7:10 P.M. PUBLIC HEARING - Application for 2005 Community Development Block Grant Funding, Columbus County Scattered Site Program

PUBLIC HEARING CALLED TO ORDER:

At 7:10 P.M., Chairman Jacobs called the Public Hearing to order and stated the purpose of this Public Hearing is to notify citizens of the proposed application contents and receive comments relative to the proposed application contents. Chairman Jacobs requested that Floyd Adams, The Adams Company, Incorporated, present the details of this grant and then the floor would be opened for any comments.

Floyd Adams distributed copies of a slide presentation that had been presented to the Housing Committee, which was asked to help in the selection process, and stated the following:

1. This grant is in the amount of four hundred thousand and 00/100 (\$400,000.00) dollars;
2. Criteria was established to decide who qualified for this grant;
3. A committee was involved and established the guidelines that were followed and were as follows:
 - A. Owner occupied
 - B. Elderly;
 - C. Low income
 - D. Handicapped, if possible; and
 - E. Stick built.
4. There were thirty-two (32) applicants that applied;
5. The committee eliminated the applicants down to eleven (11);
6. The committee eliminated the eleven (11) applicants down to seven (7) to stay within the size of the grant;
7. Of these final seven (7) applicants, six (6) were repairs and one (1) was a replacement;
8. This application is due February 28, 2005; and
9. No one but me and a few of my staff know the names of these applicants.

Commissioner Prevatte asked Mr. Adams why Applicant #7 was included when the age stated was forty-nine (49) years old, and why Applicant #3, in the amount of seventy-five thousand and 00/100 (\$75,000.00) dollars, at the age of seventy-five (75) years old, and in the case of Applicant #3, is there going to be a lien on this property. Mr. Adams replied stating that Applicant #7 involved a handicap child with no handicap accessibility, and that Applicant #7 was a replacement and the HUD Guidelines that were followed did not allow for a lien to be placed on the property.

Commissioner Memory asked Mr. Adams if these applicants were homeowners. Mr. Adams stated yes. In addition, Commissioner Memory stated there were funds available from USDA for up to seven thousand five hundred and 00/100 (\$7,500.00) dollars for repair, and recommended he let the applicants that had applied, but had not been chosen, know about these available funds since no one else knew the names of these applicants but The Adams Company, Incorporated.

Commissioner Godwin stated there are many houses in Columbus County that do not have handicap accessibility but need it, and during the process of repairing and/or replacing these houses within the scope of this grant, I recommend these handicap features be added during the process in order to eliminate the request for such in the future since the cost for the handicap features are not that expensive.

Private Citizen #1 (did not state name): How many houses are going to benefit from this grant? Mr. Adams replied stating seven (7).

Private Citizen #2 (did not state name): Are these houses in one area or are they scattered throughout the county? Mr. Adams replied stated they were scattered.

Private Citizen #3 (did not state name): Why did you think you have to replace this one (1) house with a stick-built house when many citizens live in houses of far less value and quality? Mr. Adams stated the guidelines that had to be followed stated such.

Robert Adams (private citizen): What is the income level that was used to determine eligibility for this grant? Mr. Adams replied stating the HUD Guidelines state the income for poverty level is fifty (50%) percent of the median and that equates to approximately fourteen thousand to sixteen thousand and 00/100 (\$14,000.00 to \$16,000.00) dollars.

At 7:25 P.M., Commissioner Norris made a motion to close the Public Hearing, seconded by Commissioner Memory.

For the purpose of further discussion, Commissioner Norris rescinded his motion to close the Public Hearing and Commissioner Memory rescinded his second.

Commissioner Prevatte asked Mr. Adams if any liens would be placed on these houses whether stick-built or modular. Mr. Adams stated the guidelines would not permit liens to be placed on these houses.

PUBLIC HEARING CLOSED:

At 7:26 P.M., Commissioner Norris made a motion to close the Public Hearing, seconded by Commissioner McKenzie. The motion so carried.

Commissioner Memory asked Mr. Adams why the big difference in Line Items 4.f and g.(2).

Mr. Adams replied stating that one (1) rehabilitation had to be moved to relocation due to the fact it was beyond repair.

Commissioner Godwin asked Mr. Adams why the difference in Line Item 4.j. Mr. Adams replied stating this included lead-based paint and we did not discover as much lead-based paint as I had anticipated.

Agenda Items #1 and #2: MEETING CALLED to ORDER and INVOCATION:

At 7:33 P.M., Chairman Jacobs called the Regular Session Meeting to order, and the invocation was delivered by Commissioner Amon E. McKenzie.

Commissioner McKenzie made a motion to approve the January 18, 2005 Board Minutes, as recorded, seconded by Commissioner Norris. The motion so carried.

Darren Currie, Assistant County Manager, requested Board approval of the application to apply for the 2005 Scattered Site CDBG funds.

Commissioner Prevatte asked Mr. Adams why the high monetary amount of one hundred thousand nine hundred ten and 00/100 (\$100,910.000) dollars, when many of the citizens in Columbus County do not live in houses of this value. Mr. Adams replied stating he used the guidelines that must be followed in this program and in this particular situation, the residents are elderly with three (3) handicapped children.

Commissioner Memory asked Mr. Adams what the HUD Guidelines were. Mr. Adams replied stating the guidelines stated you must replace the house with the same size as the existing one.

Vice Chairman Godwin asked if a lien would be involved in this situation. Mr. Adams replied stating no, the program does not allow a lien to be placed on the property.

After discussion was conducted among the Board members, Commissioner Norris made a motion to approve the award amounts for the above listed two (2) applicants, seconded by Commissioner McKenzie.

Commissioner McKenzie made a motion to approve the Project Budget Revision for the 2003 CDBG Grant #03-C-1089, seconded by Commissioner Norris. The motion so carried.

Agenda Item #6: NAKINA FIRE and RESCUE DEPARTMENT - VOTE on the FIRE SUBSTATION to be LOCATED in the PIREWAY COMMUNITY:

John Ward, Chairman of the Nakina Fire and Rescue Board of Trustees, requested Board approval, by vote, of the location of a fire substation in the Pireway Community.

Commissioner Dutton stated petitions were submitted to the Board with one hundred twenty-seven (127) signatures. The Clerk to the Board telephoned fifty-eight (58) of the citizens who signed the petitions, and of the number telephoned, received thirty-seven (37) signature verifications.

Commissioner Memory asked Mr. Ward what the tax rate would be for this substation. Mr. Ward replied stating it would be the same as the Nakina Fire Tax District which is eight (\$.08) cents.

Commissioner McKenzie asked Mr. Ward what method of revenue collection would be utilized for the substation. Mr. Ward replied stating it would be a tax district.

Commissioner Dutton made a motion to approve the Fire Substation to be located in the Pireway Community to be a part of the Nakina Fire Tax Service District and utilizing the same tax rate of eight (\$.08) cents, seconded by Vice Chairman Godwin. The motion so carried.

Item #7: SOUTHEASTERN COMMUNITY COLLEGE - DISCUSSION of the ECONOMIC and WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT CENTER (SHELL BUILDING PROPOSAL):

Darren Currie, Assistant County Manager, presented the following information for discussion relative to the Economic and Workforce Development Center (Shell Building Proposal) which was presented to the Board at the January 31, 2005 Workshop held at Southeastern Community College.

4. **Summary:**

- SCC would be able to consolidate like services and classes in one location, i.e. EMS, Fire, Workforce Development, Law Enforcement, Corrections;
- Workforce Development would become more centralized;
- This would allow for reorganization of other offices as a result of moving into the new facility, etc.;
- Large presence in the industrial park for training and con-ed, with new and existing industry; **and**
- Space would also provide latest technology for smaller companies to use as well as the general public.

Commissioner McKenzie asked Mr. Currie what the source of the funds was for the upfit money. Mr. Currie replied stating the source of the funds was through grants.

Rhone Sasser, Chairman of the Economic Development Commission Board of Trustees, stated the following:

1. This is definitely a work in progress;
2. We plan to apply for funding through every source that is available to us;
3. We have been assured by our legislative delegation that they would work very hard to obtain the necessary funding that is required for this project; **and**
4. If this project does not materialize, we will advise the Board of Commissioners.

Chairman Jacobs asked Mr. Sasser if he was asking for a letter of endorsement. Mr. Sasser replied stating yes.

Commissioner Memory stated that if the Committee of 100 had given the price of the Shell Building at six hundred thousand to nine hundred thousand (\$600,000 - \$900,000) dollars in lieu of \$1.2 million, Columbus County could have an industry in this building by now. Commissioner Memory asked Mr. James Hinkle, Economic Development Director, what would be the best advantage to future business - the empty shell building or a Workforce Development Center. Mr. Hinkle replied stating it could go either way, but it definitely would not hurt to have the Workforce Development Center.

Commissioner Prevatte stated the following:

1. I would like to know how the money was used that was given for the T-Building expansion;
2. How is the grocery store that was donated being utilized; **and**
3. Based on the information I have obtained, we need more training for the high-tech positions in technology.

Rhone Sasser stated they were asking for a letter of endorsement and not a commitment.

Lonnie Fox, Vice President of Operation and Finance, Southeastern Community College, stated the following:

1. After we experienced budget cuts in fiscal year 2000-2001, we were forced to use bond money for repairs that we had to do for our accreditation;
2. We used institutional monies;
3. We reduced our staff; **and**
4. The average county in the State of North Carolina spends \$33 million on education and Columbus County only spends \$11 million on education.

Commissioner McKenzie asked why couldn't Southeastern Community College utilize some of the vacant buildings in close proximity to the college, which there are many.

Dr. Matlock, President of Southeastern Community College, stated the following:

1. It has been my past experience, it is too difficult to spread the campus of a college at locations that are miles apart due to staffing problems, scheduling of classes and commute time for students;
2. We are out of space;
3. We have been mandated to increase our Nursing Program which has been rated as one of the best in the State;
4. We are simply maxed out of space; **and**
5. We are here to simply help the public and improve the quality of life for the citizens of Columbus County.

Alexis Prease, private citizen, asked if the \$102,223.00 figure was for current and future operating costs. Lonnie Fox replied stating they do not have a good figure at this time and this figure was based on past expenses.

Harry Foley, stated the following:

1. I was employed at Southeastern Community College until my retirement and it has been my life;
2. I now serve in an advisory capacity to the college;
3. I have a big problem with this proposal;
4. When we acquired the T-Building, it was a tremendous accomplishment and the T-Building has eighteen thousand (18,000) square feet in it;
5. The college received bond money for the expansion of the T-Building which has never materialized;
6. There has not been a company using the T-Building for training since Conflandey;
7. I fully believe if the T-Building was expanded as planned, there would not be a need for this purchase.

Dr. Matlock stated the following:

1. We are heavily involved in Bio-Ag Programs which will be the future of farming for many of the citizens of Columbus County;
2. We have received six (6) grants;
3. Two (2) other grants for this program are in the making; **and**
4. This additional space is badly needed.

Beverlee Nance, Vice President of Continuing Education in Economic Development, Southeastern Community College, stated the following:

1. If this project materializes, the college would be able to consolidate like services and classes in one location, which is always cost effective;
2. Workforce Development would become more centralized;
3. This would allow for reorganization of other offices;
4. This would be a large presence in the industrial park for training and continuing education with new and existing industry; **and**
5. Space would also provide the latest technology for smaller companies to use as well as the general public.

Vice Chairman Godwin made a motion to approve sending a letter of endorsement for the proposal and to ask Southeastern Community College to seek whatever legislation is required to make this project materialize, seconded by Commissioner Memory. The motion so carried.

Agenda Item #8: SOLID WASTE - APPROVAL of PURCHASE of LAND for CONVENIENCE CENTER:

Chuck Stanley, Solid Waste Director, requested Board approval to purchase land from Fred Whaley on 4570 Ervin T. Richardson Road for the existing Convenience Center, at the price of ten thousand and 00/100 (\$10,000.00) dollars resulting from an Option to Purchase.

Commissioner Dutton made a motion to approve the purchase of land from Fred Whaley on 4570 Ervin T. Richardson Road for the existing Convenience Center, at the price of ten thousand and 00/100 (\$10,000.00) dollars, seconded by Commissioner Norris. The motion so carried.

Agenda Item #9: RESOLUTION - MEDICAID RESOLUTION SUPPORTING STATE ASSUMPTION of COUNTY SHARE of MEDICAID COSTS:

Billy Joe Farmer, County Manager, requested Board approval and adoption of the following Medicaid Resolution Supporting State Assumption of County Share of Medicaid, as recommended by the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners.

**MEDICAID RESOLUTION
SUPPORTING STATE ASSUMPTION OF COUNTY SHARE
OF MEDICAID**

WHEREAS, Columbus County pays \$4 million dollars of its expenditures for services to Medicaid eligible citizens; **and**

WHEREAS, the counties' share of Medicaid reimbursements has increased over sixty-seven (67%) percent in the last five (5) years and now totals approximately four hundred forty (\$440) million dollars; **and**

WHEREAS, North Carolina is one (1) of only two (2) states in the nation that require counties to pay a share of all Medicaid services costs; **and**

WHEREAS, in Columbus County, there exists a population of 54,557 citizens. Eighteen (\$.18) cents of our current tax rate is consumed by Medicaid Costs. The per capita cost of Medicaid is one thousand four hundred fifty-four and 00/100 (\$1,454.00) dollars. We have experienced an average of a three (3%) percent increase over the last four (4) year period in the Medicaid costs. Out of our population of 54,557, twenty-seven (27%) percent of our citizens is Medicaid eligible.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Columbus County Board of Commissioners urges the North Carolina General Assembly to provide immediate Medicaid relief to Columbus County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be transmitted to the members of the General Assembly representing Columbus County.

Commissioner Memory made a motion to approve the Medicaid Resolution Supporting State Assumption of County share of Medicaid, seconded by Commissioner Prevatte. The motion so carried.

Agenda Item #10: EMERGENCY SERVICES - APPROVAL of LOCAL EMERGENCY PLANNING COMMITTEE (LEPC) MEMBERS:

Ronnie Hayes, Emergency Services Director, requested Board approval of the twenty-five (25) submitted names to serve on the Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC). This list will be kept on file in the Clerk to the Board's office for review.

Commissioner Prevatte asked Mr. Hayes why Whiteville City Schools did not have a representative on this committee. Mr. Hayes stated he had only been employed with Columbus County for one and one-half (1 ½) years and he did not know why, this was the same list of name as last year and he could add Whiteville City Schools to the list.

Commissioner Norris made a motion to approve the twenty-five (25) submitted names to serve on the Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC), seconded by Commissioner McKenzie. The motion so carried.

OTHER:

EMERGENCY SERVICES - FY2005 HOMELAND SECURITY GRANT PROGRAM:

Ronnie Hayes, Emergency Services Director, stated he had received information from the North Carolina Department of Crime Control and Public Safety, Division of Emergency Management, relative to the FY 2005 Homeland Security Grant Program and stated the following:

1. The DHS FY 2005 HSGP funding guidance strongly encourages states to consider regionalization in prioritizing funding allocations;
2. For FY 2005, the NC Homeland Security funding allocation will focus on regionalization through multi-jurisdictional partnerships;
3. DHS guidance dictates that each state shall obligate not less than 80% of the total grant program amount in SHSP and LETPP to local unit of government within sixty (60) days of the grant award date;
4. All application for FY 2005 State Homeland Security Program (SHSP) funding must build on existing regional capability or develop new regional response capacities;
5. This has resulted in a competitive grant;
6. Our reception capability would have to be 800 megahertz which would cost staggering amounts of money to install and eat up all the grant funds and then require more funds to accomplish;
7. I have been told the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners has endorsed this action;
8. I am requesting the Board to contact the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners and advise them of the major impact this will have on Columbus County; **and**
9. I am also requesting the Board to contact our legislative delegation to see if any action can be taken to prevent this from materializing.

Commissioner McKenzie made a motion to contact the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners stating the impact this action would have on Columbus County, and to contact our legislative delegation requesting any action they can take to prevent this from happening, seconded by Vice Chairman Godwin. The motion so carried.

LIBRARY - PROPOSAL from TRILLION DIGITAL COMMUNICATIONS:

Morris Pridgen, Library Director, requested Board approval of a proposal that was submitted by Trillion Digital Communications for fast internet service, and stated the following:

1. Trillion will provide Wireless Wide Area Network; Internet Access, Integrated Services and Maintenance;
2. This will provide better service for our citizens;
3. This is an e-rate amount (Federal Government provides this rate to schools);
4. For every ten (\$10) dollar charge, we pay only two (\$2) dollars;
5. The cost for this will be seventeen thousand three hundred fifty-two and 00/100 (\$17,352.00) dollars per year, which is eighteen thousand eight hundred eighty-eight and 00/100 (\$18,888.00) dollars less than we have been paying for this service;
6. We have opened up the bids via Internet;
7. Form 471 is due by February 17, 2005;
8. We will be saving many local dollars;
9. We will not save any money if the e-rate letter is not submitted by the due **date: and**
10. We have thirty-five and 00/100 (\$35,000.00) dollars in the budget for this.

Commissioner McKenzie made a motion to approve the proposal from Trillion for fast internet service, as presented by Morris Pridgen, Library Director, seconded by Vice Chairman Godwin. The motion so carried.

Vice Chairman Godwin stated this same service needs to be considered for the Columbus County Department of Aging. Darren Currie, Assistant County Manager, stated this was in process.

Agenda Item #11: APPOINTMENTS - NURSING/ADULT CARE HOME JOINT COMMUNITY ADVISORY COMMITTEE:

Betty Ann Page, Chairman of the Nursing/Adult Care Home Joint Community Advisory Committee, requested the Board's consideration of the following:

- A. Blanchie Frink Expires: 01-20-2005 **Do Not Reappoint, put Wanda Thompson in this slot; and**
 B. Jessie Vault Expires: 02-06-05 **Reappoint.**

Commissioner Memory made a motion to not reappoint Blanchie Frink and place Wanda Thompson in this slot, and to reappoint Jessie Vault for a three (3) year term, with term expiring February 06, 2008, seconded by Vice Chairman Godwin. The motion so carried.

Chris May, Executive Director of the Cape Fear Council of Governments, requested Board approval and adoption of the following Resolution.

INLET WATERWAYS RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, those who live near, work on and love the beaches and navigable waters of North Carolina's coast appreciate the value of public access to these resources; **and**

WHEREAS, safe use of the navigable waters in the coastal region is of utmost importance to the citizens of North Carolina; **and**

WHEREAS, commercial and sport fishing have been important to the coastal economy and that of the entire state for many years; **and**

WHEREAS, boat building has now also become a major industry in North Carolina, creating thousands of jobs, with 84% of those boat builders being located in the state's coastal region due to the tradition of easy access to navigable waters; **and**

WHEREAS, boat sales in North Carolina have now exceeded \$450 million annually, generating significant tax revenues and thousands of additional jobs at over 3,000 boating-related businesses in the state; **and**

WHEREAS, federal funding has virtually disappeared for maintaining the authorized safe depths of the Atlantic Intracoastal Waterway and the many shallow draft inlets connecting inland waters to the Atlantic Ocean, causing serious dangers to our citizens, the thousands of boaters who visit our state and our critical coastal economy; **and**

WHEREAS, time is of the essence since the US Coast Guard has recently advised that it can no longer maintain buoys in many of the undredged shallow draft inlets and so they must be removed, making the inlets unsafe for navigation.


