### RESUMED BUDGET WORKSHOP CALLED to ORDER:

At 5:30 P.M., Chairman Prevatte called the June 09, 2008 Budget Workshop, which is resumed from June 09, 2008, to order, and stated the purpose of this Budget Workshop was to continue the discussion of the Proposed 2008 - 2009 Columbus County Operating Budget with Whiteville City Schools, the Health Department and Columbus County Schools.

## **COMMENTS by DEPARTMENT HEADS:**

- 1. **Whiteville City Schools (Dr. Shaver):** stated the following:
  - A. I have with me tonight the following staff members:
    - -Jay Stanley, Finance Officer;
    - -Anthony Martin;
    - -Hope Kennedy High, Human Resources; and
    - -Cindy Williamson, Associate Superintendent;
  - B. I will provide to you some historical funding, Jay Stanley, Chief Financial Officer, will provide information on the finances and Anthony Martin will speak on the Capital Outlay Budget;

the financial situation the County was facing, and he would appreciate any amount the County gives to the Whiteville City Schools.

## 2. **Kimberly Smith (Health Department):** stated the following:

- A. I have included in my budget an additional position which will be a Quality Assurance position;
- B. I have twenty-four (24) separate budgets to work with, of which six (6) are funded with taxpayers money, three (3) are total grant funding, and all the remaining budgets are State reimbursed;
- C. Presently, there are ten (10) registered nurses at the Health Department;
- D. In the year 2010, we will be surveyed to be accredited by the State Division of Public Health:
- E. We need to start preparing for this accreditation which is a lengthy process;
- F. In 2005, we had ninety-five (95) employees, and in 2007, we had sixty-seven (67) employees which is a 25.9% decrease, and in between these years, there was a reduction in force (RIF), due to the ending of grant funding;
- G. This additional position I have included in the budget is a Public Health Nurse II at \$55,000;
- H. We badly need the Quality Assurance to be brought up to date, and steadily maintained, and, in addition, this person could help at the emergency shelters when they are open;
- I. I would like to clarify some information in the News Reporter as follows: The Health Department is Medicare Certified (Homehealth) and the Department of Aging is Medicaid certified (Home Care);
- J. The money for uniforms in the budget was started in 1990, and the amount is \$200 per year for a full-time employee, and \$100 per year for a part-time employee.

### 3. **Dr. Dan Stricklkand (Columbus County Schools):** stated the following:

- A. I appreciate the opportunity to speak to you tonight;
- B. I do understand the financial situation you are facing with this budget, which we seem to be in the same situation;
- C. We will greatly appreciate any allocation of funds that we receive;
- D. I have with me tonight the following staff: Monty Herring, Allen Faulk and Terry Dudney;
- E. For the past three (3) years, we have received no additional funds from the County;
- F. The State is proposing a seven (7%) percent salary increase for certified personnel, and a five (5%) percent salary increase for non-certified employees;
- G. We have included three (3) additional teaching positions, which are badly needed;
- H. We have included local supplements for teachers and support staff;
- I. SIMMS has informed us to move the employees from the 55 Pay Grade to the 65 Pay Grade, of which we have fifteen (15) SIMMS employees, and if this is implemented, it will cost \$500,000;
- J. N.C. Wise is to be implemented in December, 2008;
- K. There has been no increase in low-wealth dollars;
- L. The average age of our school buildings is fifty (50) years;
- M. Columbus County is the third largest county in the State;
- N. We now have Alternative Academies in some of the high schools; and
- O. I have provided a copy of our budget that was submitted to William S. Clark, County Manager, and, as you can see, our needs are many, but our funds are limited.

Chairman Prevatte thanked each one for their input, and stated to the Board members for them to take time to deliberate on the Proposed 2008 - 2009 Columbus County Operating Budget, and recommend the areas to be cut as soon as you can.

# **BUDGET WORKSHOP RECESSED:**

At 7:07 P.M., Commissioner Bullard made a motion to recess the June 09, 2008 Budget Workshop until a later date for the final Budget Workshop, to be determined at the next Board Meeting, seconded by Commissioner Norris.

After discussion was conducted relative to the manner in which this final Budget Workshop would be conducted, Commissioner Bullard withdrew his motion, and Commissioner Norris withdrew his second.

At 7:13 P.M., Commissioner Bullard made the following motion:

- A. Recess the June 09, 2008 Budget Workshop until a later date, for the final Budget Workshop;
- B. Said final Budget Workshop is to be conducted with the County Manager and the Deputy Finance Officer, and no department heads;
- C. This date is to be determined at the next County Commissioners Board Meeting; and
- D. Said Final Budget Workshop will be to discuss the recommendations, by the Board members, of areas to cut in the Proposed 2008 2009 Columbus County Operating Budget.

This motion was seconded by Commissioner McKenzie. The motion unanimously passed.

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
