6:15 P.M. PUBLIC HEARING:

Closeout of the Columbus County 1999 North Carolina Community Development Block Grant #99-E-0626 (CDBG) Economic Development Grant Program: allow the general public to comment on the expenditure of \$500,000.00 for the construction of a Publicly Owned Wastewater Treatment Plan in the Acme-Delco area.

PUBLIC HEARING OPENED:

At 6:15 P.M., Chairman Jacobs opened the Public Hearing and stated the purpose of the Public Hearing was to allow the general public to comment on the expenditure of \$500,000.00 for the construction of a Publicly Owned Wastewater Treatment Plant in the Acme-Delco area. Don Eggert from the Cape Fear Council of Governments was in attendance and Chairman Jacobs asked if he would like to make any comments. Mr. Egbert stated the following:

- 1. Cape Fear Council of Governments has helped Columbus County administer this grant;
- A Community Development Block Grant in the amount of five hundred thousand and 00/100 (\$500,000.00) dollars was awarded to the County from the Commerce Finance Center in December, 1999;
- 3. The CDBG grant was used in conjunction with other public and private funds totaling approximately \$4 million for the construction of a publicly owned wastewater treatment plant in the Riegelwood area;
- 4. CDBG funds were specifically spent on engineering design and construction of the first phase of the plant which was completed in the last week of July, 2005;
- 5. The plant is to be used for economic development purposes for the county and for economic assistance to Wright Corporation which will be the primary user of the plant;
- 6. Upon completion of the plant in June, 2006, Wright Corporation will be able to retain a minimum of eighty-four (84) jobs and create at least eight (8) jobs by 2007;
- 7. The second and final phase of construction is scheduled to begin in early September, 2005, and be completed by June 24, 2006; and
- 8. After much effort, we think we have this project on track now.

Chairman Jacobs asked if there were any other comments anyone would like to make. No further comments were made, either oral or written.

PUBLIC HEARING CLOSED:

At 6:21 P.M., Commissioner Norris made a motion to close the Public Hearing, seconded by Vice Chairman Godwin. The motion so carried.

Agenda Item #4: BOARD MINUTES APPROVAL:

Commissioner Norris made a motion to table the Board Minutes, seconded by Commissioner Prevatte. The motion so carried.

Agenda Item #5: <u>RESOLUTION - RESOLUTION APPROVING the FINANCING by</u> HALLSBORO FIRE DEPARTMENT, INCORPORATED:

Joe Tyler, Hallsboro Fire Chief, requested Board approval of the volunteer fire department entering into the financing of up to thirty thousand and 00/100 (\$30,000.00) dollars for the Fire Truck Project, by approval of the following Resolution.

RESOLUTION APPROVING the FINANCING by HALLSBORO VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT, INCORPORATED of up to \$30,000.00 for the <u>FIRE TRUCK PROJECT</u>

WHEREAS:

Hallsboro Volunteer Fire Department, Incorporated has determined to finance an amount up to thirty thousand and 00/100 (\$30,000.00) dollars for the Fire Truck. The United States Internal Revenue Code requires that for such financing to be carried out on a tax-exempt basis, this Board must first approve the financing. The VFD has held a Public Hearing on the financing after published notice, as required by the Code. The VFD has reported the proceeding of the hearing to this Board.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County, North Carolina as follows:

The County approves the VFD's entering into the financing, as required under the Code for the financing to be carried out on a tax-exempt basis. The VFD's conduct of the required Public Hearing is approved.

Discussion was conducted relative to the impact, if any, this would have on the \$10 million borrowing limit Columbus County has.

James E. Hill, Jr., former Columbus County Attorney, was in attendance and stated he had not seen this document, and it was his opinion that Columbus County needs to make sure that this will not affect the \$10 million borrowing limit, and as a safeguard, added verbiage needed to be inserted in the Resolution.

Commissioner Memory made a motion to approve the Resolution Approving the Financing by Hallsboro Volunteer Fire Department, Incorporated, subject to attorney's review and added verbiage, seconded by Commissioner Prevatte. The motion so carried.

Agenda Item #6: <u>HEALTH DEPARTMENT - APPROVAL of REVISIONS to</u> <u>ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH FEES</u>:

Commissioner Memory made a motion to table the approval of revisions to the Environmental Health Fees, seconded by Commissioner Norris. The motion so carried.

Agenda Item #7: 2004 CHAF PROGRAM - APPROVAL of GRANT AGREEMENT:

Chairman Jacobs requested Board's review and possible approval of the 2005 Crisis Housing Assistance Funds (CHAF) Grant Agreement.

Commissioner Dutton made a motion to table the 2005 Crisis Housing Assistance Funds (CHAF) Grant Agreement, seconded by Vice Chairman Godwin.

Ronnie Hayes, Emergency Services Director and self-designated contact person, stated he had invited John Croom and Venetta Rogers from the North Carolina Redevelopment Center in Raleigh, to the meeting tonight to present some details relative to this grant.

John Croom, Assistant Director, stated the following information:

- 1. The North Carolina Redevelopment Center will have the task of administering this grant;
- 2. I have just come on board, but I do have some experience;
- 3. Venetta Rogers will be assigned to Columbus County, and will be the liaison and administrator for Columbus County;
- 4. The North Carolina Redevelopment Center will hire a consultant;

Vice Chairman Godwin stated that Items #2, #3 and #5 of the Grant Agreement were items of concern and asked if the North Carolina Redevelopment Center would be responsible for making sure this was executed. Mr. Croom replied by stating they would serve as the middle man but that Columbus County would be ultimately responsible in the end.

Commissioner McKenzie asked if this grant was any different than the grant in 1999 resulting from Hurricane Floyd. Mr. Croom replied by stating as far as the grants are concerned, there is no difference, but in this instance, the North Carolina Redevelopment Center would be the agency who hires the contractor of their choice, and Columbus County will still be ultimately responsible for the decision making and end results.

Commissioner Prevatte asked if this grant was for the hurricane victims from the year of 2004, and at what amount. Mr. Croom replied by stating yes, this is a result of the 2004 hurricanes and the amount is yet to be determined.

Ronnie Hayes stated that over five hundred (500) applications had been taken from citizens in Columbus County for this grant, and the North Carolina Redevelopment Center could not begin to review these applications for eligibility until this Grant Agreement had been approved and received. The amount of the grant will be based on the magnitude of need.

Commissioner Memory asked Mr. Croom if the North Carolina Redevelopment Center would receive payment for their services. Mr. Croom replied stating they were State employees and would not receive payment for their services, but the contractor, of the State's choice, would be receiving ten (10%) percent of the proceeds.

Vice Chairman Godwin asked Mr. Croom if the North Carolina Redevelopment Center would be responsible for overseeing accountability and compliance of the 2004 CHAF Grant. Mr. Croom replied by stating they would, but ultimately Columbus County will be responsible for making sure this is done timely and accurately.

Commissioner Dutton withdrew his motion to table the 2005 Crisis Housing Assistance Funds (CHAF) Grant Agreement, Vice Chairman Godwin withdrew his second.

After further discussion, and discovery was made this Grant Agreement had not been reviewed by an attorney, Commissioner Memory made a motion to approve the 2005 Crisis Housing Assistance Funds (CHAF) Grant Agreement, contingent on attorney's approval, seconded by Commissioner Norris. The motion so carried.

Agenda Item #8: <u>AIRPORT - APPROVAL of AGREEMENT for SAFETY</u> <u>PRESERVATION PROJECTS</u>:

Phil Edwards, Columbus County Airport Director, requested Board approval of the following Agreement for Safety Preservation Projects (Five year Term) by and between the North Carolina Department of Transportation and the County of Columbus.

AGREEMENT FOR SAFETY PRESERVATION PROJECTS (Five YEAR TERM) By and Between the NORTH CAROLINA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION and the COUNTY OF COLUMBUS

THIS AGREEMENT made this the <u>1st</u> day of August, 2005 by and between the North Carolina Department of Transportation, an agency of the State of North Carolina (hereinafter referred to as "Department") and the **COUNTY OF COLUMBUS** (hereinafter referred to as "Sponsor").

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the Department and the Sponsor are concerned with maintaining the facilities of the COLUMBUS COUNTY AIRPORT to enhance the safety of the traveling public and flight operations, and

WHEREAS, the Department and the Sponsor may determine that certain paved surfaces and adjacent areas on the airport have aged and deteriorated and are in need of maintenance, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article 7 of North Carolina General Statute 63, the Department is authorized to undertake safety improvements of these areas, on publicly owned and operated airports, and

WHEREAS, the Department and the Sponsor desire that the needed improvements be undertaken by the Department in conformance with the provision of North Carolina General Statute 63.

NOW THEREFORE, the Department and the Sponsor do hereby mutually agree as follows:

1. The Department, using NCDOT state forces and/or under a Purchase Order Contract, shall perform improvements to the Sponsor's airport. This work may include, but not be limited to, any of the following:

Joint and Crack Sealing Pavement Repairs and Patching Surface Treatments Maintenance Overlays Drainage Improvements Pavement Markings

2. The Department will notify the Sponsor prior to any work being performed.

3. The Sponsor hereby assures the Department that the title to the pavement and adjacent areas are vested under the Sponsor and hereby authorizes the Department and authorized Contractor(s) to enter onto the premises of the Sponsor and accomplish any of the work items as described in Paragraph 1 above.

4. The Sponsor agrees to provide a duly authorized representative who will be present and/or available at all times work is in progress to monitor project operations and assist the Department's representative.

5. The Sponsor agrees to provide a duly qualified operator who will monitor the airport's UNICOM radio transceiver at all times work is in progress and issue airport advisories as necessary on the UNICOM radio transceiver.

6. The Sponsor agrees, when needed, to formally close any runway, taxiway, or apron at all times work is in progress on that pavement and to take appropriate steps to prohibit use of such areas by aircraft and/or ground vehicles.

7. The Sponsor agrees to issue and keep current the necessary Notices to Airmen (NOTAMS) through the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) until all work is completed and the Department's representative notifies the Sponsor's representative that the affected areas may be returned to service.

8. The Department may, in its sole discretion, determine the design, scope of work, materials to be used, and methods of accomplishing this safety improvement project.

9. To the maximum extent allowed by law, the Sponsor shall indemnify and hold harmless the Department and its officers and employees from all suits, actions, or claims of any character because of injury or damage received or sustained by any person, persons, or property resulting from work performed under this Agreement or on account of, or in consequence of any negligence in safeguarding the performance of said work.

10. At its sole and unlimited discretion, the Department shall have the right to terminate this Agreement and immediately stop all work being performed pursuant to this Agreement.

11. The Sponsor must be in good standing on all State and Federal Grant Requirements and Assurances before any project shall be performed under this agreement.

12. This Agreement shall not be binding upon the Department and the Sponsor, nor any work performed by the Department, until this Agreement has been fully executed by both the Department and the Sponsor.

13. Subject to the provisions of paragraph 10. above, this Agreement will expire five (5) years from the date written above. Subject to the provisions of paragraph 10. above, this agreement may be terminated by either the Department or the Sponsor by providing written notification of termination. The effective date of termination pursuant to this paragraph shall be the date of receipt of the notice of written termination by the non-terminating party.

Agenda Item #14. <u>COMMENTS</u>:

Chairman Jacobs opened the floor for comments that anyone would like to make. The following people spoke.

A. **Public:**

- 1. **Doug Klier:** stated the following:
 - A. What about the fifty and 00/100 (\$50.00) dollars deposit on the water signup that is suppose to be refunded? I know of several people who have not received their refund. Leroy Sellers, Water Department Supervisor, replied stating the customer needs to come in the office and fill out an application for this refund.
 - B. Why are you putting down fire hydrants? Mr. Sellers replied stating this is a requirement of the system, and also helps the citizen with their insurance rating.
 - C. Couldn't you put in cheaper valves than fire hydrants? Mr. Sellers replied stating these fire hydrants allows the fire department tanker trucks to fill up in their task of fighting fires, and the presence of these fire hydrants would lower the insurance premium for the citizens.
 - D. Six (6) to eight (8) months ago, I ask you to make new housing and new development projects to be mandatory hookup to the water, to help the two (2) water districts with the taxing. Mr. Sellers replied stating this is being done in the areas where the water lines are at.
 - E. Are building permits from the Building Inspections Department being turned over to the Tax Department? Discussion was conducted regarding this inquiry, with information being relayed to Mr. Klier that in order for any electricity to go to new construction, a person must acquire a building permit.
 - F. I think that building permits should be printed in the paper and posted on the sites where new construction is being done.

2. Alexis Prease: stated the following:

Have the District Attorney and Judges had any input in the size of the new jail and classification? Commissioner Memory replied stating various groups have been involved, a committee was formed relative to population control which was inclusive of the District Attorney and Judges, and much input from many sources have been a part of this lengthy process.

B Board of Commissioners:

- 1. **Commissioner McKenzie:** stated the following:
 - A. The committee that was formed to locate a more suitable location for the Veterans Administration Office is recommending the Veterans Administration Office be relocated in the Columbus County Water Department Building; and
 - B. The Water Department to be relocated in the vacant Register of Deeds Building.
- 2. **Commissioner Dutton:** I think the Board of Commissioners needs to get a professional to do a study on the savings the citizens would realize if they would hook up to the county water system. The information I have been hearing from the electrical companies is stating the savings would be rather sizable. After discussion was conducted among the Board members, it was the general consensus of the Board for Leroy Sellers, Water Department Director, to look in to this matter.
