**7:00 P.M.:****PUBLIC HEARING NUMBER ONE (1): Application for 2005-06 Community development Block Grant Funding:****PUBLIC HEARING CALLED TO ORDER:**

At 7:00 P.M., Chairman Memory called the Public Hearing to order and stated the purpose of this public hearing is to receive views and opinions from the citizens of Columbus County with regard to community development and housing needs. He requested Darren Currie, Assistant County Administrator, to explain.

Mr. Currie stated Columbus County would be applying for another CDBG Grant and that Floyd Adams, The Adams Company, Incorporated, would be handling the details and requested Mr. Adams to present the details surrounding this grant.

Mr. Adams stated the following:

1. The funding cycle is up for Concentrated Site Housing Needs and it is time for Columbus County to apply for another grant;
2. Columbus County has a November 15, 2004 application deadline;
3. This grant requires two (2) public hearings and this will be the first public hearing of the two (2) required;
4. This grants allows us to identify the target areas in Columbus County where this work is needed;
5. I am open for any suggestions you may have on the areas of concentration at this meeting;
6. At the next public hearing, you will need to bring back the feasible areas within Columbus County, and, my staff and I will view of areas and work with you before submitting the final areas;
7. This grant will be for seven hundred thousand, and 00/100 (\$700,000.00) dollars;
8. There have been significant changes in the way the money is being distributing in the eastern part of the State; **and**
9. My suggestion to you is to concentrate on the most needed areas of low income families.

Commissioner Godwin requested Mr. Adams to present more details in what concentrated actually means. Mr. Adams replied stating the following:

1. Concentrated in the State's view means houses side-by-side;
2. We must follow the tax boundary lines
3. Allowed to have a sub area;
4. We can have three (3) or four (4) houses per group, but they must be contiguous.

Commissioner Godwin asked Mr. Adams the following:

1. Does Columbus County receive a deed or lien on these dwellings once completed. Mr. Adams replied stating yes.
2. Suggestion: if this is not included in the agreement, I am recommending that it be included -
  - A. The recipients be required to attend the Homeowners Education Program offered by

- the Dream Center at a minimal charge; **and**
- B. If it is a mobile home, it should be on a permanent foundation,

Commissioner McKenzie asked Mr. Adams if we were concentrating on renovation of these dwellings or replacement. Mr. Adams replied stating we were concentrating on both.

Commissioner Godwin asked Mr. Adams if the above suggestions were not included in the agreement, or if changes needed to be made, if we could do these prior to, or up to, the grant being initiated. Mr. Adams replied stating yes.

Vice Chairman asked Mr. Adams if these dwellings were mobile homes or stick-built houses. Mr. Adams replied stating both.

**PUBLIC HEARING CLOSED:**

At 7:11 P.M., there being no further comments from anyone, Commissioner Norris made a motion to close the Public Hearing, seconded by Commissioner Jacobs. The motion so carried.

**PUBLIC HEARING NUMBER TWO (2): Local Law Enforcement Block Grant:**

**PUBLIC HEARING CALLED TO ORDER:**

At 7:15 P.M., Chairman Memory called the Public Hearing to order and stated the purpose of this Public Hearing is to notify citizens of the proposed application contents and to receive oral or written comments relative to the proposed application. Chairman Memory stated Sanford Hardee, Chief Deputy of the Columbus County Sheriff's Department would present the details and answer any questions that were asked.

Mr. Hardee stated the following:

1. This is an annual grant and we have been applying for and receiving this grant since the mid '90's;
2. This grant is in the amount of ten thousand, eight hundred fourteen, and 00/100 (\$10,814.00) dollars;
3. This grant does require a ten (10%) percent match which the Sheriff's Department will pay with drug funds;
4. The monetary amount is down from previous years; **and**
5. We will use this money to purchase and equip a Mobile Command Center;

Chairman Memory asked Mr. Hardee why the amount of the grant was down from the previous years. Mr. Hardee replied the whole funding statewide was down, and, eventually, this grant will be dissolved.

**REGULAR SESSION:**

**Agenda Items #1 and #2: MEETING CALLED TO ORDER:**

At 7:30 P.M., Chairman Memory called the Regular Session to order. The invocation was delivered by Commissioner McKenzie. Everyone in attendance stood and pledged Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America.

**Agenda Item #3: BOARD MINUTES APPROVAL:**

Commissioner Norris made a motion to approve the September 7, 2004 Board Minutes, as recorded, seconded by Vice Chairman Dutton. The motion so carried.

**Agenda Item #4: LOWER CAPE FEAR WATER and SEWER AUTHORITY:**

Kurt Taube, Executive Director of the Lower Cape Fear Water and Sewer Authority, presented a PowerPoint Presentation so entitled "Meeting the Challenges of A Changing World" relative to the past, present and future of the Authority. This presentation was very detailed with very informative statistical data accompanied by comments from Mr. Taube. The presentation

concentrated on the establishment, the accomplishments, the ongoing operations and the future plans of the Lower Cape Fear Water and Sewer Authority.

Mr. Taube stated the following:

1. The Lower Cape Fear Water and Sewer Authority entails Columbus, Pender, Bladen and Brunswick Counties;
2. A large percentage of the water we use is derived from the Cape Fear River;
3. We all assume that the supply of water is unlimited, but that is not the case; **and**
4. The water aquifers in the affected areas are dropping and has raised some concern.

After the presentation was complete, Mr. Taube opened the floor for any questions. The following questions were asked.

1. Vice Chairman Dutton made reference to the statement made by Mr. Taube in the presentation, regarding the water table in the area had dropped sixteen (16') feet as a result of the Smithfield Plan in the Tar Heel area. I would like to know what is being done about this? Mr. Taube replied stating the State is doing an investigation on this matter.
2. Chairman Memory referenced the information on the gallons of water usage per day for Brunswick County decreasing in lieu of increasing relative to the tremendous growth in that area. Why is there such a drastic variation in the gallons being used per day. Mr. Taube replied stating Brunswick County experienced a serious problem with unaccounted water due leaking water lines, bad plumbing, etc., and when these problems were eliminated, the water usage dropped. In addition, several industries in the area were using a large volume of water at that time.
3. Robert Adams asked Mr. Taube how many gallons of water did the Tarheel plant use per day. Mr. Taube replied stating 2 ½ million gallons per day.
4. Commissioner Godwin asked Mr. Taube if they were still in the raw water business. Mr. Taube replied yes, but they were looking into potable water.
5. Billy Joe Farmer, County Administrator, stated the towns and cities within Columbus County, as well as the County, itself, may have to resort to a means of this nature if the Cape Fear Water and Sewer Authority should ever deal in potable water.

Commissioner Wilson stated he would like for Jim Perry with the Lumber River Council Governments, to make a presentation at a future Board Meeting relative to the depleting water aquifers in the area.

**Agenda Item #5: AWARD of HIGHEST BID for SALE of PREVATTE TRACT TIMBER:**

Billy Joe Farmer, County Administrator, requested the Board to award the sale of the timber on the Prevatte Tract to Canal Wood, Lumberton, who was the high bidder from a private bid opening on September 10, 2004, by Michael Rhodes, R.F., Carolina Forest Resources, for the bid price of one hundred twelve thousand, seven hundred fifty, and 00/100 (\$112,750.00) dollars. The bids submitted are as follows:

Commissioner Godwin asked if there was an allowance for the provision for any overage if, indeed, more timber was discovered than what had been cruised and was the timber cruised tree for tree. Mr. Farmer replied stating no there was no allowance included. Michael Rhodes stated he had performed a ten (10%) percent cruise of this timber and not a tree for tree cruise.

Commissioner Wilson made a motion to approve the award of the sale of the Prevatte Tract timber to Canal Wood, Lumberton in the amount of one hundred twelve thousand, seven hundred

fifty, and 00/100 (\$112,750.00) dollars, seconded by Commissioner Norris. Their motion so carried.

Mark Gilchrist, The News Reporter, Incorporated, requested Board approval and adoption of the following Proclamation.

**WHEREAS**, Columbus Countians can take advantage of many activities that will improve their health and help prevent and control disease, with small changes in diet and activity, having a dramatic impact on health in the long term; **and**

**WHEREAS**, studies have shown that health promotion and disease management programs in major private sector companies have save, on average, \$3.00 for every \$1.00 invested; **and**

**WHEREAS**, the Columbus County Board of Commissioners is concerned about the health and welfare of its citizens; **and**

**Agenda Item #8: ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT - INCENTIVES for SMALL COMPANIES PROPOSAL:**

James Hinkle, Economic Development Director, requested Board approval of the following Incentives for Small Companies Proposal:

**Incentives for Small Companies Proposal:**

The current policy requires a minimum \$1 million investment and the creation of 25 jobs for existing business/industry and a \$2 million investment and the creation of 25 jobs for new business/industry. We do not do retail or commercial which includes professional offices. Below is a proposal for your consideration:

**Proposal:**

Minimum of \$100,000 investment and the creation of 5 jobs using the existing percentage scale of the IDF policy.

Results of investing \$100,000, \$500,000 or \$900,000:

\*The actual investment will be multiplied by the tax rate and percentage of incentive.

**Requirements (must meet all):**

- Entrepreneurs must show their belief in the project by detailing personal investment and liability for failure.
- No payments are made until jobs are created, continuously employed, and reported to the state on quarterly or annual forms. These jobs must be in place for the quarter in which payment is to be received. The investment also must be listed and taxable per the tax roles.
- To be eligible, companies must provide evidence of a banking relationship, acceptable to the Economic Development Director's satisfaction.

The incentives would apply to manufacturing, distribution and other industrial projects. Each project will be considered based upon the merits of that project.

Mr. Hinkle stated the following:

1. I am asking the Board to expand the existing incentive policy to include small businesses;
2. These small businesses could be as low as five to eight (5-8) jobs; **and**
3. Columbus County needs to invite all businesses, including small businesses, due to the fact of the general trend being small businesses.

Chairman Memory stated there was a program at Southeastern Community College to bring employees up to the GED status on-site.

Mr. Hinkle stated some companies were testing the attitudes of people before hiring by allowing them to have twenty (20) hours training to determine if they possessed the proper attitude and willingness to work.

Commissioner Godwin made a motion to approve the Incentives for Small Companies Proposal, seconded by Commissioner Jacobs. The motion so carried.

**Agenda Item #9: PROCLAMATION - DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AWARENESS MONTH PROCLAMATION:**

Ms. Register stated a request needs to be sent to the Water Resources Department requesting these funds to be transferred to the Waccamaw River or if this is not possible, for the funds to be re-assigned to the Waccamaw River.

**Agenda Item #11: PUBLIC UTILITIES - TRANSFER OF OPERATIONS:**

Leroy Sellers, Director of Columbus County Public Utilities, presented the following update on the status of the transfer of Columbus County Water and Sewer District I operations from the Town of Tabor City to the Columbus County Public Utilities Department.

Columbus County Board of Commissioners:

The following plans have been set in place in order for the County Public Utilities to assume all responsibilities for Water District I.

Danny Fowler has completed the required license for Distribution of Public Water Systems effective September 14, 2004, this will allow Danny to take over all distribution for Water District I operations.

The existing operators with the Town of Tabor City have agreed to mark all existing meter services with white paint for easy acceptance by County Meter Readers. Also, they have agreed to ride their meter reading routes with county water employees to establish familiar routes for our department and we have agreed to purchase two hundred meter box lids for Water District I that have been damaged throughout the years. These lids will be replaced by Tabor City Water Department over the next two meter readings.

At this time, the water tank for Water District I is currently being repainted and cleaned and because of excessive rain we are behind schedule with this task. Also, we have found it necessary to utilize the Town of Tabor city's water tank until the repairs on Water District I are completed. Because of the many details that must be completed, Al Leonard with the Town of Tabor City and Leroy Sellers request final transfer of all responsibilities and notification to the public take place effective January 3, 2005 the beginning of a new calendar year.

**Agenda Item #12: ADMINISTRATION - APPROVAL TO PARTICIPATE in the PREPARATION of a COMPREHENSIVE WATER SOURCE PLAN:**

Darren Currie, Assistant County Administrator, requested Board approval to participate in the preparation of a Comprehensive Water Source Plan resulting from the Southern Coastal Plain Comprehensive Ground Water Study done by the Lumber River Council of Governments. This plan requires a commitment of four thousand, two hundred thirty-seven, and 00/100 (\$4,237.00) dollars per year for four (4) years equating to sixteen thousand, nine hundred forty-eight and 00/100 (\$16,948.00) dollars. Mr. Currie stated the following:

1. Cones of depression have been discovered in the Tarheel area;
2. The cost of this plan is ten (\$ .10) cents per capita and is a voluntary assessment; **and**
3. It will take time to develop this plan.

Commissioner Norris made a motion to approve the participation in the preparation of a Comprehensive Water Source Plan at the cost of four thousand, two hundred thirty-seven, and 00/100 (\$4,237.00) dollars per year for four (4) years, seconded by Commissioner McKenzie. The motion so carried.

**OTHER:**

**PERSONNEL - M.I.S. DIRECTOR EMPLOYMENT:**

Commissioner Jacobs, Chairman of the Personnel Committee, stated the following:

1. We received fifteen (15) applications for this position;
2. We interviewed nine (9) applicants;
3. One (1) applicant really stood due to the fact he had done work for Columbus County in the previous years;
4. This position will report directly to the County Administrator;
5. The applicant's name is Alan James;
6. I understand he has performed work for several of the Columbus County departments in the past; **and**
7. It is the recommendation of the Personnel Committee to hire Alan James as the Columbus County M.I.S. Director.

Commissioner McKenzie made a motion to hire Alan James as the Columbus County M.I.S. Director, seconded by Commissioner Godwin. The motion so carried.

Commissioner Jacobs asked Mr. James if he would like to make any comments. Mr. James replied stating he appreciated this opportunity and he would come on board in approximately two (2) weeks.

**WHEREAS**, the decision to expend these monies, on the behalf of these projects, was reached on the stated condition that at the time the said project reaches the financial status of profitable operation, the said project will reimburse the Columbus County General Fund Account the full amount that has been expended on their behalf, plus interest, which will accrue annually and added to the principle amount; **and**

**WHEREAS**, the said interest on the debt payoffs will be calculated annually and added to the principle amount in accordance with the stipulations of the prime rate; **and**

**WHEREAS**, the then sitting Columbus County Board of Commissioners will be held legally bound and responsible to pay these listed amounts back to the Columbus County General Fund Account.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** the sitting Columbus County Board of Commissioners desires to commit to the following:

1. A Reimbursement Resolution for funds that have been expended on the above listed projects;
2. Interest will be added annually to the debt payoff in accordance with the stipulations of the prime rate; **and**
3. At the time the said project becomes operational in a profitable manner, the debt will be paid in a manner that is feasible; **and**
4. This Reimbursement Resolution legally binds all future Columbus County Board of Commissioners to the said debt payoffs.
