> INSTALLMENT PURCHASE AGREEMENT

A motion was made by Commissioner Norris, seconded by

Commissioner Worley and passed unanimously to schedule a public hearing at 7:30 P.M. on April 18, 1994, for the purpose of considering whether the Board of Commissioners should approve a proposed Installment Purchase Agreement for the construction of a Social Services Facility between the County and a North Carolina nonprofit corporation pursuant to Section 160A-20 of the North Carolina General Statutes.

<u>AIRPORT - BUDGET AMENDMENT (RUNWAY END IDENTIFICATION LIGHTS)</u>

A motion was made by Commissioner Jacobs, seconded by Commissioner Norris and passed unanimously to amend the Airport budget in the amount of \$3,000.00 for the purpose of replacing Runway End Identification Lights (REIL) to be appropriated from Non-Departmental - Contingency (10-660-9999) and expended in Airport - Maintenance and Repair Grounds (10-650-1500).

The Board concurred to direct Dempsey Herring, Assistant to Administrator/Special Projects, to develop a plan for the reorganization of the Airport and Airport Authority Board to be considered by the Board of Commissioners.

ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT - LIGHTING PLAN FOR INDUSTRIAL PARK APPROVED

Steve Yost, Economic Development Director, presented a proposed contract with Carolina Power & Light Company for providing lighting for the Industrial Park for a ten year period as follows:
