The Honorable Columbus County Commissioners met on the above stated date and at the above stated time in the Dempsey B. Herring Courthouse Annex Building located at 112 West Smith Street, Whiteville, North Carolina, for the purpose of a presentation by Tom King, North Carolina Department of Commerce, Division of Community Assistance, and Tyler Bray, North Carolina Department of Transportation, Planning Division, and their regular scheduled meeting on the third Monday.

<u>PRESENTATION</u> - Discussion on Countywide Land Use Plan and Countywide Thoroughfare Plan

Darren Currie, Assistant County Manager, introduced Tom King, North Carolina Department of Commerce, Division of Community Assistance, and stated Mr. King would be delivering a presentation on a Countywide Land Use Plan.

Mr. King stated the following:

- 1. A Land Use Plan has certain game rules that involve the Government, interests, market and a good Land Planner;
- 2. It is not a regulatory document;
- 3. A Land Use Plan should involve the formulation of a Land Use Plan Steering Committee made up of thirteen (13) members for the purpose of receiving citizen input;
- 4. This plan will let you know where you are not and where you would like to be in twenty (20) years from now; **and**
- 5. In my research, I discovered that Columbus County does have a Land Use Plan that was implemented in 1976 but was not very definitive.

Mr. King asked if anyone had questions they would like to ask. The following questions were asked and addressed.

Commissioner Memory: Can Columbus County develop a good Land Use Plan without zoning? **Tom King:** This is a policy document, it could take another avenue and accomplish the same goal. **Commissioner Memory:** Is the Land Use Plan what the Planning Board needs?

Tom King: The Land Use Plan will be their main implementation tool.

Commissioner Dutton: In order to sell any property, will the citizens have to go through certain avenues to do so?

Tom King: No.

Commissioner Dutton: If the citizens in Columbus County wish to sell their property and the Land Use Plan entails extra expenses to be incurred before they can sell, then many of our citizens would not be able to sell, due to the extra expenses. This situation would not fit their pocketbook.

Commissioner Prevatte: From the presentation you have just delivered, is the Land Use Plan a part of the Subdivision Plan, and if not, is it an umbrella for the Subdivision Plan?

Darren Currie: The Countywide Land Use Plan will tell us where we are now and where we want to be in twenty (20) years. Columbus County must have a Subdivision Ordinance in place before a Land Use Plan can be developed.

Commissioner McKenzie: I applaud the idea of a Countywide Land Use Plan. I think it is something Columbus County needs as long as it does not place a heavy burden on our citizens.

Vice Chairman Godwin: I understood you to say that Columbus County does have a Land Use Plan that was done in 1976 by the Cape Fear Council of Governments. Do Robeson and Brunswick County have a Land Use Plan?

Tom King: Yes they do.

Darren Currie: stated the following:

- 1. At the April 04, 2005 Board Meeting, a Memorandum of Understanding By and Between Columbus County and the North Carolina Department of Commerce, Division of Community Assistance, was approved for the purpose of obtaining a Countywide Land Use Plan;
- 2. Tom King agreed to help Columbus County develop a Land Use Plan;
- 3. The Land Use Plan does not need to be confused with zoning;
- 4. This plan will be beneficial to Columbus County in the future due to the dwindling of the farm setting and the decline in industry we are experiencing;
- 5. Columbus County needs a Land Use Plan in place before a Countywide Thoroughfare Plan can be done;
- 6. There will be a formal presentation made to the Board for the Subdivision Ordinance which must be in place before the Countywide Land Use Plan can be done;
- 7. We do not need to confuse this plan with zoning; and
- 8. The Countywide Land Use Plan can be very beneficial to the landowners of Columbus County.

Darren Currie introduced Tyler Bray, North Carolina Department of Transportation, Planning Division and stated Mr. Bray would deliver the presentation on the Countywide Thoroughfare Plan.

Mr. Bray stated the following:

- 1. The areas within Columbus County that have thoroughfare plans are Whiteville/Brunswick, Lake Waccamaw, Tabor City and Chadbourn;
- 2. The areas within Columbus County that do not have thoroughfare plans are Boardman, Fair Bluff and Cerro Gordo, and in addition, Columbus County overall;
- 3. A Thoroughfare Plan results in a Comprehensive Transportation Plan;
- 4. The purpose of long-range transportation planning is to generate information decision makers can use to guide future transportation decisions;
- 5. The product of long-range transportation planning is a Comprehensive Transportation Plan;
- 6. Long-range transportation planning involves the following process:
 - A. Where are we now?
 - B. Were do we want to go? and
 - C. How will we get there?
- 7. The benefits of long-range transportation planning are:
 - A. Integration with land use planning and the development process;
 - B. Minimum disruption for citizens; and
 - C. Cost savings.
- 8. The Transportation Planning Process is as follows:
 - A. Hold initial meetings;
 - B. Establish plan schedule;
 - C. Establish public involvement plan;
 - D. Establish community vision;
 - E. Conduct goals and objectives survey;
 - F. Establish tools and data needs;
 - G. Assign responsibilities;
 - H. Collect data;
 - I. Endorse data;
 - J. Project data;
 - K. Endorse projections;
 - L. Analyze deficiencies;
 - M. Develop alternatives;
 - N. Recommend plan;
 - O. Adopt plan;
 - P. Technical report;
 - Q. Corridor protection; and
 - R. Programming.
- 9. A Comprehensive Transportation Plan is a twenty-five to thirty (25-30) year plan and a TIP Plan is a seven (7) year plan;
- 10. A Comprehensive Transportation Plan involves making decisions on mulitmodal,

recommendations and highway categories; and

- 11. What you can do is to develop a Comprehensive Transportation Plan that addresses the current and future needs of the areas within Columbus County.
- 12. Mr. Bray asked if anyone had any questions they would like to ask.

The following questions were presented to Mr. Bray:

Commissioner Memory: Will this plan have any bearing on the roads to be upgraded in the existing Transportation Improvement Plan?

Tyler Bray: No.

Darren Currie: The time line of completion of this plan is eighteen to twenty-four (18-24) months.

Mike Helm: Will this become a part of the Department of Transportation Funding Process?

Tyler Bray: Not specifically, it should have no bearing.

Mike Helm: Is this plan seen as a local tool to make decisions with?

Tyler Bray: Yes.

Comments by Mayor J.B. Evans:

The Honorable J.B. Evans, Mayor of Fair Bluff and member of the Columbus County Planning Board, stated the following:

- 1. If this plan is approved and adopted, Columbus County will need a good planner on board to put the plan in place;
- 2. This plan does not need to take another eighteen to twenty-four (18-24) months after it is adopted to be put into place;
- 3. I strongly encourage Columbus County to have a good Planner on board before this plan is finished; and
- 4. The Planning Board has been working very hard on developing the Subdivision Ordinance.

REGULAR SESSION:

Agenda Items #1 and #2: MEETING CALLED TO ORDER and INVOCATION:

At 7:30 P.M., Chairman Jacobs called the meeting to order. The invocation was delivered by Commissioner Memory. Everyone in attendance stood and pledged Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America which was led by Commissioner David L. Dutton, Jr.

Agenda Item #3: <u>BOARD MINUTES APPROVAL</u>:

Commissioner Norris made a motion to approve the April 04, 2005 Board Minutes, as recorded, seconded by Commissioner Prevatte. The motion so carried.

Agenda Item #4: <u>HEALTH DEPARTMENT - INTRODUCTION OF NEW HEALTH DIRECTOR, KIMBERLY SMITH:</u>

Dr. Darryl Diefus, Chairman of the Columbus County Board of Health, stated the Search Committee that was formed to locate a new Health Director for the Columbus County Health Department, took the task very serious of finding the best qualified person for this position. I would like to introduce Kimberly Smith as the candidate we chose for the Director of the Columbus County Health Department.

Ms. Kimberly Smith stated the following:

- 1. I realize that I have some very big shoes to fit; and
- 2. With Marian Duncan's help, I can fill these shoes.

Dr. Diefus stated that things were running very smoothly at the Health Department since Ms. Smith came on board.

Agenda Item#5: AGING - APPROVAL OF HOME AND COMMUNITY CARE BLOCK GRANT COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS:

Ed Worley, Columbus County Aging Director, requested Board approval of the following recommendations:

- A. To appoint the Columbus County Department of Aging as the receiver provider and continue as the Lead Agent for Columbus County;
- B. To allow all programs to remain as presently provided; and
- C. On behalf of the Home and Community Care Block Grant Committee, request to accept the proposed budget from the Home and Community Care Block Grant Committee of the proposed allocations of \$507,051.00, with a local match of \$56,339.00, for a grand total of \$563,390.00.

Vice Chairman Godwin made a motion to approve the recommendations made by Ed Worley, Columbus County Aging Director, as listed above, seconded by Commissioner Norris. The motion so carried.

Agenda Item #6: SOCIAL SERVICES - REVISIONS/CLARIFICATIONS TO WORK FIRST PLAN:

Mary B. Thompson, Program Manager, requested Board approval of two (2) revisions/clarifications to the Work First Plan as follows:

Page 5:

Take out the work Terminate -

• Sanction/Terminate those participants who fail to show good cause for not participating satisfactorily.

Page 8:

Clarification -

SUBSTANCE ABUSE COORDINATOR

---- Drug testing is required of individuals whose assessments indicates substance abuse. If there is a score of 8 or more on the AUDIT, moderate level on the DAST-10 or if behavioral indicators are detected the individual will be referred to the substance abuse coordinator. - - - - -

Ms. Thompson stated this plan was developed and submitted to the State for approval and the State asked for these two (2) changes that need to be approved by the Board.

Commissioner McKenzie made a motion to approve the two (2) changes, as listed above, to the Work First Plan, as recommended by Mary B. Thompson, seconded by Commissioner Memory. The motion so carried.

Agenda Item #7: <u>SOIL AND WATER - REQUEST FOR BEAVER/DRAINAGE</u> MONIES:

Donna G. Register, District Conservationist, requested beaver/drainage monies to assist with the Red Store Road drainage problem. Ms. Register stated the following:

- 1. The Red Store Road is a Department of Transportation project;
- 2. The Pleasant Plains Road is a Department of Transportation project;
- 3. With the help of Milton McLean, on the Airport Road, twenty-two (22) beavers were caught;
- 4. Commissioner McKenzie has stated snagging needs to be done in the Red Store area,
- 5. If snagging is done, the County should have the ability to maintain areas like this years later;
- 6. In these type projects, we need the landowners to sign easements that will allow access in the future; and
- 7. James E. Hill, Jr., Columbus County Attorney, needs to draft up a Maintenance Agreement for these projects that will allow Columbus County to revisit these sites for future maintenance.

Vice Chairman Godwin asked Ms. Register if she had a model policy to use for the creation of a Maintenance Agreement for Columbus County the Board could approve, and have in place for projects of this nature. Ms. Register replied stating no, but Mr. Hill had drafted a Maintenance Agreement allowing Columbus County to revisit these projects in the future.

MOTION:

Vice Chairman Godwin made a motion for the District Conservationist and James E. Hill, Jr., Columbus County Attorney, to draft a copy of a Maintenance Agreement to include easements

from the property owners for these drainage/beaver projects to allow for future maintenance, seconded by Commissioner Prevatte. The motion so carried.

Ms. Register stated the Simmons Bay Project was a Corps of Engineers Project. Columbus County told the Corps they had easements from the property owners. The past minutes have been checked by June B. Hall, Clerk to the Board, and the former Clerk to the Board, Ida L. Smith, and these easements could not be located. They must have been verbal easements and never recorded.

Vice Chairman Godwin asked Ms. Register who dug the canal on Red Store Road. Ms. Register replied stating from the information she had been able to obtain, it must have been ASCS funds.

Item #8: PERSONNEL - DEPARTMENTAL UPDATE:

Virginia Taylor, Personnel Director, presented the following Departmental Update to the Board.

- 1. The Personnel Department is extremely busy;
- 2. Columbus County employs seven hundred fifty-two (752) employees, with approximately five hundred two (502) full-time employees and two hundred fifty (250) contract and part-time employees;
- 3. From February, 2004 until the present, Columbus County has experienced an employee turnover rate of twenty-four (24%) percent, and of this percentage fourteen (14%) percent was full-time employees;
- 4. Four (4) employees have retired, two (2) with thirty (30) years and two (2) with twenty (20) years;
- 5. Mr. Farmer, Darren and myself are in the process of going through the new County Personnel Policy information that was provided to us by Chris May, Cape Fear Council of Governments. This new Personnel Policy will clear up some of the existing policy pitfalls and put in place a more defined and detailed Personnel Policy. When the scrutinizing process is finished, this new Columbus County Personnel Policy will be presented to the Board for approval and adoption.
- 6. Open enrollment for county benefits will be in June, 2005, and I am presently trying to set dates, locations and times for the open enrollment to be held; **and**
- 7. Performance skills seminars are being continued through Southeastern Community College.

Chairman Jacobs asked Ms. Taylor which department had the highest turnover in employees and which department had the lowest turnover. Ms. Taylor replied stating it was a mixture.

Vice Chairman asked Ms. Taylor where the seminars that would boost employee morale being taught. Ms. Taylor replied stating some were in Virginia and some were being taught at Southeastern Community College. Vice Chairman Godwin asked if it was the standard procedure to award the retirees with a plaque and a pin. Ms. Taylor stated the Clerk to the Board was running behind on the plaques and she was in the process of checking on a pin she deemed suitable for the occasion.

Commissioner Memory asked Ms. Taylor why Columbus County was experiencing such a high turnover of employees. Ms. Taylor replied stating it was due to termination, retirement and moving out of the county.

Vice Chairman Godwin asked Ms. Taylor if she was performing exit interviews. Ms. Taylor replied stating yes. Vice Chairman Godwin stated it would be a good idea for Ms. Taylor to prepare a list and identify the departments where the employee turnover was occurring and the reason for the turnover.

Agenda Item #14: <u>COMMENTS</u>:

Chairman Jacobs opened the floor for any comments anyone would like to make. The following people spoke.

A. Public:

Terry Daniels: stated the following:

- 1. I live on Paul Willoughby Road;
- 2. We do not have any accessibility to county water:
- 3. There are four thousand and 00/100 (\$4,000.00) dollars worth of taxes being paid for this road to allow for water;
- 4. There are hog farms and greenhouses located on this road and it would be cost prohibitive to use county water; **and**
- 5. I would like to know why we are being taxed for county water that we do not have or never will have.

Commissioner McKenzie requested that James E. Hill, Jr., Columbus County Attorney, deliver an explanation as to why the citizens on this road are being taxed.

Mr. Hill delivered the following explanation:

- 1. When this water district was voted on by the citizens, and passed, the ballot stated the sitting Board was legally allowed to levy taxes to pay debt service;
- 2. The Columbus County Water and Sewer Districts I and II Boards tried to add this to the users only;
- 3. The only legal way that is available to use is to tax everyone in the districts;
- 4. We have submitted a recommendation for our legislators to change the bill to allow for assessment fees for hookups; **and**
- 5. This is a procedural problem in the law itself.

Commissioner McKenzie asked if the Board needed to adopt a Resolution to make the necessary change to allow for assessments.

Vice Chairman Godwin stated we do need a Resolution because our hands are tied the way it reads now.

After discussion was conducted among the Board members, Chairman Jacobs stated the Board would take this matter under consideration.

Commissioner McKenzie made a motion to extend the reduced water hookup fee of one hundred and 00/100 (\$100.00) dollars that was to end on April 8, 2005 to July 1, 2005, seconded by Commissioner Prevatte.

Commissioner Memory stated the following regarding this matter:

- 1. We have extended this deadline before and it has not made a lot of difference in the number of hookups;
- 2. We need to get serious about this issue to let the citizens know they cannot keep waiting; and
- 3. I do not think another extension will make a lot of difference.

Commissioner McKenzie stated there had been twenty-three (23) hookups during the last

extension and the main purpose of the reduced fee is to encourage the number of people using county water and every additional hookup will help.

Vice Chairman Godwin stated the extensions had lost their effectiveness.

Commissioner Prevatte stated he had made a previous motion for an extension of ninety (90) days, and, as I understand, the purpose of this is to encourage people to hook up, and it is gradually working.

After additional discussion was conducted among the Board members, a poll vote was taken with the following results:
