Agenda Item #6: PUBLIC INPUT:

Acting Chairman McKenzie opened the floor for public input. The following spoke.

Alfonza George: stated the following:

- 1. In the main canals that run through the farms in my community, we have a lot of beaver dams:
- 2. The water is building up in the ditches and rising onto the lands and destroying our farm land and timber; **and**
- 3. We really need help because the mosquitos are bad.

MOTION:

Agenda Item #7: TOURISM DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY - PRESENTATION of the CONSOLIDATION PLAN and TERMINATE MEMORANDUM of UNDERSTANDING:

Rhonda Dutton, Chairperson, requested the termination of the Memorandum of Understanding between the County of Columbus and the Columbus County Board of Travel and Tourism.

Chairperson Dutton stated the following:

- 1. Here tonight we have the following representatives: Chandler Worley, Evelyn Anderson, Bettina Cox, Tom Stanley, Bobbie Faircloth, Jennifer and myself;
- 2. We are a stand-alone authority that has a partnership through the County;
- 3. Jennifer has been employed by the County for accountability purposes;
- 4. Discussions have been conducted relative to the Tourism Department and the Chamber of Commerce living together;
- 5. We are doing duplicate duties, and we decided to pool our resources;

- 6. We have been doing this for eleven (11) months;
- 7. We are limited to resources unless we all work together;
- 8. We can only spend tourism money for tourism-related things;
- 9. We will keep the same appointees on the Board that you have now; and
- 10. We would meet quarterly instead of monthly, and give you a quarterly report.

Jennifer Holcomb stated the following:

- 1. Due to some areas of the county not being represented, we wanted to develop a larger footprint in the County; **and**
- 2. We are not re-inventing the wheel, we want to make the best use of our revenues.

Discussion:

Commissioner Prevatte: Do you understand that the termination of this agreement will cease your employment with Columbus County and that will end all of your benefits as a County employee?

Chairperson Dutton: Jennifer does understand that she will no longer be an employee of the County.

Commissioner Bullard: With the proposed changes that you have presented, will this affect the appointments on Monday night?

Mike Stephens, County Attorney, requested Board approval and adoption of the following Resolution Approving Conveyance of Property Pursuant to North Carolina General Statute § 160-270.

RESOLUTION APPROVING CONVEYANCE of PROPERTY PURSUANT TO NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL STATUTE § 160A-270

WHEREAS, the County of Columbus owns certain property indicated on Schedule A located in the Town of Fair Bluff, Fair Bluff Township, Columbus County, State of North Carolina; **and**

WHEREAS, the County of Columbus has by this resolution declared the aforementioned property to be surplus to its needs; **and**

WHEREAS, the North Carolina General Statute § 160A-270 authorizes a county to sell real property at public auction upon approval of the Board of County Commissioners and after publication of a notice announcing the auction; **and**

THEREFORE, the BOARD of COMMISSIONERS of COLUMBUS COUNTY RESOLVES THAT:

- 1. The Board of County Commissioners authorizes the sale at public auction the property indicated on Schedule A.
- 2. The auction will be conducted at 10:00 A.M., Monday, March 3, 2014 in the Lobby of the Columbus County Courthouse, Whiteville, North Carolina.
- 3. The terms of the sale are that the buyer must present at the action a bid deposit of five (5%) percent of the amount of the bid, either in cash or with a certified check. This deposit will be held by the County until either the Board of Commissioners rejects the high bid for the property or, if the Board of Commissioners accepts the high bid, the closing of the sale. The

deposit will be forfeited to the County if the high bidder refuses to close the sale after the bid has been approved by the Board of Commissioners.

- 4. After the auction, the high bid for the property shall be reported to the Board of Commissioners. The Board of Commissioners will accept or reject the bid within 30 days after the bid is reported to it. No sale may be completed until the Board of Commissioners has approved the high bid.
- 5. The Board of Commissioners reserves the right to withdraw any listed property from the auction at any time before the auction sale of the property.

Agenda Item #9: SOCIAL SERVICES - MONTHLY ADMINISTRATIVE UPDATE:

Algernon McKenzie, Social Services Director, delivered the following Monthly Administrative Update.

During the month of December, we did not have an agency staff meeting, however, staff was informed of the new tax forms each employee needed to complete by January 3, 2014. These forms were provided to all staff. This information was shared and explained during our monthly Department Heads Meeting with Mr. Clark.

The Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP) began on December 2, 2013. We are continuing to assist those individuals who meet the guidelines. On February 1, 2014, this program will open up to individuals not in the initial target group.

On December 12, 2013, I attended our Executive Directors Meeting in Raleigh. During this meeting, issues were discussed with NCFAST that continue to cause counties to have delays in processing recertification changes and applications for Food and Nutrition recipients. The NCFAST team is continuing to work on solutions and admits the help desk is backlogged with help tickets (problem cases) submitted by county staff. Our Directors Association is concerned with the loss of staff, overdue applications and delayed benefits to citizens. We have asked the NCFAST team to slow down on adding additional programs, i.e., Medicaid; until more testing is done and system issues are resolved.

We were also informed around 70,000 children would be transferred from NC HealthChoice to Medicaid by December 20, 2013. This will be an automatic transfer by DHHS – Medicaid Division.

Columbus County is still behind, but workers continue to work hard to process cases as timely as possible. Two workers were lost during the month of December. One retired and one went to

another county. Their caseloads have been divided among the remaining workers.

During the month of December, the Day Care Unit was able to begin contacting families from our Day Care List. This is due to the fact we received some Smart Start Funds from the Partnership for Children and our spending levels for subsidy has decreased. Response has been good for those contacted; however, some of those contacted are not able to pay the parent fee or are no longer in need of assistance.

During the month of December, we had six applicants on the waiting list for SA In-Home services and all of the 30 slots allocated to DSS were full. The Adult Services Supervisor, Sandra Shaw, put in a request to the Division of Aging and Adult Services for 10 additional slots. On December 18, 2013, we received notice those additional slots were approved. This program helps adults who are in need of services that could possibly keep them in their homes; (i.e., personal care services, bathing, cooking, etc.)

Vacancies/Updates/News for December 2013

Intake/Investigation/Assessment:

The Intake/Investigation/Assessment Unit continues to have a Social Worker on limited duty, but otherwise, is fully staffed.

In-Home Services:

The In-Home Services Unit bid farewell to its Supervisor, Karen Thurman, upon her retirement December 20th. Otherwise this Unit is now fully staffed.

Foster Care/Adoptions:

The Foster Care/Adoptions Unit had a successful Christmas outing for the Foster Children at Planet Fun in Shallotte on December 20th. Fun was had by all.

Adult Services:

The Adult Services Unit currently has a worker on medical leave.

Work First Employment:

None.

Child Day Care:

The Child Day Care Unit continues to work on decreasing its waiting list due to budget adjustments that have allowed more children to receive daycare.

Program Integrity:

On December 2nd applications for the Low Income Energy Assistance Program began. This program targets households that have at least one person 60 years of age or older or a person receiving SSI/SSA/VA benefits and active services from the Division of Aging and Adult Services. As of the end of December 31st, 635 applications have been completed with 588 approvals. Duke Energy Progress Assistance Funds have been exhausted. Crisis Intervention Program applications continue to be taken on a case-by-case basis with 68 applications completed during the month of December with 66 approvals.

News/Updates/Vacancies

Universal Intake, Triage and Processing

NC FAST has hindered workers from getting applications approved in the system. It still remains with many glitches. Help desk tickets are being sent everyday to try to get the workload completed. Applications that we are trying to approve for Medicaid for Pregnant Women are allowing us to approve in the system but the next morning we find that the system did not accept it in the nightly batch. Workers are very frustrated trying to get the work completed. With all the slowness of the computers system we are taking applications back to back and receiving mail-ins and getting applications thru E-Pass. There are currently 90 applications at the "Marketplace" waiting to be sent to us. The system is not prepared to send these applications to us, but when they do, these 90 applications will be sent all at once. Workers are struggling to learn other program and new policy that came along with the Affordable Care Act. These trainings are web based. There are 5 positions open with these 2 units; interviews have been completed and 3 have been recommended for hire.

The Triage Unit still remains busy seeing walking clients.

Food and Nutrition/Adult Medicaid/Family and Children's Medicaid

The Food and Nutrition review team have been in the NC FAST system for more than a year now. They "hard launched" December 2012 and have all cases converted except for the backlog they are working to catch up on. Once Medicaid came onboard with NC FAST it caused problems with Food and Nutrition cases. This unit has 3 vacancies at the present time.

The State decided to automatically extend certification periods for certain programs in Family and Children's Medicaid so they have been helping key Food and Nutrition Recertification and have helped with taking applications. This unit has 1 vacancy.

Clients receiving under the Adult Program of Medicare Qualified Beneficiaries, "E" category are clients that only get their Medicare Part B premium paid. The Federal Government has not approved this program for the year 2014 but the State decided to continue to fund this program thru January 31, 2014 until a decision is made. If this program is not funded these recipients in this category will have to start paying their own monthly Medicare Part B premium of \$104.90. The Federal Government also approved a 1.5% cost of living increase to Social Security and Veteran recipients effective January 1, 2014. This unit has 1 vacancy but has interviewed and recommended someone for hire.

Work First Family Assistance/Cash//Medicaid Transportation & Supportive Services

Work First has begun to enter direct deposit information into the NC FAST system so when we hard launch with this program, clients will automatically get their benefits deposited directly into their bank accounts. If they do not have a bank account, their benefit will deposit on an EBT card for them to use just like Food and Nutrition recipients.

Medicaid Transportation submitted our July logs to Division of Medical assistance for review; this is a process all counties have to go thru.

Housekeeping and maintenance continues to keep our building clean.

Child Support

Child Support prepared 317 cases for court. This unit has 2 vacancies.

Paralegal

Our paralegal completed 227 orders and 203 Certificates of Service (attachments to orders). She also reviewed 10 orders and 12 Certificates of Service (attachments to orders) that were completed by the Attorney.

Agenda Item #10: MAINTENANCE - DEPARTMENTAL UPDATE:

Tony Soles, Maintenance Director, delivered the following departmental update to the Board.

- 1. Since the last Maintenance Department update in November, 2012, we have completed over 2,000 computer generated and phoned in work requests which is down from 2,600 in the previous 14 months.
- 2. Continually perform monthly maintenance on 165 HVAC systems, 140 exit lights, and 177 emergency lights, and numerous load centers.
- 3. Custodial staff cleans just over 204K sq. ft. in county facilities daily up form 199K sq ft in 2012.

NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS:

- 1. Parking lots at DSS and the Cooperative Extension/Soil and Water/Farm Services facilities have been sealed and re-striped.
- 2. Minor renovation work at the Board of Elections to accommodate work center upgrades.
- 3. Researched, procured and installed package and parcel x-ray scanners in the Columbus County Courthouse.
- 4. Replaced the awning covers on the Tax/Register of Deeds Offices.
- 5. Installed concrete stoops and wheelchair ramp on the west end of the DSS facility.
- 6. Countless hours of preparation for our most recent Surplus Sale.

ENERGY EFFICIENCY

- 1. Completed lighting retrofit project at the Cooperative Extension/Soil and Water/Farm Services facility (waiting on rebate).
- 2. Installed programmable thermostats on all compatible HVAC systems.

HALLSBORO PROJECT:

Commissioner Prevatte: stated the following:

- 1. Mr. Fowler, I spoke to you earlier today about the shortage of residents for the Hallsboro Project;
- 2. The News Reporter stated that we were six (6) short and how many are we short?; and **Danny Fowler:** As of 5:00 P.M. today, we are seven (7) short.
- 3. In some of the correspondence that we got, can you explain to the public why it is not finished, and why the numbers keep changing?

Danny Fowler: the numbers changed because Leo Green, our engineer, said that the schools could count for six (6) or seven (7) each. He called the State and they do not count as six (6) or seven (7), they count as one (1) each. That was the difference in the numbers. Actually, the way the State and Leo is wanting to do this is to combine the numbers from our original District IV in Delco and these numbers. That is the way they are coming up with these numbers. We got to have eight hundred fifty-two (852) customers, and as of today, at 5:00 P.M., we had eight hundred forty-five (845) customers with the two (2) areas combined.

Discussion:

Commissioner Byrd: So, that includes the thirty (30) from last week

Danny Fowler: It is actually thirty-three (33).

Acting Chairman McKenzie: Do we have a deadline? What is the deadline, Gail?

Gail Edwards: We got to certify that we have these customers before we can bid the project, and that will take about ninety (90) days to get everything ready to bid.

William S. Clark: We can't go to bid if we don't' have one hundred twenty-five (125). That is what the State has told us.

Local Resident: The remaining seven (7) customers that is needed should be in the bag by the end of the week.

Commissioner Byrd: We have some people that live a great distance from the highway where the water line will run, and are concerned about the cost of running the water lines to the houses. I have agreed to buy a trencher and make it available to those people in that area to trench from the County water line and their house.

Commissioner Bullard: I have a question for the attorney. Do you need to look at these lists of names and make sure we can collect from those customers for the next five (5) years if that water system goes in?

Mike Stephens: They need to sign that Agreement, and it is in the Agreement that they will pay for the next five (5) years.

Commissioner Bullard: I want your verbal consent that everything is in line before we get ready to vote on it. I want you to look at it and make sure that there are no mistakes.

Commissioner Prevatte: I want to go back over these numbers. The last time we met, these two (2) schools stood for seventeen (17).

Danny Fowler: You can forget that.

William S. Clark: What Leo Green did, is he went to Acme Delco Elementary School, and looked at the amount of water usage, and that is where he came up with seventeen (17). He presented it to the State, and they said no. That is why that number has gone away.
