LOYALTY DAY PROCLAMATION MAY 01, 2015

WHEREAS, Loyalty Day was first observed in 1921 as "Americanization Day": to counterbalance Labor Day on May Day (May1), celebrated in other parts of the world; and

WHEREAS, on May 01, 1930, about 120,000 Veterans of Foreign War members staged a rally at New York's Union Square to promote patriotism; **and**

WHEREAS, through a resolution adopted in 1949, May 01 evolved into Loyalty Day; and

WHEREAS, observances began on April 28, 1950, and climaxed on May 01 when more than five million people across the nation held rallies; **and**

WHEREAS, on July 18, 1958, the Congress designated May 01 of each year as Loyalty Day (Public Law 85-529) to foster loyalty and love of the country; **and**

WHEREAS, Loyalty Day is a special day for the reaffirmation of loyalty to the United States and for the recognition of the heritage of American Freedom; and

WHEREAS, the President is requested to issue a proclamation -

- (1) calling on United States Government officials to display the flag of the United States on all Government buildings on Loyalty Day; **and**
- (2) inviting the people of the United States to observe Loyalty day with appropriate ceremonies in schools and other suitable places.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED that we, the Columbus County Board of Commissioners, proclaim May 01 as Loyalty Day in Columbus County for 2015 and in all pursuing years.

Agenda Item #7: PROCLAMATION - ELDER ABUSE AWARENESS PROCLAMATION:

Algernon McKenzie, Social Services Director, is requesting Board approval and adoption of the following Elder Abuse Awareness Proclamation..

ELDER ABUSE AWARENESS MONTH Proclamation

WHEREAS, elder abuse is the broad term used to identify mistreatment of elderly and disabled adults; and

WHEREAS, abuse and neglect of elderly and disabled adults is one of the most under recognized and under reported social problems in this country; and

WHEREAS, the magnitude of the problem is likely to increase for several reasons, especially with the anticipated rise in the number of elderly population; **and**

WHEREAS, mistreatment can take many forms: physical abuse, emotional abuse, sexual abuse, neglect by a care giver, self neglect, exploitation, and financial exploitation; and

WHEREAS, between five hundred thousand (500,000) to five million (5,000,000) people suffer elder abuse every year; **and**

WHEREAS, it is estimated that approximately one (1) out of every fourteen (14) cases of elder abuse is reported; and

WHEREAS, abuse of the elderly is preventable.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED, by the Columbus County Board of Commissioners that May 19, 2015 through June 21, 2015, be recognized as **"ELDER ABUSE AWARENESS"** in Columbus County, and that all residents and other jurisdictions are encouraged to become more aware of this problem and join in the prevention of elder abuse.

Agenda Item #8: SOCIAL SERVICES - MONTHLY ADMINISTRATIVE UPDATE:

Algernon McKenzie, Social Services Director, delivered the following Monthly Administrative Update for March, 2015.

On March 4, 2015, we held our agency staff meeting. During this meeting, staff was given information about our health insurance; United Healthcare; not reaching an agreement with Columbus Regional. Staff was also reminded about the pre-diabetic class to be held for county employees March 10, 2015.

During this meeting, I explained the importance of staff completing day sheets correctly with the appropriate codes for services provided. This is how we are able to get reimbursed for salaries and meet required funding expenditures.

I also informed staff March 1-7 is Severe Weather Preparedness Week. We talked about what to do in the event we should have a tornado during work hours. Staff should enter the inner hallway and sit on the floor and cover their heads. Staff should not be near windows or doorways; due to glass shattering and flying objects. Staff was encouraged to download free weather apps to get severe weather alerts.

On March 4, 2015, I met with the Program Managers to discuss some personnel issues and give them some updates.

On March 10, 2015, I attended a Gang Focus Coalition meeting at the Whiteville City Schools Board. This group is working on ways to keep children from joining gangs and keep them in school. This was a very interesting meeting.

On March 12, 2015, I attended the Directors Executive Board Meeting in Raleigh. During our meeting, we talked about the progress made with Medicaid re-certifications and application processing. We were encouraged to make every effort to get cases processed timely, as much as possible.

We were also informed of some possible changes to the Child Care policy in the near future.

We learned the enrollment period for the Affordable Care Act will be extended until April 15, 2015.

On March 24, 2015, we were visited by our Operational Support Team representatives. During this visit, we talked about Medicaid, Food & Nutrition and Work First issues with NCFAST. We asked this team for more system training for staff; because the webinars are not addressing all areas. During this meeting, we also discussed staff turnover, the Medicaid backlog and Food & Nutrition re-certifications. We were told the State would be holding meetings for Supervisors to assist with questions, problems and some training, as well, in the near future.

On March 30, 2015, Deana Hatcher, Accounting Specialist and I, met with Mr. Clark and Bobbie Faircloth to present the 2015-16 DSS Budget. During this meeting, we also discussed the need for additional office space and possible options to explore was given.

Vacancies/Updates/News for March 2015

Intake/Investigation/Assessment:

The Intake/Investigation/Assessment Unit is finally fully staffed. An additional position has

been allocated by the state due to caseload numbers. That position has been advertised and interviews will begin soon. March numbers were much higher than previous months, particularly in the areas of reports accepted and cases open at the end of the month.

In-Home Services:

The In-Home Services Unit is lost a Social Worker at the end of the month. This worker was one of the newest staff members. She was accepted a position at another agency for approximately \$10,000 more than her salary here.

Foster Care/Adoptions:

The Foster Care/Adoptions Unit continues to be fully staffed and up to date on training. This Unit continues to prepare for the 2nd annual Adoption Gala coming up in April. This event celebrates those that have adopted children!

Adult Services:

The Adult Services Unit continues to be fully staffed. There were several staff members in March that attended various trainings pertaining to their job functions. There were three reports made to the District Attorney/Law Enforcement and one report made to the Division of Health Service Regulation. There were also two requests to assist with Guardianship.

Work First Employment:

The Work First Employment Unit continues to attempt to work within the NCFast system. However, due to a lack of access and a lack of available training by the state, this is proving to be very difficult. Because of NCFast the Unit continues to be unable to report information regarding participation rates.

Child Day Care:

The Child Day Care Unit continues to work with families that are being affected due to recent policy changes. After some clarification, families in Columbus County will not be as negatively affected as originally expected at this time. However, those cases coded child welfare services will be allowed to continue to receive day care services until June 30, 2015 or until their next scheduled review. At that time families will have to meet the eligibility requirements outlined in policy, which may require fees.

Program Integrity:

Program Integrity is again concentrating on Program Integrity, increasing collection numbers, and bringing cases up to date. Collections greatly increased in March, mainly due to tax refund intercepts.

Reporting Month: March 2015 News/Updates/Vacancies

Food and Nutrition Program:

There are many misconceptions about who receives Food and Nutrition Benefits. In order to receive benefits individuals must be a US citizen or be a Lawful Permanent Resident (An alien who is legally admitted to the US to live and work on a permanent basis) for 5 years. If an individual is a Lawful Permanent Resident and has 40 qualifying quarters of work (which is 10 years) and his/her spouse comes to the US and is a Lawful Permanent Resident for less than 5 years, that spouse can qualify off of the spouse that has the 40 qualifying quarters. If an individual or couple is not legal in the US but their children are born in the US, their children are US citizens and the children are eligible for benefits. There are very few exceptions to the 5 year waiting period. These benefits are deposited on an EBT card and only certain items can be purchased. Not only are Food and Nutrition benefits deposited on the EBT card, but our clients Work First and Special Assistance payments are also deposited on that SAME EBT card unless the client has it directed to a bank account. Clients can spend their Work First and Special Assistance money however they like. They may buy food from the Food and Nutrition money and buy their beer and cigarettes from their Work First or

Special Assistance money off of the same EBT card at the grocery store. If stores have not updated their debit machines to where a client can access both sides of their money, they cannot do this at a store; the client will have to go to the bank to gain access to their Work First money. Food and Nutrition applications must be processed within 30 days or 7 days if the household's gross monthly income is below \$150.00 and total liquid resources are below \$100.00 or if the household's combined monthly gross income and liquid resources are less than the household's rent or mortgage and utilities. We are fully staffed in this department; however three are still in training.

Work First Family Assistance:

Work First is a program that is a monthly cash payment for families with children who are low income. This program is known as TANF at the national level. Benefits for Work First are also deposited on an EBT card if the client does not have it directly deposited to a bank account and can be used however the client wishes to use this money. This program is limited and Work First participant must complete a Mutual Responsibility Agreement each month before receiving their benefits. This means participants in the program have a set amount of hours they must be looking for work or participating in working before they can get their benefits, unless this is good cause. This program is to ensure that Work First families are moving steadily toward self-sufficiency.

Adult Medicaid:

Adult Medicaid consist of Medicaid for the Aged, Blind and Disabled. All three categories have an income and resource limit that must be met before they are eligible. The Aged category is anyone 65 or older; if they are over a certain income limit then they have to meet a deductible every 6 months. The Disabled category is anyone that is under 65 and disabled by State guidelines. Clients that come in and are not disabled and make a Medicaid application; also has their disability established or denied at the same time. Paperwork is sent to Raleigh to determine if they are disabled; if their disability is denied we must automatically deny their Medicaid. The Blind category is anyone who has been declared blind thru the State also. If clients are eligible in any of these programs and receive Medicare, Medicaid also pays for their monthly Part B premium. All of these programs must consider a client's resources; which consist of all liquid assets, life insurance policies that accrue cash value, property, and vehicles. We have 1 vacancy and 2 in training in this unit.

Adult Medicaid also pays for a client to be in Rehab or Nursing Home; in a Rest Home or on the Community Alternative Program (CAP). The CAP program is special Medicaid for individuals in their home who are at risk of institutionalization.

Family and Children's Medicaid:

This program has many categories also but it is Medicaid to Families with Dependent Children. It not only covers the children but will cover the parents as well. A child is defined as anyone under 21 years of age. Children that receive in this program with only one parent in the household are automatically referred to Child Support for medical insurance on that child from the absent parent. If the parent and child receives the referral to child support must be for medical insurance and child support from the absent parent. If the parent that is on Medicaid does not cooperate with Child Support for all information about that absent parent, they cannot received Medicaid.

The Family Planning Waiver Program also falls under Family and Children's Medicaid. This program is for men, ages 19 through 60 and women, ages 19 through 55, to receive family planning services only. It only pays for annual check-ups for family planning and birth control.

Breast and Cervical Cancer Medicaid is a program of medical assistance for women enrolled and screened for breast and cervical cancer through the Health Department. If this cancer is diagnosed at a doctor's office, it will not pay for medical bills associated with the cancer.

Medicaid Transportation:

This program pays for transportation to and from medical providers including picking up prescriptions from the pharmacy for recipients eligible under certain Medicaid programs. This transportation is for non-emergency medical appointments and we must arrange and pay for the transportation. When the client has access to a suitable mode of transportation, but lacks the means to use it, the county must assist with the means through gas vouchers or mileage reimbursements. When the client lacks both means and mode, the county is responsible for arranging transportation at a cost within allowable Medicaid regulations. This is where we contract with companies to provide that transportation. We have many clients that are unable to transport themselves to and from the doctor that use our contracted companies. Medicaid only pays for transportation by the

least expensive mode available and appropriate for the client; to the nearest appropriate medical provider and only for a Medicaid covered service provided by a NC enrolled Medicaid provider.

Child Support/Paralegal:

Our Child Support Unit get referrals from both Medicaid programs and the Work First Program as well as anyone that walks in and states they want our help with the paternity and/or child support for them. If they are not on services at DSS, there are minimal filing fees. This program is to ensure that both parents are responsible for the support of their children to the best of their ability. Our agents help locate the absent parents, establish the paternity of the child(ren) and petition the court to order child support. During this time every year, we collect more payments due to being able to intercept the absent parent's tax refund. We have 4 court dates each month. For the month of March we prepared 331 cases for court. We currently have 2 vacancies in this unit. Our paralegal prepares the majority of child support orders. She prepared 320 orders and reviewed

Our paralegal prepares the majority of child support orders. She prepared 320 orders and reviewed 48 orders the attorney had prepared.

Agenda Item #9: PARKS AND RECREATION - DEPARTMENTAL UPDATE:

Julie Strickland, Parks and Recreation Director, delivered the following departmental update to the Board.

- 1. **Projects:** excess of 100 completed porojects at 16 sites;
- 2. **Maintenance:**\
 - -Maintenance of fields and necessary replacement of bases and pitching rubbers at 21 athletic fields:
 - -Repaired wooden bleachers at several sites, installed aluminum bleachers at 2 parks;
 - -Installed/replaced approximately 4,500 linear feet of wire fencing and over 2,500 linear feet temporary fencing
 - -Mowed approximately 5,500 acres of grass; and
 - Maintained approximately 250 acres of land mass 29 sites;
- 3. **Fence:** Installed/Replaced wire fencing, terminals, post, gates and temporary fence at 13 sites;
- 4. **Bleacher Program:** Transported 140 sets of bleachers for use at festivals, programs and/or events open to the public;
- 5. **Programs Sponsored and/or Facilitated:**
 - -45 Programs; and
 - -15,000 Attendance/Participants;
- 6. **Community Involvement:**
 - 200+ Meetings/Trainings/Workshop
 - 757 Volunteers with over 6,000 hours;
- 7. **Loaner Equipment Program:** 25 Events/Programs;
- 8. Maintenance and upkeep of approximately \$2 Million of recreational assets;
- 9. Riegelwood Community Center rented 63 times in last 12 months, \$6,000 Revenue; and
- 10. Seven (7) staff members with over one hundred (100) years of recreation experience.

B. Board of Commissioners;

1. **Commissioner McDowell:** stated the following:

- A. Last Thursday, I was called to conduct a District 5 Meeting in Raeford, and this is just a summary of what we did:
 - -Seven (7) counties were there and we discussed concerns we had;
 - -The unfunded mandates that are being passed down was the number 1 item of concern;
 - -Second was the sales tax re-distribution allocation;

- G. We should take some of that liquidated damage dollars and take care of safety for our citizens; **and**
- H. We have went from a 19,000 to 42,000 square feet Courthouse.

3. **Commissioner Russ:** stated the following:

- A. I agree with what has been said; and
- B. With the old Courthouse, we need to hire someone outside the County to oversee what is being done.

4. **Vice Chairman Bullard:** stated the following:

- A. There are dangerous issues at Williams Township School in getting on and off of Highway 701;
- B. I would like for you to ask Drew Cox to do a study of this area to see if a stop light needs to be installed;
- C. I agree with the safety issues at the new Courthouse; and
- D. With the old Courthouse, we need to inform all people to what is going to be

5. **Commissioner Byrd:** stated the following:

- A. Safety at the Courthouse was always the main concern of all seven (7) Board members:
- B. Most of the shrubbery at the Co-operative Extension Building is dead and needs to be addressed;
- C. I am getting a lot of complaints from the ramp builders, they are not getting any communication from the Department of Aging, and this needs to be addressed:
- D. We have had a problem with traffic at Hallsboro-Artesia School and
- E. Mr. Clark, we need to find out what is going on at the Department of Aging.
- 6. **Commissioner Prevatte:** I received an e-mail from Amber Harris about the redistribution of the Lottery funds and I want us to do a resolution.
