PUBLIC HEARING: Proposed Rural Operating Assistance Program (ROAP)

**Application** - the purpose of this Public Hearing is to inform the public of an application to be submitted to the North Carolina Department of Transportation no later than July 13, 2007 by the County of Columbus, and to receive oral or written comments.

#### **PUBLIC HEARING OPENED:**

At 6:15 P.M., Commissioner McKenzie made a motion to open the Public Hearing for the Proposed Rural Operating Assistance Program (ROAP) Application, seconded by Commissioner Gore. The motion unanimously carried.

Chairman Jacobs requested that Charles Patton, Public Transportation Director, give a brief overview of this application. Mr. Patton stated the following:

- 1. This program is an annual one hundred (100%) percent grant;
- 2. The program is made up of three (3) parts, which are as follows:
  - -ETAP which involves dialysis and medical appointments;
  - -Work First with the Department of Social Services employment; and
  - -Rural General Public which provides transportation, at a minimum fee, for anyone in Columbus County outside of city limits, and generates revenue;
- 4. The fee for the general public is two and 00/100 (\$2.00) dollars for in-town trips and five and 00/100 (\$5.00) dollars for the rural areas of the County;
- 5. We have on-demand service which means anywhere in Columbus County; and
- 6. We made six thousand to seven thousand (6,000 7,000) trips last year involving five hundred to seven hundred (500 700) different people.

Commissioner McKenzie asked Mr. Patton if the Rural General Public Program could generate revenue for the General Fund. Mr. Patton replied stating the revenue generated must go back to the Department of Transportation.

Leo Hunt, Interim Finance Officer, stated the County was contributing very little to this program and it is supporting veterans at fifteen thousand and 00/100 (\$15,000) dollars per year.

At 6:23 P.M., Commissioner Memory made a motion to close the Public Hearing, seconded by Commissioner Bullard. The motion unanimously carried.

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- 1. On May 18, 2007, the Medicaid Advisory Committee held a meting with Jeffery Simms and other State and Federal representatives, which lasted three (3) hours;
- 2. We were informed that State and Federal law control Medicaid, and there is not anything this committee can do to make a difference;
- 3. This committee's hands are tied due to Federal and State constraints in accomplishing the tasks we are assigned to do;
- 4. The Medicaid Advisory Committee met on June 05, 2007, and a motion was made to dissolve the Columbus County Medicaid Advisory Committee due to its inability to accomplish the tasks we are assigned to do, and the motion passed;
- 5. We were told the Department of Social Services controls Medicaid; and
- 6. We are requesting the Columbus County Board of Commissioners to dissolve the Medicaid Advisory Committee.

Vice Chairman Prevatte stated he attended this meeting with Jeffery Simms and he concurred with Ms. Foley's information.

Commissioner McKenzie stated the Columbus County Department of Social Services was one of the best in the State.

Commissioner Memory made a motion to dissolve the Columbus County Medicaid Advisory Committee, and the Clerk to send a letter of thanks to each member for their service on this committee, seconded by Commissioner McKenzie. The motion unanimously carried.

Commissioner McKenzie made a motion to approve the Non-urbanized Area Public Transportation Grant Agreement for Public Body Organizations Community Transportation Program - Section 5311, CFDA Number: 20.509, Project Number: 08-CT-076 with the North Carolina Department of Transportation, seconded by Vice Chairman Prevatte. The motion unanimously carried. A copy of this document will be kept on file in the Office of the Clerk to the Board for review.

#### **Agenda Item #11: HEALTH DEPARTMENT - DEPARTMENTAL UPDATE:**

Kimberly Smith, Columbus County Health Director, delivered the following Departmental

#### Update to the Board:

- 1. Adult Health: 2300 flu vaccines, 100 pneumonia vaccines
  In 2006, a total of 4 confirmed cases of tuberculosis and 25 confirmed new cases of HIV.
  In 2006, with the assistance of the District Attorney's Office, convicted two (2) individuals for violating Public Health Law so they spent one hundred twenty (120) days in the NC Correctional Facility in Raleigh. Also saw an increase in the number of cases of Gonorrhea, Syphilis and Hepatitis B in our County.
- 2. **Child Health**: 4,146 Immunizations were given at the Health Department. This represents 87% of all vaccines given in our County. In August, 2006, the Health Department lost our FNP. We are continuing to recruit, but to date, we have been unable to hire anyone due mainly to salary requirements.
- 3. **Dental Services**: Provided dental services to a total of 2,473 children in Columbus County in 2006. 80.5% Were Medicaid, 13.5 were Health Choice, 6% were uninsured. At this time last year, we were trying to find two (2) dentists and other staff. Today, I am very happy to say we have two (2) full-time dentists and are fully staffed. Our Toothmobile is currently parked at Tabor City Elementary School for the summer.
- 4. **Environmental Health**: Inspected 892 food and lodging businesses (including the hospital, city and county schools, and area nursing homes). Completed six (6) lead investigations, permitted 15 swimming pools and five (5) tattoo parlors, issued 570 septic tank permits. Total amount of fees collected for 2006 were \$82,001.00.
- 5. **Family Planning**: Our biggest problem in Family Planning this year consisted of the 790% increases in the price of contraceptives. The state did step in and the percentage did decrease to only 97% increase.
- 6. **Home Health**: In 2006, was accredited through the Accreditation Commission for Health Services. We were recognized as providing "programs of superior quality". Total unduplicated patients served 1,243. Indigent care: \$10,466.02.
- 7. **Lab**: Total test processed 23,357.
- 8. **Vital Statistics**: 513 Births and 520 deaths.
- 9. **Maternal Health**: 157 Babies whose mothers received prenatal care delivered at Columbus Regional HealthCare System. The Prenatal Clinic has experienced a 22% increase in non-paying patients.
- 10. **Preparedness and Response**: All staff completed the Incident Command System Training (ICS). All plans that were required by Crisis Communication Plan. Strategic National Stockpile (SNS) Plan, and the pandemic Influenza Plan were all developed and submitted to the State on time during 2006. We are now in the process of revising and updating all these plans to continue to meet the ever-changing State requirements.
- 11. **Women, Infant and Children**: Total WIC vouchers revenue \$1,415,032. On average, for every \$1.00 spent on the WIC Program in Columbus County, \$4.50 is generated in revenue for Columbus County businesses.
- 12. Columbus County Health Department (not Home Health): Calendar Year
  - Provided 46,893 patient services, 29,231 were Medicaid reimbursed services and 17,662 non-Medicaid reimbursed services (private pay, private insurance, no pay). This represents a 2% decrease in Medicaid reimbursable services. I feel this represents a 2% increase in individuals receiving services and the Health Department not getting reimbursed for those services.

**Robert Adams:** I would like an update on the progress of the re-districting project. Steve Fowler, Columbus County Attorney, replied stating the information from the demographers has been provided to the County Commissioners for their review.
