**Proposed Amendment to Columbus County Abandoned Structure Ordinance -** the purpose of the Public Hearing is to receive oral and written comments from the public.

# **PUBLIC HEARING OPENED:**

At 6:00 P.M., Chairman Giles E. Byrd called the Public Hearing to order and stated the Public Hearing was for the Proposed Amendment to the Columbus County Abandoned Structure Ordinance. The purpose of the Public Hearing is to receive oral and written comments from the public. Chairman Byrd requested that Michael H. Stephens, Columbus County Attorney, orally read the Policy on Comments at Public Hearings. Mr. Stephens orally read the policy in its entirety.

# **<u>COMMENTS</u>**:

Chairman Byrd opened the floor for comments. The following spoke.

# Commissioner Prevatte: stated the following:

- 1. At the last meeting, I requested that classic or antique cars be added to this amendment, and it has not been added;
- 2. This could be a tractor or piece of equipment also;
- 3. I have been informed this information will be included in a junkyard ordinance that you are working on, but you will not find classic cars and/or classic equipment in junkyards;
- 4. This could easily be a barn find and junkyards are very different from an abandoned structure; **and**
- 5. A classic car and/or classic equipment need to be exempt in the Abandoned Structure Ordinance.

# Gary Lanier, Planning Director: stated the following:

- 1. After we start the process, there are six (6) months to devaluate; and
- 2. We need to be allowed to clean the site.

# Commissioner Bullard: stated the following:

- 1. In my area, there is a spot located near a church that needs cleaning up; and
- 2. There are two (2) houses within one-half mile of my house and the person that inherited this property is in the military, and the grass is growing, and I would like to know how you plan to handle a situation of this nature.

**Gary Lanier:** replied stating the structure has to be declared as an abandoned structure for this to apply.

Commissioner Prevatte: You can define what a classic car is by looking at the State DMV website.

# PUBLIC HEARING CLOSED:

At 6:23 P.M., Commissioner Bullard made a motion to close the Public Hearing, seconded by Commissioner Burroughs. The motion unanimously passed.

# **PUBLIC HEARING OPENED:**

At 6:30 P.M., Chairman Giles E. Byrd opened the Public Hearing and stated the Public Hearing is for the revisions to the Columbus County Economic Development Incentive Grant Policy, and the purpose of the Public hearing is to receive oral and written comments from the public. Chairman Byrd requested that Michael H. Stephens, County Attorney, orally read the Policy on Comments at Public Hearings. Mr. Stephens orally read the policy in its entirety.

# **COMMENTS**:

Chairman Byrd opened the floor for comments. The following spoke.

# Terry Mann, 203 Elm Street, Whiteville, NC 28472: stated the following:

- 1. I am here tonight as the Mayor of Whiteville and a property owner in downtown Whiteville;
- 2. To give you a little background, before Tom Stanley passed away, Director of the Whiteville Downtown Development, he approached the City Manager and myself about trying to do some kind of inventive program that we could use to work with some of the old and empty buildings downtown;
- 3. It would give someone an incentive to buy a building and do something with it;
- 4. We worked on this program, we had several meetings, and then Tom Stanley passed away and it got put on the side, and we were fortunate enough to find Gene Merritt out of Wilmington who was interested in continuing Tom's work, so we started the meetings back up, and finally adopted a plan about six (6) months ago;
- 5. If the building is purchased at \$10,000 and the owner spends \$50,000, then the owner will pay taxes on the \$10,000, for 5 years at the \$0.51 cents city tax rate; **and**
- 6. We are asking the County to adopt this plan at their tax rate of \$0.805.

# Commissioner Bullard: stated the following:

- 1. This is a good plan for the City of Whiteville; **and**
- 2. This plan should be county wide because there are a lot of mom and pops businesses that need this to help their investments.

Chairman Byrd: This plan needs to be county wide and include the farmers also.

**Commissioner Burroughs:** stated it was his interpretation that in order to qualify, the properties would have to be within the identified areas.

# **DISCUSSION/COMMENTS/QUESTIONS:**

- 1. Application to municipal service areas;
- 2. Does this apply to existing buildings or new buildings, or both?;
- 3. If interested in participating, you will have to have a business plan under Whiteville's plan rules;
- 4. Lowering the amount of the investment to \$25,000 to qualify;
- 5. Developing an incentive policy for businesses separate and apart from industry;
- 6. Availability be made county wide and not only to municipal service areas; and
- 7. The vote and action on this matter needs to take place after all the changes have been made to separate the industry incentive policy, the business incentive policy and to make the policy to be county wide.

# John Thompson, 505 North Madison Street, Whiteville, NC 28472: stated the following:

- 1. I have just purchased 15,000 square feet downtown;
- 2. I will be spending one-half million dollars in remodeling;
- 3. There will be six (6) apartments upstairs and a business downstairs, and I will have five (5)

employees; and

4. With this incentive, it will help me float the taxes, insurance and overhead for five (5) years.

#### **PUBLIC HEARING CLOSED:**

At 6:57 P.M., Commissioner Bullard made a motion to close the Public Hearing, seconded by Commissioner Burroughs. The motion unanimously passed.

# Agenda Item #6: <u>PUBLIC INPUT</u>:

Chairman Byrd opened the floor for Public Input. No Public Input was received either orally or written.

# Agenda Item #7: <u>HEALTH - UPDATE ON HOME HEALTH</u>:

Kimberly L. Smith, Health Director, delivered the following update on Columbus County Home Health.

- 1. We did hire an experienced Home Health nurse, and after starting employment, due to illness, she took a leave of absence;
- 2. The existing Home Health nurse was doing PR calls;
- 3. Theresa Smith, Director of Home Health and I talked, and with the patient load of one hundred fifty-six (156) patients, we did not see the need for hiring the two (2) full-time people;
- 4. You did receive a report showing a three hundred ninety thousand, one hundred thirty-four and 35/100 (\$390,134.35) dollars loss for Home Health; **and**
- 5. This is going to get worse, because reimbursement is still going down, and Medicare and Medicaid has again mandated that the reimbursement go down.

# **DISCUSSION/COMMENTS/QUESTIONS:**

- 1. Two (2) additional employees were not hired for Home Health, as directed by the Board;
- 2. Daily visits have not been made by the PR employee;
- 3. The Home Health patient load is at 156;
- 5. Medicare and Medicaid reimbursement has gone down and may continue to go down;
- 6. The need for Home Health to be transferred to the hospital;
- 7. Keeping Home Health for another year as originally discussed;
- 8. Hiring a full-time marketing person and keeping Home Health until Christmas to see which direction it will go in financially;
- 9. Why is out-of-county Home Health agents getting some of the county Home Health patients and Columbus County is not?; **and**
- 10. Take the legal steps necessary to start the process of transferring Home Health.

# **MOTION:**

After lengthy and in-depth discussion, Commissioner Burroughs made a motion to take the appropriate legal steps to put Home Health out for bid for sale or lease, seconded by Commissioner Bullard.

A roll-call vote was taken with the following results:

- AYES: Chairman Byrd, Vice Chairman McDowell, Commissioners Bullard and Burroughs; and
- **NAYS:** Commissioners Prevatte, McKenzie and Russ.

The motion passes on a four (4) to three (3) vote.

# COLUMBUS COUNTY ABANDONED STRUCTURE ORDINANCE AMENDMENT

# AMENDMENT NO. 6 – <u>Section 504 Enforcement, add "Section 504.1</u> Nuisance Conditions and Junked or Nuisance vehicles; removal authorized.

Upon notice issued to the owners of any abandoned structure as herein defined, it is also determined that any of the following conditions or any combination thereof, are found to be present or exist within (150') one hundred fifty feet of said abandoned structure, such notice shall include an order to also remove, remedy or otherwise abate such conditions by the imposed deadline as related to the removal, remedy or abatement of said structure or structures.

- 1. Any grass, weeds or similar noxious vegetation having an overall height of more than eighteen (18") inches above the surrounding ground within an area of approximately one hundred fifty (150') feet in any direction of an abandoned structure.
- 2. An open place, collection, or concentration of mattresses, boxes, paper, garbage, trash, refuse, old clothes, rags, automobile parts, tires or rims, furniture, stoves, refrigerators, appliances, cans and containers, household goods, plumbing or electrical fixtures, old rusty metal, or other similar items.
- 3. A collection place for lumber, bricks, blocks, nails, building hardware, roofing materials, scaffolding, masonry materials, electrical supplies or materials, plumbing supplies or materials, heating and air conditioning supplies or materials or any other type of old or unusable building supplies (especially those with nails, staples or sharp objects and edges) or other similar items.
- 4. Any junked or nuisance vehicle that found to exist on the property of an abandoned structure as defined herein;
  - (A) Junked motor vehicle: As authorized and defined in G.S. 153A-132.2, the term junked motor vehicle means a vehicle that does not display a current license plate lawfully upon that vehicle and that:
    - (1) Is partially dismantled or wrecked; or
    - (2) Cannot be self-propelled or move in the manner in which it originally was intended to move; or
    - (3) Is more than five (5) years old and appears to be worth less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00).
  - (B) Nuisance vehicle: A vehicle on public or private property that is determined and declared to be a health or safety hazard, a public nuisance, and unlawful, including a vehicle found to be:

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- (1) A breeding ground or harbor for mosquitoes, other insects, rats or other pests; or
- (2) A point of heavy growth of weeds or other noxious vegetation which exceeds eighteen (18") inches in height ; or
- (3) In a condition allowing the collection of pools or ponds of water; or
- (4) A concentration of quantities of gasoline, oil, or other flammable or
  - explosive materials as evidenced by odor; or
- (5) An area of confinement which cannot be operated from the inside, such as, but not limited to, trunks or hoods; or
- (6) So situated or located that there is a danger of it falling or turning over; or
- (7) A collection of garbage, food waste, animal waste, or any other rotten or putrescent matter of any kind; or
- (8) One which has sharp parts thereof which are jagged or contain sharp edges of metal or glass;
- (9) Any other vehicle specifically declared a health and safety hazard and a public nuisance by the County Board of Commissioners.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the date of its adoption.
