The meeting was called to order by the Chairperson and the invocation was given by Reverend David Flowers, Peace Baptist Church.

#### APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of the January 6 and January 7, 1986 meetings were approved as recorded, upon motion by Commissioner Norris, seconded by Commissioner Dew and passed unanimously.

### ITEM #8 HUNTING - OMITTED FROM AGENDA

Commissioner Worley requested that Item #8, Hunting, be omitted from the Agenda as more research is needed.

The Board concurred with the request.

### RADIOACTIVE INCINERATION PRESENTATION

Mr. David Hammonds made a presentation on the proposed construction and operation of a radioactive incinerator in Bladen County and requested the Board adopt a Resolution in opposition to the permitting of this operation.

A motion was made by Commissioner Norris, seconded by Commissioner Dew and passed unanimously to adopt a Resolution opposing the radioactive incinerator in Bladen County and also adopt a Resolution in opposition of the hazardous waste plant in the Laurinburg area to be operated by GSX Industries. Resolutions are as follows:

# RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, U.S. Ecology, Incorporated has made application to the State of North Carolina for a license to construct and operate a Radioactive Incinerator in Bladen County; and

WHEREAS, there are major concerns of contaminated materials being transported through or near Columbus County with a constant risk of accident and spillage; and

WHEREAS, there is general concern that the current technology is not sufficiently advanced to determine the long-range impact of particulate matter emitted from the proposed process on human health and the ecological system; and

WHEREAS, U.S. Ecology has failed in the past to demonstrate an effective long-term ability to show concern over the potential financial and human life protection which is their moral responsibility. That this is demonstrated by their operations in Kentucky and Illinois.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County that we call upon the State of North Carolina to place a moratorium on all such site permits throughout the State; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that Community Acceptance should be a heavily weighted factor prior to the issuance of any permit.

#### RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, GSX Services, Incorporated has made application to the State of North Carolina for a license to construct and operate a Hazardous Waste Treatment facility at the Laurinburg-Maxton Airbase in Scotland County; and

WHEREAS, there major concerns of contaminated materials being transported through or near Columbus County with a constant risk of accident and spillage; and

WHEREAS, geologist and similar experts concur that the porous soil types and high water table common to the entire Laurinburg-Maxton Air Base area pose serious and unwarranted exposure to groundwater contamination. Such concerns are enhanced by the proximity of the Lumber River; and

WHEREAS, these circumstances, coupled with the magnitude of the proposal and the wide range of chemical materials to be handled, could well produce a variety of "unknowns" that would pose even greater threats to the area, its environment and its people; and

WHEREAS, there is serious concern that the sequence of events leading to the GSX application reflect lax, hasty, and confusing siting standards, methodologies and policies that override "community acceptance" as a valid factor in the permitting process; and

WHEREAS, the recently created Hazardous Waste Treatment Commission has contracted with a consulting firm to develop a comprehensive waste management plan for North Carolina. That this plan is scheduled to be presented to the General Assembly on June 1, 1986.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County, that the State of North Carolina is requested to place a moratorium on all hazardous waste treatment facilities siting permits until the Waste Treatment Commission and other involved agencies have fully evaluated their studies of need, methodology, site selection and operation.

A motion was made by Commissioner Buffkin, seconded by Commissioner Dew and passed unanimously to approve one (1) 40 watt radio for the Welches Creek/White Marsh Volunteer Fire Department's new fire pumper and approve the budget amendment as follows: Appropriate from Non-Departmental - Contingencies (10-660-9999) in the amount of \$582.00 to be expended in Special Appropriations - Equipment/Radio (10-690-9501).

## ST. JAMES VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT - REQUEST FOR CERTIFICATION

The Board instructed the County Administrator to prepare truck specifications and present at the next Board meeting for approval.

# SHERIFF DEPARTMENT - REQUEST TO WORK WITH TEENAGERS LOITERING IN PARKING LOTS

Sheriff Bill Rhodes addressed the Board concerning the installation of chains across entrances to the Tax Office parking lots as outlined in the September 16, 1985 meeting. The Sheriff requested an additional thirty days to work with the teenagers who are loitering in parking lots and suggested chaining off back entrances to parking lots on weekends. The Sheriff's Department will take the responsibility to get permission from the property owners to chain off back entrances on weekends from 6:00 P.M. to 8:00 A.M.
