Mr. Hill stated the three (3) Chris Parker homes were in the process of being settled and there were an eighteen (18) day objection period in process now. If no one objects to this within this period of time, they will be settled.

Agenda Item #5: PRESENTATION of THANKS:

Andy Inman, private citizen, stated he would like to thank the County Commissioners for their hard work in providing the accessibility of County water to the citizens. I have been on the County water for a long time and have thoroughly enjoyed it. The advantages to having County water are: 1) good quality of water; 2) a good supply of water; 3) no maintenance of a water pump; and 4) having water during disasters such as the recent ice storm.

In addition, Mr. Inman stated he was very opposed to the possible tax increase that is being

discussed to cover the deficit in Water Districts II and III. We are heavily taxed now and cannot stand any more taxes.

Chairman Memory asked Mr. Pridgen if he had this matching fifteen (15%) percent funds in his budget. Mr. Pridgen replied stating yes he could find it somewhere. In addition, Chairman Memory asked Mr. Pridgen what the status of the Riegelwood Library was. Mr. Pridgen replied stating we still need to move a box car but it is progressing nicely.

Agenda Item #7: <u>SOLID WASTE - CPI (CONSUMER PRICE INDEX) ADJUSTMENT for TIPPING FEE</u>:

Chuck Stanley, Columbus County Solid Waste Director, requested Board acceptance of the yearly CPI (Consumer Price Index) adjustment for tipping fees from Waste Management as follows:

Present Tipping Fee \$44.83 New Tipping Fee \$45.31

This will give Columbus County one and 00/100 (\$1.00) dollar to help offset the cost fo the five (5) manned convenience centers in the County.

Commissioner Jacobs made a motion to approve the Solid Waste Tipping Fee to be forty-five and 31/100 (\$45.31) dollars per ton, seconded by Commissioner Norris. The motion so carried.

Commissioner Wilson asked Mr. Stanley if any attempts had been made to negotiate the LCID monthly rate. Mr. Stanley replied stating many attempts had been made with no success.

Commissioner Godwin asked Mr. Stanley what would happen if we should decline to go along with the price increases. Mr. Stanley replied stating we did not have any choice in this situation due to the fact we were locked into a contract.

Agenda Item #8: PERSONNEL - DEPARTMENTAL UPDATE:

Virginia Taylor, Personnel Director, presented the following Departmental Update to the Board.

- 1. The Personnel Department is doing fine.
- 2. I have set up some customer service classes through Southeastern Community College for those workers who greet the public.
- 3. I have set up some Spanish classes for those departments who have a high influx of Spanish speaking clients.
- 4. I would like to thank the Board of Commissioners for their approval of the Pay Plan Classification update.
- 5. I would like to meet with the Personnel Committee on February 24, 2004 at 6:00 P.M..
- 6. At the present time, our employees are not receiving any recognition for their years of services. The only recognition is a retirement plaque for those employees who work twenty (20) or more years. I would like the Board to approve the ordering of lapel pins for years of services in increments of five (5) years.

Discussion was conducted among the Board members regarding the recognition of employees through the lapel pins for years of services. It was the general consensus of the Board for Personnel to order the lapel pins to be given to employees for their years of service in increments of five (5) years.

Agenda Item #9: PRESENTATION by DAVID LONG:

Noah David Long, representative of the Columbus County Citizen and Taxpayer Association, presented the following.

- 1. I would like for all of the members of the Board to remember the process of how you became elected officials.
- 2. The citizens of Columbus County Water and Sewer Districts II and III were not delivered what was voted on.
- 3. In accordance with N.C.G.S. §162-91 taxes are authorized. In accordance with N.C.G.S. §162-92 Special Assessments are authorized.
- 4. The votes voted on district-wide water and they did not get this. We would like to know why. Chairman Memory responded stating that USDA, who is the agency the money was borrowed from had target bench marks to go by. One (1) of those target bench marks was the density areas. The required minimum number of houses per mile was ten (10) and the preferred number of houses per mile was fourteen (14) or fifteen (15) with the exception of pending situations.
- 5. The initial boundaries of the water district need to be considered in whatever solution you

Agenda Item #10: <u>RESOLUTION - REQUEST for DE-ANNEXATION of TWO (2)</u> <u>CONVENIENCE STORES</u>:

Private citizens, by Petition, requested the Board's approval and adoption of the following Resolution requesting the de-annexation of two (2) convenience stores.

REQUEST for DE-ANNEXATION of TWO (2) RURAL CONVENIENCE STORES

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, through private citizen input, we were made aware of a 2002 law, authorized by the legislature and approved by Brunswick's Town Council, that allowed the Town of Brunswick to annex two (2) convenience stores that are located miles away from the town. The said two (2) stores being the Timesaver at New Hope and the Minuteman Convenience Store on N.C. 130 south of Brunswick.

WHEREAS, the satellite annexations allow the stores to sell beer and wine for take-out, making them the only stores in rural parts of Columbus County that can legally sell alcohol.

WHEREAS, as a result of this annexation, private citizens owning stores in the rural parts of Columbus County presented petitions to the Board requesting a special referendum be held for the sale of beer and wine in all of the unincorporated areas of Columbus County.

WHEREAS, a bond referendum was held and the voters of Columbus County solidly spoke that they did not want the sale of alcohol in the rural areas.

WHEREAS, the annexation of the two (2) rural convenience stores, which allows them to sell alcohol and the fact that the other stores in the rural areas are unable to do so, has become a highly controversial matter.

WHEREAS, we have been presented a petition for the de-annexation of the two (2) convenience stores from the private citizens of Columbus County, therefore, providing no advantage to any said merchant.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED we, the Columbus County Board of Commissioners, are requesting the de-annexation of the two (2) convenience stores that were annexed by legislature and approved by Brunswick's Town Council in 2002.

URGING STRONGER PENALTIES for OFFENDERS that SELL and MANUFACTURE METHAMPHETAMINE in NORTH CAROLINA RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the use, sale and manufacture of methamphetamine is becoming more evident in North Carolina; **and**

WHEREAS, the operation of manufacturing methamphetamine poses extreme danger, not only to children who may inhabit the premises, but to law enforcement officers and fireman who may be called to the scene; **and**

WHEREAS, the availability of methamphetamine drugs needs to be completely eradicated through all means possible.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Columbus County Board of Commissioners urges the North Carolina Legislature to adopt laws that impose stronger penalties for offenders who operate clandestine methamphetamine labs, and for the sale and/or for sale of methamphetamine.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that adequate state and federal funding for law enforcement agencies be a top priority in the Legislature and that fire departments have availability to grants and other sources in order to maintain necessary equipment for dealing with the dangers

posed by dealing with methamphetamine labs.

Agenda Item #12: COMMENTS:

Chairman Memory stated it was now time for any comments anyone had to be made. The following people spoke.

A. Public:

- 1. **Penny Grainger:** I am presenting additional petitions to the Board on behalf of the Columbus County Citizen and Taxpayer Association with two hundred (200) more signatures supporting no mandatory water connections. As of February 26, 2004, I have submitted a total of one thousand four hundred (1,400) signatures.
- 2. **Billy Clarence Gerald:** I am speaking in regards to the landfill that is being proposed in the Dothan area and have concerns about solid waste being located in this area. I do not want this and the other people don't either.

B. Board of Commissioners:

Commissioner McKenzie: I have two (2) issues that need to be addressed. They are as follows:

1. I think we need to set a workshop date to discuss water issues and the options that have supplied to the Board by private citizens relative to their feasibility. I would like to know when this workshop can be held.

In-depth discussion was held among the Board as to the timeliness of this workshop. Chairman Memory stated it would be more advantageous to wait until we hear from the request that has been submitted to USDA regarding the deferment of the payment on the principal and interest for Columbus County Water and Sewer Districts II and III. At that time, we would know more about the options we could take. After additional discussion was conducted, it was the general consensus of the Board to wait at least ten (10) days to two (2) weeks before a workshop was conducted.

2. I have just discovered that Columbus County Water and Sewer District I is purchasing water from the Town of Tabor City in the amount of one hundred eight and 00/100 (\$108,000.00) dollars per year and paying a meter reader in the amount of thirteen thousand and 00/100 (\$13,000.00) dollars per year. I am suggesting that we look into Columbus County Water and Sewer District I purchasing water from Columbus County Water and Sewer District II and we take over the job of meter reading. I think this could save the County some money and make Columbus County Water and Sewer District II more operational. I also understand that Columbus County Water and Sewer Districts I and II would have to be connected.

After discussion was conducted by the Board, Commissioner McKenzie made a motion to direct Billy Joe Farmer, County Administrator, to look into the feasibility of Columbus County Water and Sewer District I purchasing water from Columbus County Water and Sewer District II, the connection of Columbus County Water and Sewer Districts I and II, and the Columbus County Public Utilities taking over the meter reading position. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Godwin. The motion so carried.

OTHER:

Sheriff's Department:

Sheriff Chris Batten announced he had set up a meeting with Acme-Delco-Riegelwood Fire Department this Friday, February 20, 2004, at 11:00 A.M., in Riegelwood with the fire and rescue personnel and invited the Board members to attend. Mr. Batten stated that injuries to the law enforcement personnel was increasing and he would like to see the law changed in these incidences from a misdemeanor to a felony.
