At 7:30 P.M., Chairman Memory called the meeting to order. The invocation was delivered by Commissioner Sammie Jacobs. Everyone in attendance stood and pledged Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

Floyd Adams stated the six (6) listed under Replacement Work - Under Construction consisted of three (3) of the Chris Parker homes of which one (1) has been released and the other two are expected to be released shortly. The other three (3) consisted of the routine houses and one was expected to be finished by the end of this week and the others would be finished by next week.

Request for Direction on Mable Moore:

Floyd Adams requested direction be given by the Board on the Mable Moore situation. He stated the following:

- 1. Mable Moore, situated on the Mosely Moore Road, applied for this program when she was supposed to;
- 2. She applied at the Dream Center and then the Dream Center was to forward her paperwork to Columbus County;
- 3. The application Ms. Moore filled out was somehow lost on the process;
- 4. Ms. Moore has made an appeal to the Task Force Committee and to the State regarding this matter;
- 5. Ms. Yolanda Abrams from the State has recommended that Columbus County accept Ms. Moore's application;
- 6. The State has agreed to add additional funds to cover Ms. Moore's application;
- 7. I am recommending the Columbus County Commissioner approve Ms. Moore's application;
- 8. The cost of Ms. Moore's application will be seventy-nine thousand five hundred and 00/100 (\$79,500.00) dollars and I am officially requested the Columbus County Commissioners add Ms. Mable Moore to the list at this cost; **and**
- 9. I further recommend the Columbus County Commissioners make Ms. Moore's application contingent on the additional State funding.

Commissioner McKenzie made a motion to add Ms. Mable Moore to the CHAF Program at the cost of seventy-nine thousand five hundred and 00/100 (\$79,500.00) dollars, being contingent on the State adding additional funds for this application, seconded by Commissioner Norris. The motion so carried.

Status of Project in Brunswick:

Commissioner Dutton asked Mr. Adams what the status of the project in Brunswick was. Mr. Adams replied stating he was working on two (2) projects and they are as follows:

- 1. **Scattered Site Housing Grant:** we started with eight (8) houses and it has been reduced to seven (7). Three (3) of these houses have been completed and the contracts have been awarded on the other four (4).
- 2. **Concentrated Needs Housing Grant:** this grant entails houses in the Brunswick Community and the Green Acres Community. We have completed one (1) of the houses. On the other seven (7) houses, the lead-based paint process is complete. The bidding process is in progress. The relocation is in process. I hope to have this information to the Board in April, 2004. This grant was originally for seven hundred thousand and 00/100 (\$700,000.00) dollars, but due to the State releasing only four hundred thousand and 00/100 (\$400,000.00) dollars originally, I had to redo my paperwork to reflect this reduction. I need to clean up the paperwork to reflect the full amount of seven hundred thousand and 00/100 (\$700,000.00) dollars. Part of this grant was for the extension of waterlines and I do not know at what stage this is at.

Agenda Item #5:SOUTHEASTERNREGIONALMENTALHEALTH,DEVELOPMENTALDISABILITIESandSUBSTANCEABUSESERVICESUPDATE:

Stephen Ramey, Area Director, presented the following update to the Board on the Southeastern Regional Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities and Substance Abuse Services.

- 1. I would like to express deep appreciation for the working relationship I have experienced with the Administration Staff and the renovation crew during this process.
- 2. I would like to thank Ms. Marian Duncan for her much-needed help. Without the help from Ms. Duncan, this task could not have been accomplished.
- 3. **Columbus County Renovations:** The renovation project is divided into "phases". Phase I is almost complete. It is expected to cost approximately sixty thousand and 00/100 (\$60,000.00) dollars, which will be paid by Southeastern Regional Mental Health, Developmental Disabilities and Substance Abuse Services (Area Program). Phase II will begin upon completion of Phase I.
- 4. **Emergency Services Grant Request:** The Area Program is submitting a grant request to the Kate B. Reynold Charitable Trust to expand emergency services. If the grant is funded, mobile emergency teams and a twenty-four (24) hour crisis station will be established.
- 5. **System Reform:** On January 15, 2004, the North Carolina Division of Mental Health, Development Disabilities and Substance Abuse Services (the Division) published its final draft to revise the behavioral health service standards for North Carolina. If approved by the federal government (Centers for Medicare and Medicaid), it will be implemented on January 1, 2005. From a fiscal perspective, this change will alter the rates and types of services that are reimbursed through Medicaid. Additionally, this change will impact all local mental health agencies in terms of the rate and pace of mental health reform as required by the State of North Carolina.
- 6. **Legislative Proposals:** The North Carolina Council of Community Programs is proposing several legislative initiatives. The primary areas of focus are: 1) 2004/05 Budget; 2) the role of local management entity (LME); and 3) the local government retirement system.
- 7. **Financial Reports and Area Board Minutes:** Quarterly Financial Reports continue to be submitted to the Division and the County Administrator. The Annual Audit Report for Fiscal year 2002/03 was complete and accepted by the Local Government Commission. Copies of the report were provided to each County Commissioner and County Administrator/Manager in Bladen, Columbus, Robeson and Scotland Counties. Additional, a copy of the Area Board meeting minutes and financials is sent to each County Administrator/Manager in the catchment area.

Commissioner McKenzie stated he would like to personally thank Mr. Stephen Ramey for the help he provided in a critical situation that occurred recently. I would like for everyone to know he was there when the need arose and was very helpful.

Chairman Memory stated he would like to discuss a concern a constituent had relative to three (3) houses being dispensed of and purchased by a former employee. He asked Mr. Ramey if he would have this same practice in Columbus County. Mr. Ramey stated the following:

- 1. The buildings in question were under leased and the lease has been transferred;
- 2. We have sold some property due to downsizing;
- 3. I was not directly involved in the transaction, but I do understand that some property was sold to a former employee who had been an employee for seventeen (17) years, for forty thousand and 00/100 (\$40,000.00) dollars, at six and one-half ($6\frac{1}{2}$ %) percent interest; **and**
- 4. When transactions of this nature are done, we do them in a way to protect the staff and the consumers.

Agenda Item #6: <u>CRIMINAL JUSTICE PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM</u>:

Kay Horne, Chairperson, requested Board approval of the following two (2) items.

1. Application for Continuation of Implementation Funding in the amount of seventy-five thousand one hundred three and 00/100 (\$75,103.00) dollars.

Kay Horne requested Board approval of this application. She stated for this amount of money, we provided a great deal of service. It entails the electronic monitoring of jail inmates and if all the units they have been provided are fully utilized, it will save Columbus County several thousand dollars.

Chairman Memory asked Ms. Horne what the percentage of usage was on the ankle bracelets. Ms. Horne replied stating they had got a late start and were in the process of making everyone aware of these devices.

Commissioner Dutton made a motion to approve the Application for Continuation of

Implementation Funding in the amount of seventy-five thousand one hundred three and 00/100 (\$75,103.00) dollars, seconded by Commissioner McKenzie. The motion so carried.

2. Appointment of the following people for membership to the Columbus County Criminal Justice Partnership Advisory Board.

Kay Horne requested Board approval of the following recommended people: 1) Bill Horne; 2) Mike Helm; 3)Annie Brown; 4) Dawn Mehalic; **and** 5) Ricky Rouse.

Commissioner Dutton made a motion to approve the appointment of Bill Horne, Mike Helm, Annie Brown, Dawn Mehalic and Ricky Rouse to the Columbus County Criminal Justice Partnership Advisory Board, seconded by Commissioner McKenzie. The motion so carried.

Agenda Item #7:SOIL and WATER CONSERVATION - APPROVAL of SIMMONS
BAY PROJECT BID PACKAGE:

Donna Register, District Conservationist, requested Board approval of the Simmons Bay Project Bid Package. She stated the Corps of Engineers gave the Simmons Bay Watershed an unsatisfactory rating. This project is to clear and snag the Simmons Bay Watershed in order to receive a satisfactory rating. This document will be on file in the Office of the Clerk to the Board for review.

Commissioner McKenzie made a motion to approve the Simmons Bay Project Bid Package, seconded by Commissioner Norris. The motion so carried.

Ms. Register stated she would need help with informing the landowners of this project. Mr. James E. Hill, Jr., Columbus County Attorney, stated he would work with Richard Gore, Tax Administrator, in accomplishing this task.

Chairman Memory asked Ms. Register if the Town of Lake Waccacmaw got the grant they had applied for. Ms. Register replied stating the Town of Lake Waccamaw had received a grant in the amount of two hundred fifty thousand and 00/100 (\$250,000.00) dollars.

Agenda Item #15: <u>COMMENTS</u>:

Chairman Memory asked if anyone had anything they would like to discuss. The following people spoke.

D. **Public:**

1. **Penny Grainger:** I am presenting to you, tonight, more Petitions for the removal of mandatory water connections in Columbus County with fifty (50) additional signatures. As of today's date, the total number of signatures on these petitions is one thousand four hundred fifty (1,450). You have previously asked if all the signatures on these petitions were from the people who lived in Water Districts II and III and my answer is no. I would like to ask the Board a question. Why has the tax rate in Columbus County increased in the last few years? From the information at these meetings I have been attending, some of the tax money has been utilized in the water districts and I would like to know why these signatures have to be restricted to Water Districts II and III.

Chairman Memory replied stating the citizens in these two (2) districts were the only eligible voters that could vote on the water and the signatures on the petitions need to be restricted in Water District II and III.

Ms. Grainger stated the following to the Board, "You should remember that the people put you in office and the people can take you out of the office".

- 2. **Doug Klier:** I would like to know if you were aware of the tax value of the Hill property that was purchased on October 4, 2004 before you purchased it. I will tell you what the tax value was and that is three hundred forty-three thousand five hundred and 00/100 (\$343,500.00) dollars. We, the people, think you overpaid for this property.
- 3. **Ricky Rhodes:** I am requesting that a copy of the 2002 2003 Financial Report for Columbus County be released to the Columbus County Citizen and Taxpayer Association at ten (\$.10) cents per copy which was the cost at the time of the original request on December 26, 2004.

After discussion was conducted by the Board regarding this matter, Commissioner McKenzie made a motion to release the copies to the Columbus County Citizen and Taxpayer Association at ten (\$.10) cents per copy, seconded by Commissioner Dutton. The motion so carried.

4. **David Long:** From the information I have received from the copies of the Columbus County Financial Reports, it is apparent that money from the General Fund has been used for water. Why are you stating now that money from the General Fund cannot be utilized to help in

Water Districts II and III.

Chairman Memory replied stating the Board discovered the fact that this practice was being done in late 2001 and raised the water rates to pay back the money to the General Fund.

Mr. Long stating in the year ending 2001, a transfer of eighty-eight thousand and 00/100 (\$88,000.00) dollars was transferred to Water District II.

James E. Hill, Jr., Columbus County Attorney, replied stating that money has to be advanced on the onset of these water districts, but a reimbursement resolution is in place for Columbus County to reimburse itself once the bonds have been sold for the said district.

Mr. Long asked the following question, "Is it realistic to utilize General Fund monies to help out until a water district becomes operational"? I have noticed in the Solid Waste Account, there is a sizable Retained Earnings amount. You also have Enterprise Funds such as Solid Waste, Water Districts I, II and III.

B County Commissioners:

2. **Commissioner Wilson:** we have been very generous in helping our citizens recover from the ice storm in waiving the leaf and limb fee and the inspection fee for electrical reconnects.
