A group of interested citizens from the county appeared before the Board to discuss the possibility of an annex of the County Library being located in the Town of Tabor City. Mr. C. A. Leggette, Jr. and Dr. H. G. Dameron were spokesman for the group and stated that a building had been secured for a library and that the Town would furnish all utilities. They further stated as citizens of the county, they would like for the county to hire a certified librarian so that Columbus County would be eligible to secure financial assistance from the State of North Carolina. Upon discussion, no action was taken but the Board stated they would look into the matter.

Several citizens appeared before the Board and expressed their concern about the food stamp program in the county which is administered through the Department of Social Services. Mr. Clifford Pierce of the Hallsboro area was spokesman for the group and stated at the present time several trips had to be made to the Department of Social Services before food stamps could be received. He further stated most of the people receiving these food stamps must hire someone to bring them into town. The Board was requested by the group to make an inquiry into this procedure. The Board of Commissioners stated they did not want to make any hardship on anyone and would look into the situation immediately.

Mr. Frank McGougan, Attorney for the Building, Plumbing and Electrical Contractors Association of Columbus County discussed the County Building Codes. He stated the local contractors had met and would like to recommend several changes in the present fee schedule so as to eliminate

hardship on them. A meeting of the Columbus County Housing Authority, County Attorney, County Building Inspector, and Mr. McGougan, attorney for the contractors will meet and recommend to the Board of Commissioners if adjustments are to be made.

Mr. Rhone Anderson appeared before the Board and asked that the garbage license heretofore granted to him be extended to a 15-mile radius of the Town of Whiteville.

Ordered: that the garbage permit heretofore granted to Mr. Rhone Anderson to cover a 6-mile radius of the Town of Whiteville, be extended to cover a 15-mile radius of the Town of Whiteville and this license shall not be exclusive neither shall it be transferable except by permission of the Board of County Commissioners.

The following resolution was presented to the Board by the Committee of One Hundred:

RESOLUTION OF COLUMBUS COUNTY COMMITTEE OF ONE HUNDRED

WHEREAS, the Columbus County Committee of One Hundred is a voluntary organization whose sole objective is the improvement of the Columbus County economy and attracting industry and creating a healthy climate between our people and industry; and

WHEREAS, the Columbus County Economic Development Commission ia an administrative body created by law with the same basic objectives; and

WHEREAS, the two organizations have worked together in harmony and have accomplished much toward the objectives for which they were formed; and

WHEREAS, the Committee of One Hundred commends the work of the Development Commission, but believes that it has been hampered in its work by the severe limitations imposed on its budget and the reduction of the tax assessment originally imposed for the administration of the Development Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Committee of One Hundred believes that it would be to the best interest of all of Columbus County that the budget of the Commission be restored and the tax assessment for its work increased at least to the point it was when the Commission was formed in 1965.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Committee of One Humdred go on record as favoring the increased budget and tax levy as aforesaid by the Board of County Commissioners and urges the Board to restore the assessment for the purpose of increasing the budget so that the Development Commission may realize the accomplishment and objective for which it was originally intended.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Board of County Commissioners with the request that they give serious consideration to the action requested herein.
