Karen King, Administrative Assistant, delivered the following Departmental Update to the Board.

- 1. The Inspections Department is currently performing inspections for all four (4) trades in the following areas, plus the rural areas surrounding: Boardman, Bolton, Chadbourn, Lake Waccamaw, Riegelwood and Sandyfield;
- 2. Electrical inspections only, in the following areas: Brunswick, Fair Bluff and Tabor City;
- 3. Currently, our office has three (3) employees:
 - Karen King Administrative Assistant
 - Kenny Davis Director (Certified Level III, all trades)
 - Kyle Duncan Building Inspector I (Probationary-Level I, all trades);
- 4. The review time for plans is approximately two (2) weeks;
- 5. During the calendar year January 1, 2005 through December 31, 2005, 995 permits were issued, and \$192,872.92 fees were collected;
- 6. During this present calendar year, beginning January 01, 2006, until March 31, 2006, 257 permits have been issued, and \$40,315.55 fees collected;
- 7. For the Fiscal Year 2004-2005, beginning July 01, 2004 through, June 30, 2005, 888 permits were issued, and \$186,173.16 fees were collected;
- 8. For the current fiscal year 2005-2006, beginning July 01, 2005 through March 31, 2006, 796 permits were issued, and \$121,117.48 fees were collected;
- 9. The department's appropriated budgeted amount was \$229,985.00, our expenditures year to date are \$116,090.37, which leaves an unencumbered balance of \$113,894.63; **and**
- 10. This department is a self supporting department.

Discussion was conducted relative to the difficulty of locating a Level III Inspector at the salary we are presently offering.

CHILD PROTECTION AMENDMENT <u>RESOLUTION</u>

WHEREAS, sexual predators are causing an increasing threat to the citizens of Columbus County and the State of North Carolina; **and**

WHEREAS, the children in our community deserve to be able to live, learn, and grow up in an environment that is free from the increasing risk of abduction, injury, and/or death at the hands of sexual predators; **and**

WHEREAS, the perpetrators of such heinous crimes do not have rights that outweigh the protection of innocent children; and

WHEREAS, the present system of punishment provides too much discretion upon the sentencing of such criminals.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, THAT THE COLUMBUS COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS recommends to the North Carolina Legislature that the sentencing provision for child sexual predators should be increased in order that such criminals be punished for a first offense at the maximum level that is permissible under the United States Constitution and the Constitution of the State of North Carolina.

FURTHER, BE IT RESOLVED that the North Carolina Legislature should pass the provisions of Jessica's Law in the event that its provisions are constitutionally permissible.
