Agenda Item #1: Meeting Called To Order

At 6:30 P.M., Chairman Godwin called the meeting to order.

Agenda Item #2: <u>Invocation</u>

Commissioner Jacobs delivered the invocation and Commissioner Dutton led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Agenda Item #3: Board Minutes Approval

Commissioner Norris made a motion to approve the February 6, 2006 Regular Session Board Minutes and the February 9, 2006 Subdivision Regulations Ordinance Workshop Minutes, as recorded, seconded by Commissioner Dutton. The motion unanimously carried.

Agenda Item #4: Presentation of Retirement Plaque

Chairman Godwin presented the following Retirement Plaque to retired Public Housing Agency Director Brenda Strickland.

Agenda Item #5: <u>Time Warner Cable Update</u>

Pat Smith, General Manager, relayed the following information:

- 1) A check was presented to Mr. Varner for the county in the amount of \$29,640.84.
- 2) Time Warner is pleased to be the provider of services to the citizens in our area.
- 3) Last year, with Senate Bill 622 they decided to increase franchise fees from 5% to 7%. Cable pays 5% to the local franchise and 2% goes to the state.
- 4) The community channel is up and going.
- 5) They had a rate change of \$2.95 for expanded service in February.
- 6) Their cost of operating the cable system continues to go up.
- 7) A card is included in the packet she handed out with her phone number, extension and cell number for contact information.
- 8) Time Warner is in the process of buying Adelphia out. Once this is done, and their plant is upgraded, they will have the same services as Time Warner customers.
- 9) She does not know if Time Warner will buy out Adelphia's franchise agreement.

Agenda Item #6: Soil and Water Conservation Update

Donna Register, Director, presented a slide presentation on activities that are taking place throughout the county. Ms. Register relayed the following information on tools used within the conservation effort:

- 1) The North Carolina Agriculture Cost Share Program. This program is designed to improve water quality by preventing runoff on farmland. It is strictly a non point source pollution tool. Last year they had 27 contracts for a total of \$154,415.00. Some of the practices include livestock exclusions of fencing the cattle out of the stream and proper waste management.
- 2) The Environmental Quality Incentives Program. This program includes residue management and cropland conversion. They have 15 contracts for a total of \$150,000.00.
- 3) The Conservation Reserves Program. This is a federal program designed to retire sensitive agriculture lands to improve wildlife, habitat and prevent erosion. Landowners in this program receive an annual rental payment. They have a total of 37 contracts and a total obligation of \$116,000.00.
- 4) Resource Conservation and Development. This program is locally led and allows local units of government to pull together to get things accomplished. One program they will be working on this year is the Waccamaw River Storm Debris removal. For every dollar the county assigns to soil and water, they spend \$5.23 (five dollars and twenty three cents) from the CRP Program (federal program), the North Carolina Ag Cost Share Program (a state program) along with other programs and grants.
- 5) Conservation Technical Assistance Program.

Ward Stocks, private citizen, stated the following:

1) He is a hog farmer and Donna has worked closely helping a lot of hog farmers get cost share money or they could not have done extra things. He advised he received a cost share to get an incinerator for his hog farm but he had to qualify for the program to receive such.

Mr. Bobby Stanley, Chairman of the Soil and Water Conservation Board, relayed the following information:

- 1) There are 79 contracts in the programs Donna has shown you.
- 2) Donna and her staff do all the work for the contracts.
- 3) The total amount of dollars brought in was almost \$700,000.00.
- 4) The RC & D program with the Waccamaw River cleanout will be a big project and they hope to have bids out and a contract before long.
- 5) The water has to be below a certain level at the Pireway marker to complete the project.
- 6) Thank you for what you allow Soil and Water to do.
- 7) One of his desires is to see the Lumber River Basin, which includes the Waccamaw River, eligible for CREPE. This program almost doubles the payment the landowner gets.
- 8) A new study will be done on water quality in the Lumber River Basin and there will probably be some public meetings. The Cleanwater Management Trust Fund looks at an application for a project and if that problem shows up in the River Basin Study, it makes it easier for them to grant us funds.

Commissioner Memory advised he has contacted Donna several times and she has taken it upon herself and her team to keep the constituents in this county happy and he appreciates that.

Agenda Item #7: Approval of Low Bid and Purchase of Five Police Interceptor Vehicles

Mr. Varner advised we had four bidders for the purchase of five (5) police interceptor vehicles and the low bid was Quality Ford. Commissioner Jacobs made a motion to approve the purchase of the five (5) vehicles from Quality Ford with a second by Commissioner Memory. Discussion: Commissioner McKenzie abstained from voting. The motion so carried.

Agenda Item#8: Establishment of a Public Hearing Date for the Columbus County Sewer Use Ordinance and for this to be Considered the First Reading of Two (2) Required Readings

Mr. Varner advised this is a state and federal government requirement and we must have these two (2) public hearings and open it up for discussion. He also advised Stan Taylor, with O'Brien and Gere is available for technical questions. Leroy Sellers advised this document itself is part of a state program. He has read through a lot of it and has had several others to review it and it is now

ready to open it up to the public.

Chairman Godwin advised that part of the ordinance must be read in order for this to be considered a first reading. Deputy Clerk Gail Edwards read the first paragraph as follows:

"This ordinance sets forth uniform requirements for direct and indirect contributors into the wastewater collection and treatment system for Columbus County, hereafter referred to as the County, and enables the County to comply with all applicable State and Federal laws, including the Clean Water Act and the General Pretreatment Regulations."

Commissioner Godwin asked for a motion to suspend further reading of the ordinance and this be classified as the first reading. The motion was so moved by Commissioner Jacobs with a second by Commissioner Norris. The motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Memory made a motion to have a Public Hearing on March 20, 2006 at 6:30 P.M. for public input on the Columbus County Sewer Use Ordinance with a second by Commissioner McKenzie. Discussion: Commissioner Memory noted that the proposed ordinance will be on display at the public libraries and the administration office for the public to come by and look at prior to the Public Hearing. The motion carried unanimously.

Agenda Item #9: Approval of Broker of Record Letter

Commissioner Norris made a motion with a second by Commissioner Jacobs to approve the broker of record agreement with Mark III for all of our insurance needs subject to the attorney drafting a final contract. The motion carried unanimously.

Agenda Item # 10: Adoption of Resolution of Reimbursement

Chairman Jacobs made a motion to adopt the following Resolution of Reimbursement by the Sitting Columbus County Board of Commissioners to the Columbus County General Fund Account, with a second by Commissioner Norris. Discussion: Chairman Godwin advised this means any money they have spent on water districts would eventually be reimbursed as the districts become solvent. The motion carried unanimously.

RESOLUTION of REIMBURSEMENT by the SITTING COLUMBUS COUNTY BOARD of COMMISSIONERS to the COLUMBUS COUNTY GENERAL FUND ACCOUNT

WHEREAS, Columbus County is a political subdivision organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of North Carolina; **and**

WHEREAS, the said County has made expenditures with respect to expenses incurred and were incurred in connection with the acquisition, construction and the production of certain Columbus County Water Districts' projects; **and**

WHEREAS, decisions were reached by the Columbus County Board of Commissioners, by a majority vote, to expend monies from the Columbus County General Fund Account for certain Columbus County Water Districts' debt payoffs and projects; **and**

WHEREAS, the said funds expended from the Columbus County General Fund Account were the Columbus County taxpayers' dollars; **and**

WHEREAS, the legal and appropriate guideline to follow is to ensure the Columbus County General Fund Account is reimbursed from the fund benefitted; **and**

WHEREAS, the decision to expend monies, on the behalf of the Columbus County Water Districts' debt payoffs and/or projects, was reached on the stated condition that at the time the said project reaches the financial status of profitable operation, the said project will reimburse the Columbus County General Fund Account the full amount that has been expended on their behalf, plus interest, which will accrue annually and added to the principle amount; **and**

WHEREAS, the said interest on the Columbus County Water Districts' debt payoffs will be calculated annually and added to the principle amount in accordance with the stipulations of the prime

rate; and

WHEREAS, the said Columbus County Finance Officer will be responsible for the calculation of the monetary amounts for the said Columbus County Water Districts' debt payoffs and/or projects, and will report to the Columbus County Board of Commissioners on an annual basis; **and**

WHEREAS, the **then** sitting Columbus County Board of Commissioners will be held legally bound and responsible to pay the applicable amounts back to the Columbus County General Fund Account.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the sitting Columbus County Board of Commissioners desires to commit to the following:

- 1. A Reimbursement Resolution for any funds that have been expended on any Columbus County Water Districts' debt payoffs and/or project from the General Fund;
- 2. Interest will be added annually to the Columbus County Water Districts' debt payoff and/or project in accordance with the stipulations of the prime rate;
- 3. At the time the certain project becomes operational in a profitable manner, the debt will be paid in a manner that is feasible;
- 4. This Reimbursement Resolution legally binds all future Columbus County Board of Commissioners to the said Columbus County Water Districts' debt payoffs and/or project;
- 5. This Resolution of Reimbursement will supercede the existing Resolution of Reimbursement adopted by the Columbus County Board of Commissioners on September 20, 2004; **and**
- 6. This Resolution of Reimbursement will cover any and all expenditures paid from the Columbus County General Fund for certain Columbus County Water Districts' debt payoffs and/or projects.

Chairman Godwin added that Milton McLean will also serve as a resource person to this committee. Commissioner Dutton added Commissioner Prevatte will also serve on this committee.

Agenda Item #12: Departmental Update : Roxanne Coleman, Finance Officer

Roxanne Coleman, Finance Officer, relayed the following information:

- 1. Finance is staying very busy and they have three new employees.
- 2. One of those persons is working with Debra Epps in Accounts Payable.
- 3. Since July, payroll has issued almost 6000 direct deposits and checks.
- 4. Purchasing is going well.
- 5. In January, they released all of the 1099's and W2's.
- 6. She is currently working on the liability and property renewal.
- 7. Her office has been compiling the electronic information for the budget to give to the departments.
- 8. They are monitoring the accounts that budget amendments have to be prepared for between now and June.
- 9. She will implement a general internal control cash handling procedure by the end of the month. She will do a small booklet for each department and maybe talk to those that handle the cash. She will also do random checks on petty cash each month.

- 10. The total cash and investments equal \$19,208,174.00.
- 11. Current General Fund only revenue collections from period beginning July 1, 2005 thru December 31, 2005 were 53.24% versus 49.7% for the same time frame for 2004. Revenues are slightly higher than this time last year.
- 12. Revenues collected from all funds for the same periods are 70.54% versus 70.87%. Overall revenues are running about the same.
- 13. Current General Fund only expenditures are 49.19% expended versus 47.65 % for the same time frame. Expenses are slightly higher than this time last year.
- 14. Current expenditures for all funds are 68.66% versus 70.54% for the same time frame.
- 15. The finance office has a wealth of information for departments, the county manager and the commissioners.
 - 16) We will have to put in close to \$1,000,000.00 in Medicaid.
- 17) \$3,500,000.00 has been spent in Medicaid and we have budgeted \$4,200,000.00 and it will be closer to \$5,500,000.00. There is also a problem with the Daycare expense not being budgeted at DSS. It will have to come out of the general fund.

Chairman Godwin recommended that Commissioner Memory, Finance Committee Chairman, Mr. Varner and Ms. Coleman get together and go over the numbers to see exactly what we are looking at so the Board can start planning what the last three (3) months of the fiscal year are going to look like.

Commissioner Dutton advised we could reduce property taxes 17 cents if it weren't for the Medicaid program, which is a federal and state mandated program, but Raleigh and the federal people ought to do like the other states. We are the only state left that the state makes the county pay a portion in the United States. Our legislators ought to realize what a problem we have and they ought to go to Raleigh and find money to relieve the taxpayers that the state of North Carolina has put a burden on the property tax owner in Columbus County; not this Board of Commissioners. The county is not the problem. Raleigh is the problem and they need to fund this program. The Board of Commissioners needs to pass a resolution asking our legislators and the Governor of this state to help the people of Columbus County. Commissioner Prevatte agreed with Commissioner Dutton and discussed an article that was in the Star News recently. Chairman Godwin advised this is an issue that is important to our Board and the Association of County Commissioners and they asked this past year to take the half-cent sales tax and use that to pay for Medicaid at the county level. He added they kept the half-cent sales tax but we're still suffering.

Commissioner Dutton made a motion with a second by Commissioner Memory to send a new resolution to our legislators and the Governor asking them to help us with Medicaid relief. The motion carried unanimously.

- A, **Public comments:** Private citizen Jim Nance advised the following:
- 1. He is from Evergreen.
- 2. He wants to talk about the Noise Ordinance and if it can be enforced or not enforced.
- 3. He advised a judge dismissed a citation in early February because the deputy did not have the correct date on the citation and he did not have a certified copy of the ordinance.
- 4. Approximately 250 feet from his residence is a juke joint located at Tar Landing.
- 5. Monthly drunks go there and they are loud until about 1:00 A.M.
- 5. The patrons then move outside and ride around in loud trucks for approximately one hour. Sheriff Batten could not help him.
- 6. He wants it enforced if it is enforceable.

Chairman Godwin advised it is tough to enforce because we do not have countywide zoning. After discussion, he asked Attorney Steve Fowler and the Planning Board to review the ordinance. Commissioner Memory asked that Mr. Nance be contacted when the attorney and the planning board present their findings at the March 20, 2006 Board of Commissioners meeting.

Sheriff Batten added he contacted the elected District Attorney last year and he told him to go ahead with the process he has developed. They warn people prior to 11:00 P.M. and if they have had a warning prior to 11:00 P.M., they are issued a citation after 11:00 P.M. If they have not had a warning prior to 11:00 P.M., they receive one warning and then a citation. He advised this is the first citation to go before a judge. The Sheriff advised he immediately got a certified copy of the noise ordinance to the district attorney's office. Step by step he is trying to eliminate the loopholes in the ordinance one at a time to put together ant ordinance that will work. He advised he has also had several conversations with Mr. Fowler about revamping this noise ordinance.
