The Honorable Board of County Commissioners held the regular monthly session in the Commissioners' office at the Courthouse on Monday, May 5, 1930. Members of the Board present were:

The minutes of all the meetings held during the month of April were read and approved, after which the Board transacted the following business:

Ordered: That Sallie Blackwell, of Chadbourn, be given \$5.00 per month, first check to be issued as of this date.

Ordered: That J. E. Williams of Ransom Township be given credit for \$9.28 on 1928 taxes because of his paying James Williams' tax by mistake in Ransom Township when he desired to pay his tax; it is further ordered that James Williams' taxes for 1928 be advertised along with the Tax Collector's 1929 tax sale.

Ordered: That Fair Bluff Township be allowed to change from a 12ϕ tax rate and free labor to an all-tax system, on account of the filing of a petition signed by a majority of citizens and taxpayers in said township asking for permission to levy a higher rate for necessary road work.

Mrs. W. R. DeVane made a request before the Board of County Commissioners that she be allowed a leave of absence from her work in the Tax Department, whereupon the County Commissioners passed the following order:

That Mrs. W. R. DeVane be allowed a leave of absence for thirty days without pay.

That Mrs. P. K. Avant be placed in charge of the tax work during Mrs. DeVane's absence at the same salary received by Mrs. DeVane.

That Mrs. M. S. Barksdale be employed to work in the Tax Department during the time Mrs. DeVane is away from her work.

The foregoing order was carried by a motion made before the Board by D. W. Merritt and seconded by J. C. Hooks, Sr., Those voting for adoption of the order were--J. R. Blake, J. C. Hooks, Sr., D. W. Merritt, D. F. McGougan. Voting no, none; not voting, H. G. Avant.

Ordered: That the valuation on the stock of merchandise and store fixtures listed by S. P. Stanley in Whiteville Township be reduced from \$4,000.00 to \$3,000.00, this reduction being allowed on account of overvaluation. 178

Ordered: That the road from Jones' Cross-roads to H. K. Gore's place via Cypress Swamp in Bug Hill Township (about $l\frac{1}{2}$ miles in distance) be added to the mileage of the road project now maintained by R. V. White's road force.

Ordered: That a road leading from the Stewart place to the Chadbourn and Tabor road in Williams Township be added to the mileage of the road project now being maintained by G. C. White's road force.

A delegation of so-called "Indians" made a complaint before the County Commissioners on account of the list-taker in Waccamaw Township refusing to allow them to list as Indians for the year 1930. On account of the fact that those persons making complaint have never produced records which would substantiate their contention that they are really Indians, the Board of . County Commissioners ordered that they be allowed to list this year, as was the case in 1928 and 1929, as "colored under protest". By listing in this manney it does not necessarily class them as Negroes and would also give them the privilege of producing records to substantiate their racial lineage, after which a satisfactory plan of listing could be agreed upon.

Ordered: That Johnson Pierce, of Whiteville, be given \$6.60 as present relief.

Several persons living in Welches Creek No. 4 (Burney School District) asked the Board of County Commissioners to refund them on special school tax charged against them in **Bog**ue No. 1 School District without ever having been allowed the privilege of voting the rate for said district on themselves. As was the case in Lees Township, the County Commissioners ordered that all persons who hereafter present certificates signed by the School Committee from Bogue No. 1 School District stating that those persons do not reside or own land in said district, shall be refunded the amount of special school tax charged against them, Welches Creek No. 4 District not being a special taxing district.

Mrs. Agnes Barnhardt made her report to the Board of County Commissioners

on the date of this meeting, whereupon an order affecting the following persons was passed:

That W. G. Holmes, of Bolton, N. C., who has been receiving \$5.00

per month, be dropped from the Outdoor Poor list.

That A. J. Merritt, of Cerro Gordo, N. C., who received \$3.00 per

month, be dropped from said list.

That the allowance of \$2.00 made to Wash Butler, of Whiteville, N. C., be discontinued.

That the name of Mrs. Amanda Ward of Clarendon be dropped from said list, the amount she received being \$4.00 per month. It was further ordered that Hicks Pate and family be placed back on the Outdoor Poor list to receive \$15.00 per month, first check to be issued as of the date of this order; each monthly check is to be given to Mrs. Barnhardt in order that she may supervise the expenditures of the money for the welfare of the family.

Ordered: That the bills presented to the Board by Mrs. Barnhardt be paid, a record of said bills and their amounts being made below:

Ordered: That Mrs. Mollie Evans, of Chadbourn, R. F. D., be admitted to the County Home.

A petition requesting the submission to the voters in the matter of a bond issue of \$60,000.00 for the purpose of erection of schoolhouses at Bug Hill and New Hope, which petition was tendered on April 26, 1930, was presented to the Board by the Clerk with a certificate showing his findings; the Board deemed the petition to be sufficient to order a referendum in accordance with the provisions in the County Finance Act.

Ordered: That the Tax Collector refund Quinn-Brown Furniture Company on \$7,376.00 in Whiteville Township for the year 1929, reason for refund being that Corporation receipt No. 11 is hereby cancelled and another Corporation receipt bearing the No. 179 has been drawn at the direction of the State Board of Assessment which certified to us a change in the above named corporation's original listing.

Ordered: That the Tax Collector refund Henry B. Schumaker in Bolton Township for the year 1929 on \$7,200.00 valuation and 25¢ for listing fees, this order being to cancel receipt No. 548 and to set up receipts No. 622 in the name of Thomas Gallivan carrying a valuation of \$3,900.00 and No. 623 in the name of Henry Schumaker carrying a valuation of \$3,300.00.

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Ordered: That the Tax Collector refund W. B. McKinney in Waccamaw Township for the year 1929 on \$450.00 valuation, reason for refund being to cancel receipt No. 129 on account of double listing, the lot covered by this listing being included in the valuation of receipt No. 130.

Ordered: That the Tax Collector refund Harvey Baldwin in Bug Hill Township for the year 1929 on \$1,008.00 valuation. This refund is allowed on account of error in listing. Valuation should be \$100.00. Receipt No. 434 is hereby cancelled and receipt No. 558 has been drawn. Ordered: That the Tax Collector refund Mrs. Annie Meyers in Ransom Township for the year 1929 on \$4,485.00 valuation and \$2.00 dog tax. This order is to cancel receipt No. 296 and to set up receipt No. 845 in the name of Guy Cardwell, carrying a valuation of \$3,000.00, and receipt No. 846 in the name of Annie E. Meyers carrying a valuation of \$1,485.00.

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Ordered: That the Tax Collector refund Mrs. George W. Brown in Tatum Township for the year 1929 on \$16,625.00 valuation, this refund being to cancel receipt No. 862 and set up receipt No. 928 in the name of Mrs. George W. Brown, Agt, carrying a valuation of \$11,875.00 and receipt No. 929 in the name of Mrs. George W. Brown, carrying a valuation of \$4,750.00

Ordered: That the Tax Collector refund L. C. Bonkemeyer in Chadbourn Township for the year 1929 on \$485.00 valuation, this refund is allowed on account of error in listing, Personal Property exemption not deducted properly on abstract.

Ordered: That the Tax Collector refund F. D. Martin in Whiteville Township for the year 1929 on \$4,250.00, reason for refund being that an error of \$4,000.00 in listing Solvent Credits, which were listed at \$10,000.00 but should have been \$6,000.00, was made by the list-taker; an error was also made in valuing automobiles at \$500.00 when they were given in at \$250.00.

Ordered: That the Tax Collector refund 0. H. Moffitt in Whiteville Township for the year 1929 on \$100.00 valuation, this refund being allowed on account of over-valuation on his automobile. At the time of listing his car was believed to be a 1928 model, whereas it is really a 1927 model Chevrolet.

Ordered: That the Tax Collector refund J. W. Jordan in Williams Township for the year 1929 on \$1,875.00 valuation, this refund being allowed in order to cancel receipt No. 902 which covers the listing of a 70-acre tract of Garrell land carried on the penalty list in the name of J. W. Jordan. This property is listed and the taxes paid under name of D. H. Jordan.

Ordered: That the Tax Collector refund Frank Smith of Lees Township

for the year 1929 on one penalized poll tax. This refund is ordered to cancel receipt No. 740 on account of said Frank Smith being too old to pay poll tax, he being 53 years old, and the tax on his land having already been paid under the name of Mrs. Mary M. Smith.
