The following business was transacted:

Ordered: that the negotiated bids for Columbus County Courthouse Annex be accepted and that the county enter into contract with East Carolina Construction Co. for general contract in the amount of \$74,412.00; Waccamaw Electric Co. for \$4,610.75; McGirt's Heating and Electrical Service for \$10,125.00; Thomas Stanley Plumbing Contractor for \$4,630.70; thereby allowing \$4,686.92 for architects fee. It is further ordered that the Board of Commissioners retain the remaining \$1,532.63 with which to select and furnish lighting fixtures for said building and to install telephone conduit in said building. Said contracts to include the deviations from original bid and proposed contract as attached to each individual contract by the architect.

Ordered: that \$112,000 proceeds from sale of Columbus County Hospital Bonds be deposited in Waccamaw Bank & Trust Co., Whiteville, N. C.

Ordered: that \$100,000 proceeds from sale of Courthouse Annex Bonds be deposited in First National Bank of Whiteville.

Ordered: that W. F.Floyd, "hairman, be authorized agent to approve payments for engineering fees, construction and incidentals of Columbus County Courthouse Annex.

Ordered: that Holloway, Weber, & Reeves be paid 75% of Architects

fee on Columbus County Courthouse Annex upon receiptefrom the sale on bonds.

Ordered: that the tax collector be given a release on a valuation of \$970.00 for a tractor that was listed to H. Smith, Welches Creek Township, and valued wrong. Ordered: that the tax collector be given a release on a valuation of \$660.00 on an automobile listed to Paul Brown, Cerro Gordo Township, through error.

Upon motion the meeting was adjourned until June 2, 1952, at 10:00 A.M.
