

The Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus North Carolina, met in regular session at the County Courthouse in Whiteville, North Carolina, the regular place of meeting, at 10 o'clock, A.M. on October 7, 1968.

Present: Chairman W. O. Johnson, and Commissioners T. E. Burns, H. J. Watts, J. Roland Gore and Edward W. Williamson.

Absent: None

The Chairman announced that this was the date and hour fixed by the Board for the public hearing upon the order entitled:

"ORDER AUTHORIZING \$4,000,000 SCHOOL BUILDING BONDS",

and that the Board would immediately hear any and all citizens and taxpayers who might desire to protest against the issuance of said bonds.

No citizen or taxpayer of the County appeared, either in person or by attorney, to protest against the issuance of any of said bonds, and the Clerk announced that no protest in writing, signed by any citizen or taxpayer, had been presented.

Thereupon, upon motion of Commission Edward W. Williamson seconded by Commissioner T. E. Burns and carried, the order introduced and passed on first reading on September 16, 1968 entitled: "ORDER AUTHORIZING \$4,000,000 SCHOOL BUILDING BONDS", was read a second time and placed upon its final passage. The vote upon the final passage of said order was:

Ayes: Commissioners T. E. Burns, H. J. Watts, J. Roland Gore and Edward W. Williamson.

Noes: None

The Chairman then announced that the order entitled: "ORDER AUTHORIZING \$4,000,000 SCHOOL BUILDING BONDS" had passed.

The Clerk was thereupon directed to publish said order in The News Reporter, once in each of two successive weeks, and to publish at the foot of said order the appended note as required by The County Finance Act, as amended.

Thereupon Commission Williamson introduced the following resolution which was read:

RESOLUTION CALLING A SPECIAL BOND ELECTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus:

Section 1. A special bond election is hereby called to be held on Tuesday, December 10, 1968, between 6:30 A.M. and 6:30 P.M., at which there shall be submitted to the qualified voters of Columbus County the following question:

Shall an order finally passed on October 7, 1968, authorizing the County of Columbus, North Carolina, to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said County may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue School Building Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$4,000,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for erecting additional school buildings and other school plant facilities, remodeling, enlarging and reconstructing existing school buildings and other school plant facilities, and acquiring necessary land and equipment therefor, in order to provide additional school facilities in the County of Columbus to maintain the six months school term in said

County as required by Section 3 of Article IX of the Constitution, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?

Section 2. For said bond election the regular registration books for elections in said County shall be used and such books shall be open for the registration of voters not theretofore registered from 9 A.M. until sunset on each day, beginning Saturday, November 16, 1968 and closing Saturday, November 30, 1968. On each Saturday during such registration period such books shall be open at the polling places. Saturday, December 7, 1968, shall be Challenge Day.

Section 3. The Clerk of the Board of Commissioners shall cause a notice to be published in The News Reporter at least thirty days before the election, and thereafter twice before the election at intervals of at least one week between publications, reading substantially as follows:

A special bond election will be held throughout Columbus County between 6:30 A.M. and 6:30 P.M., on Tuesday, December 10, 1968, at which there will be submitted to the qualified voters of said County the following question:

Shall an order finally passed on October 7, 1968, authorizing the County of Columbus, North Carolina, to contract a debt, in addition to any and all other debt which said County may now or hereafter have power or authority to contract, and in evidence thereof to issue School Building Bonds in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$4,000,000 for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for erecting additional school buildings and other school plant facilities, remodeling, enlarging and reconstructing existing school buildings and other school plant facilities, and acquiring necessary land and equipment therefor, in order to provide additional school facilities in the County of Columbus to maintain the six months' school term in said County as required by Section 3 of Article IX of the Constitution, and authorizing the levy and collection of a sufficient tax for the payment of the principal of and the interest on said bonds, be approved?

The question hereinabove set forth contains a statement of the purpose for which the bonds are authorized by the order referred to in said question.

If said bonds are issued a tax will be levied for the payment of the principal and interest thereof on all taxable property in Columbus County.

For said election the regular registration books for elections in said County will be used and such books will be open for the registration of voters, not theretofore registered, from 9 A.M. until sunset on each day beginning Saturday, November 16, 1968 and closing Saturday, November 30, 1968. On each Saturday during such registration period said books will be open at the polling places. Saturday, December 7, 1968, is Challenge Day.

Any qualified voter of the County who is qualified to vote by absentee ballot under the provisions of the General Statutes of North Carolina, particularly Article 10 of Chapter 163, in a State-wide general election is authorized to vote an absentee ballot in

said special bond election in accordance with said provisions of the General Statutes relating to absentee voting. Any qualified voter of the County who is qualified to vote by absentee ballot in said special bond election may apply for an absentee ballot not earlier than forty-five days prior to said special bond election and not later than 6:00 P.M., Monday, October 21, 1968, at the office of the Columbus County Board of Elections, P. O. Box 26, Whiteville, North Carolina. Qualified voters who are not certain whether they are eligible to vote by absentee ballot should contact said Columbus County Board of Elections.

Ordered: that the Welfare Department be authorized to certify needy families to receive surplus commodities beginning December 1, 1968.

Ordered: that Mr. Colvert M. Lee be appointed to the Board of Commissioners of the Riegelwood Sanitary District. He replaces Mr. Stanley Wilson who has resigned. This appointment is temporary for the balance of Mr. Wilson's term.

Ordered: That Mr. C. W. Duggins, Whiteville, N. C. be appointed to the Board of Directors of the SENCland Community Action, Inc. to fill the unexpired term of Edward W. Williamson.

Ordered: that taxes in the name of J. P. Lanier, Williams Township be refunded in the amount of \$70.78 for the year 1967 and \$76.00 for the year 1968. Valuation of this property should have been corrected to read \$4750 in the year 1966 due to a house burning on this property but through error was not corrected.

Upon motion made by Commissioner Williamson and duly seconded by Commissioner Burns and unanimously passed that the Chairman be authorized to execute a deed on behalf of the Board of County Commissioners for a plot of land referred to in Minute Book #15, Page 485 upon receipt of purchase price and receipt of release of farm land from Richard Arp.

Upon motion made by H. J. Watts seconded by J. Roland Gore and unanimously passed that the Town of Tabor City be commended for providing courtroom facilities to be used in the District Court and ^{for} other judicial functions; and for the use of courtroom and other related judicial facilities, ~~the~~ "facilities fee" collected for the State by the Clerk of Superior Court shall be returned to the Town of Tabor City in all cases where judicial judgment is rendered where facilities are provided by the Town of Tabor City. In all matters ~~which~~ the provisions of the N. C. General Statutes 7A 302 - 7 304 and other related sections that shall apply.

Upon motion made by T. E. Burns seconded by H. J. Watts and unanimously passed that the Columbus County Drainage District #1 not be charged any collection fee by the Tax Collector, County Treasurer or any other county official for collection assessments from said Drainage District, and further that no interest is to be charged said Drainage District on the \$5,000 loan made by the Board of County Commissioners as per resolution set forth in Minute Book #15, Page 257; that said \$5,000 loan shall be repaid and collected in full out of funds now on hand in the office of the County Treasurer; that said \$5,000 is deducted from the balance on hand and shall be distributed to the Columbus County Drainage District #1 as per request dated September 30, 1968 from the Commissioners of the Columbus County Drainage District #1 by making a check payable to the Columbus County Drainage District #1 for deposit in the Waccamaw Bank & Trust Co. account number 006-000-3.

Ordered: that the taxes listed in the name of Cooperative Savings and Loan Association, Whiteville Township, be cancelled for the year 1968 due to double listing. This property was also listed to A. L. Rozier.

Ordered: that taxes in the name of Charlie Williams, South Williams Township, be cancelled for the years 1952, 1954 and 1955 due to taxpayer being deceased and no property remaining.

Ordered: that the personal property valuation listed in the name of Rozier Blackman, Lees Township, be reduced in the amount of \$5,630.00 for the year 1968 due to clerical error on abstract.

Ordered: that the taxes listed in the name of Thomas Carroll, Ransom Township, be cancelled for the year 1959 due to double listing.

Ordered: that the poll tax listed in the name of Lonnie Velton and Irene J. Young, Bolton Township, be released for the year 1968. Mr. Young is a resident of Bladen County and pays poll tax there.

Ordered: that the personal property taxes listed in the name of S. & S. Motor Sales, Inc., South Williams Township, be cancelled for the year 1963 and 1964 due to double listing.

Ordered: That the poll tax listed in the name of Clyde McCall, Tatum Township, be cancelled for the year 1950. Mr. McCall is deceased and there is no property remaining.

Ordered: that the poll tax listed in the name of John Paul Pridgen, Fair Bluff Township, be released for the year 1968. Mr. Pridgen was in the service during the month of January and is now out of the United States.
