SECOND PUBLIC HEARING – CDBG GRANT for SCATTERED SITE HOUSING:

A second (2nd) and final public hearing was conducted for the purpose of receiving the views and opinions from the citizens of Columbus regarding the Scattered Site Housing Rehabilitation Grant. Ms. Lanett Dennis stated the following:

- 1. This is the second (2nd) and final of the two (2) required public hearings for this grant.
- 2. The first (1st) Public Hearing was conducted on February 5, 2002 and this will be the second (2nd) and final Public Hearing.
- 3. The Town Managers and Mayors meeting we had earlier to introduce this grant was very successful with high attendance.
- 4. We will be submitting the final application on February 28, 2002.

Commissioner Randy Britt requested Ms. Lanett Dennis to reiterate what this grant was about for the benefit of the residents who were not present at the first Public Hearing. She reiterated the following:

- 1. The State has allotted Columbus County with four hundred thousand (\$400,000) dollars that this allotment occurs every three (3) years.
- 2. This money is for the rehabilitation or repairing of houses for the applicants who meet the necessary requirements.
- 3. The houses to be repaired or rehabilitated must be owner occupied.
- 4. This grant is for the very low-income bracket.
- 5. The amount that can be expended on mobile homes is fifteen thousand (\$15,000) dollars.
- 6. The amount that can be expended on a stick-built house is twenty-nine thousand, nine hundred ninety-nine (\$29,999) dollars.
- 7. This money will not have to be paid back unless the property is sold or the owner dies.
- 8. There are three phases of this process. They are as follows:
 - a. Application (this is where we are now);
 - b. Form a Selection Committee to choose the applicants who are best qualified; and
 - c. Twelve (12) applicants will be chosen.

Commissioner Wilson made a motion for the Public Hearing to be closed, seconded by Commissioner Britt. Motion so carried.

PUBLIC HEARING for QZAB FINANCING

At 7:35 P.M., a Public Hearing was held for the purpose of receiving views and opinions from the citizens for the QZAB financing for the Guaranteed Energy Savings

Project. Sharon Penny with Whiteville City Schools was present and stated the following:

- 1. This loan will be used to change out heating, air conditioning and lighting in the Whiteville City School System.
- 2. The savings from this is guaranteed to pay off loan over a period of thirteen (13) years.
- 3. The savings realized will be thirty-five thousand and 00/100 (\$35,000.00) dollars.
- 4. We will be pooling with four or five (4 or 5) other counties due to our request being small to have a better chance in getting this loan.

A motion was made by Commissioner Britt to approve this application, seconded by Commissioner Jacobs. Motion so carried.

The Public Hearing was closed at 7:37 P.M.

QZAB FINANCING

Sharon Penny with the Whiteville City Schools requested the Board of Commissioners to adopt the following resolution allowing the Whiteville city School system to finance upgrades to schools in their jurisdiction through the QZAB (Qualified Zone Academy Bonds) Program.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE FILING OF AN APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL OF AN INSTALLMAENT PURCHASE CONTRACT AUTHROIZED BY SECTION 160A-20 OF THE NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL STATUTES

WHEREAS, the County of Columbus, North Carolina (the 'County') has been requested by the Whiteville City Board of Education to issue on its behalf a qualified zone academy bond (as defined in Section 1397E of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986,

as amended) to finance certain rehabilitation and repairs, including, without limitation. Improvements to the HVAC system, florescent lighting, paint, ceiling tile, plumbing and related improvements (collectively, the "improvements") to the existing public school facilities located at Whiteville High School, Central Middle School, Edgewood Elementary School, and Whiteville Primary, and

WHEREAS, the Whiteville City Board of Education has applied for and received from the North Carolina State Board of Education an allocation of Qualified Zone Academy Bond authority in the amount of \$ 565,000 to assist in financing the improvements; and

WHEREAS, the County desires to finance the improvements by the use of an installment purchase contract authorized under North Carolina General Statute 160A, Article 3, Section 20; and

WHEREAS, findings of fact by this governing body must be presented to enable the North Carolina Local Government Commission to make its findings of fact set forth in North Carolina General Statute 159, Article 8, Section 151, prior to approval of the proposed contract.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County meeting in regular session on the 18th day of February 2002 makes the following findings of fact:

- 1. The proposed contract is necessary or expedient to provide the citizens and residents of the County with adequate facilities for services offered by the County
- 2. The proposed contract is preferable to a bond issue for the same purpose because the cost to issue general obligation bonds would be greater. Further, the cost of the improvements exceeds the amount that can prudently be raised from available appropriation, unappropriated fund balances, and non-voted bonds that could be issued by the County in the current fiscal year pursuant to Article V, Section 4, of the North Carolina Constitution (the "two-thirds limitation").
- 3. The sums to fall due under the contract are not excessive for the proposed purpose based on actual bids awarded and projected costs.
- 4. The County's debt management procedures and policies are good because the County carries **Out** policies in strict compliance with the law and will continue to provide adequate debt management as directed by the Local Government Commission of North Carolina.
- 5. If a tax increase is necessary to meet the sums to fall due under the proposed contract, such increase will not exceed 1.0 cent per one hundred dollars valuation and is deemed not to be excessive.
- 6. The County is not in default in any of its debt service obligations.
- 7. Attorneys for the County have rendered an opinion that the improvements are authorized by law and are a purpose for which public funds may be expended pursuant to the Constitution and Laws of North Carolina.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Administrator, Assistant County Administrator for Budget and Finance and County Attorney are hereby authorized to act on behalf of the County of Columbus, North Carolina in filing an application with the North Carolina Local Government Commission for approval of the Improvements and the proposed financing contract, to seek bank bids, to publish a notice of public hearing substantially in the form of Exhibit A attached hereto in a local newspaper of general circulation in the County, and to take such other actions not inconsistent with this resolution. The Board of County Commissioners also ratifies and confirms prior actions not inconsistent with this resolution.

THIS RESOLUTION is effective upon its adoption is the 18th y of February 2002.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) PROGRAM CITIZEN PARTICIPATION PLAN COLUMBUS COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA

I. INTRODUCTION & STATEMENT OF INTENT

In accordance with the North Carolina Division of Community Assistance arid the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development requirements the County of Columbus has adopted the following Plan to ensure that citizens may have access to the citizen participation process and to ensure that the County has in place a complaint procedure for the CDBG program.

II. SCOPE OF PARTICIPATION

Citizen participation shall include involvement in the identification of community needs that can be addressed by the CDBG program the development of CDBG applications; any amendment to the CDBG program and assessing the performance of a CDBG program upon its completion. The opportunity for citizen participation will be possible at Public Hearings held on the CDBG program by the Columbus County Commissioners, at the regular meetings of the Columbus County Housing Advisory Committee (on the third Monday of each month), and at other opportunities for meetings with public officials, which happen from time to time, and other events where the issue of housing will arise.

III. STANDARDS OF CITIZEN PARTICIPATION

All public hearings shall be conducted with freedom of access for all citizens. If citizens require technical assistance to understand any aspect of the CDBG program they are to contact Columbus County officials. As a part of this assistance the County shall maintain a list of individuals to serve as translators for any non-English speaking resident requiring a translator to understand or comment on the CDBG program.

IV. CITIZEN PARTICIPATION

Citizens shall be involved in the determination of priorities and County needs. The views and proposals of citizens concerning County needs and priorities, especially the views of low and moderate income persons and members of minority groups shall be solicited through two public hearings held prior to the submission of a CDBG application. During these public hearings citizens shall be encouraged to submit views and proposals regarding County needs. Comments may be either oral or written. Written comments may be presented during the public hearing or they may be mailed for consideration prior to the

hearing. In any case, written comments, to be considered at a hearing must be received prior to the time of the public hearing. The County will respond to all written comments within ten (10) calendar days of receipt of the comments. The response will outline the action taken regarding the comments and the reasons for action.

All written comments should be addressed to:

Upon receipt of comments they will be forwarded to the Community Development Office.

Adequate notice of public hearings will be provided in a timely manner and in such a way as to make them accessible and understandable to all citizens. Notices for required public hearings shall appear in a newspaper of general circulation in the County at least one prior to the date of the public hearing. Notices shall be published not less than ten days nor more than twenty-five days before the date fixed for the hearing. Such notices shall indicate the date, time, place, and purpose of the public bearing.

Citizen participation for a CDBG project shall include the following public hearings:

<u>Planning Stage</u> Prior to the preparation of an application a public hearing shall be

held to explain the CDBG program and to obtain views and proposals of citizens in regard to community/County needs.

<u>Application Stage</u> Prior to the submission of a CDBO application a public hearing

shall be held to explain the CDBG application's proposed

activities, design, impacts and costs. Citizen views and comments

obtained at this public hearing will be considered for incorporation into the final CDBG application.

Amendment Process A public hearing will be held in accordance with NC Department

of Commerce requirements prior to the submission of an amendment if required.

<u>Project Closeout</u> During the grant closeout period the County will hold a public

hearing to access the program's performance.

V. AVAILABILITY OF COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT RECORDS

As provided in CDBG regulations, the County of Columbus will make public community development records and information consistent with applicable State and local laws regarding personal privacy and obligations of confidentiality. Documents shall be on file for inspection in the County Finance Officers' office.

Type of Document Available for Review

- 1. Mailing and promotional materials.
- 2. Records of public hearings.
- 3. Key documents (including the application (without income information), letters of approval, grant agreement, written Citizen Participation Plan, performance reports, and other reports as required by the NC Department of Commerce.
- 4. Copies of the regulations, notices, transmittals, and letters, etc—, governing the CDBG program.
- 5. Documents regarding other important program requirements such as contracting procedures, environmental policies, fair housing and other equal opportunity requirements, relocation provisions, and the A—95 review process.

Copies of these documents are subject to a fee of \$0.25 per page.

All information in CDBG files other than the previously listed information is private. This includes all information pertaining to employment, income, bank deposits and other assets, marital status, and total assets of beneficiary (ies) employees (seeking employment, hired and/or retained) and the economic development beneficiary (ies), will be maintained in accordance with the requirements of the State of North Carolina and will be opened only in the following cases;

- The County Administrator, Assistant County Administrator, the Community
 Development Office (CFCOG), the County Finance Officer, the County Clerk, the
 County Attorney, Columbus County Housing Advisory Committee, and County
 Commissioners may examine the file.
- 2. By court order of competent jurisdiction, designated persons may examine all material on file.
- 3. An official of an agency of the State or Federal government, or any political subdivision of the State, may inspect any portion of the files when County officials or the Community Development Office deems such an inspection as necessary and essential to the pursuance of a proper function of the inspecting agency.

Each individual requesting access to confidential information will be required to submit satisfactory proof of identity and a record will be made of each disclosure. The record will be placed in the respective file.

VI. GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE

The County will use the following procedures to process citizen complaints. Citizens may make comments at any point in the program including planning, implementation, and closeout. The County will respond in writing to written citizen comments. Citizen comments should be mailed to:

The Comfit will respond to all written comments within ten calendar days of receipt of the comments. The Community Development Office (administrators of the CDBG grant) will be the first level of review. Review by the Columbus County Housing Advisory Committee may also be granted. Decisions made by the Advisory Committee will be considered final. If the citizen is dissatisfied with the local response, they may write to the NC Department of Commerce, P.O. BOX 12600. Raleigh, NC 27605. The State will respond only to written comments within ten calendar days of the receipt of the comments.

All complaints received by the County and all responses shall be maintained in a complaint

Columbus County Scattered Site Housing Program 2002 Applicant Ranking Scheme

Program Minimum Eligibility Criteria

All applicants in the Scattered Site Housing (SSH) Program pool of applications will have met the following minimum requirements:

- 1. Unit must be owner occupied. Rental properties do not qualify.
- 2. Very-low income household with income at or below the area media income as determined annually by the department of Housing and Urban Development.
- 3. Manufactured homes must be real property and have been constructed in 1978 or after.
- 4. If unit is located in a floodplain, the homeowner must have current and maintain flood insurance.

Selection Criteria

The criteria for selection and prioritization of all eligible SSH applications are based on special population and overall community needs as advocated by the Columbus County SSH Selection Committee, referred to as the Columbus County Housing Advisory Committee, and are as follows:

- 1) Age Households with senior citizen occupants or occupied solely by seniors will be considered highest in priority.
- 2) Disability Households with occupants or solely consisting of occupants with disabilities are given priority.
- 3) Sanitary Condition . Households with inadequate, inoperable, or non-existent sanitation facilities are given priority (i.e. failing septic systems and pit privies).
- 4) Income Level Households will be placed on an income level scale depending on the percentage of their income to the SSH Program limits.
- 5) Condition of Unit Households will be ranked based on the living conditions within the home and the basic needs condition of services such as plumbing, heating, and electricity.
- 6) Occupancy Load Households exceeding two persons per bedroom will be given consideration.

Special considerations or priorities may be assessed on a case by case basis for sites where household relocation activities are beneficial and feasible per the guidelines of the

Scattered Site Housing Program and Columbus County's Residential Anti-Displacement and Relocation Assistance Plan. Other additional weighted factors, i.e. single parent with dependent children, may be implemented if the preliminary ranking factors above fail to produce an adequate "final list". Secondary lists will also be maintained to fill any spots should individuals on the "final list" be removed for any reason.

Applicants who have received other types of housing assistance will accordingly be given less priority than applicants who have not received any other type of assistance.

VETERANS SERVICES UPDATE

Sherri Blackman, Veterans Services Officer, presented the following update to the County Commissioners.

- 1. This department serves approximately twelve thousand (12,000) veterans and dependents and this number does not include individual military people.
- 2. Eighteen million (\$18,000,000) dollars are generated in Columbus County.
- 3. Benefits have increased from four hundred ninety-three thousand to four hundred ninety-seven thousand (\$497,000) dollars.
- 4. We are a member of the North Carolina Association of Veterans Offices.
- 5. We are considered a premier training station in North Carolina.
- 6. We have written our own training manual which is considered to be the best in the country.
- 7. We are in District IV which included six (6) counties. The six (6) counties are Columbus, Brunswick, Bladen, Onslow, Pender and New Hanover.
- 8. The personnel in this department is very courteous to the visiting veterans.
- 9. Applications are now being taken for the North Carolina Association of Veterans Affairs Scholarship. The scholarship is a four (4) year scholarship which takes care of basically everything.
- 10. There are presently three thousand six hundred (3,600) veterans in Columbus County and with their dependents the number escalates up to twelve thousand (12,000).
- 11. In this department, confidentiality is top notch.

<u>DEPARTMENT OF AGING - Family Care Giver Support In-Home Aide Respite</u> <u>Grant</u>

Ed Worley, Department of Aging Director, requested the Board of Commissioners to approve the Family Care Giver Support In-Home Aide Respite Grant in the amount of eleven thousand six hundred forty-eight and 00/100 (\$11,648.00) dollars. After Wade Lewis, Engineer for Hobbs, Upchurch and Associates, made this presentation, Chairman McKenzie opened the floor for comments from the audience. The comments were as follows:

George Dickerson: I am a Columbus County taxpayer and live at 1004 Hinson's Crossroads. It is my opinion that every citizen in Columbus County should have access to the County water. I think the mandate like they have in Brunswick County should be enforced in this County and it is a good idea. By using this method, every taypayer would have access to the County water.

Mr. Moore: I am now paying eighty (\$80.00) dollars per month for a water softener. I live on Evergreen School Road and there are five (5) families who reside on this road. The monthly water bill would not be a problem for me.

Earl Cribb: I reside in between Cerro Gordo and Fair Bluff on Highway 76. I pay thirty-five (\$35.00) dollars plus monthly now to get my water usable.

Ken Bower: I reside on Highway 242, Evergreen School Road. The water is undrinkable.

<u>Karen Williamson</u>: I reside on Evergreen School Road. The water in that area is undrinkable and smells like rotten eggs. We desperately need the County water.

<u>Citizen (did not state name)</u>: I reside in Robeson County and in the process of developing a subdivision on RR1004. The biggest factor holding up progress is the accessibility and the condition of water. I suggest that you go forward with what available funds you have on hand.

<u>Citizen (did not state name)</u>: I reside on Rough-N-Ready Road, Hinsons Crossroads to Fair Bluff. The quality of the water is terrible. We need County water now.

Chairman McKenzie stated it was the general consensus of the public citizens that spoke the water they were using was undrinkable, malodorous and they need access to County water.

Commissioner Jacobs made a motion for Lines 1 through 8 be added in their entirety, seconded by Commissioner Memory.

Commissioner Memory stated he would like to revise his motion for Lines 1 through 6 on the list presented be added and Lines 7 and 8 be tabled until further discussion had occurred. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Jacobs.

Commissioner Wilson made a motion for Lines 1 through 8 be added in their entirety. Commissioner McKenzie seconded the motion.

After further discussion, a role call was conducted by the Clerk to the Board on the last motion presented. The role call resulted in the following: Yeas: 3 Nays: 4

It was the general consensus of the Board of Commissioners to add Lines 1 through 6 and table Lines 7 and 8 until more details could be collected and further discussion be held.
