Minutes of last meeting being read and approved, the following business was transacted:

Ordered: That J. M. Patterson be refunded tax on one-half acre of land valued at \$500.00 in Whiteville Township for 1929, 1930 & 1931, on account of land being listed by Loula Davis.

Ordered: That Luther Sellars be discontinued from the Outdoor Poor list.

Ordered: That the Note for \$6,000.00 dated April 12th, 1932, issued to pay part teachers salaries for Extended Term be cancelled and destroyed.

Ordered: That the Bonds owned by Columbus County and deposited in N. C. Bank & Trust Company for safekeeping be registered in the records of Columbus County. The Chairman and Clerk are requested to have said Bonds registered.

Ordered: That B. J. Simmons be given ninety days to redeem his property in Lees Township sold by County for taxes.

Ordered: That salary due J. R. Marks for teaching school be applied when paid on 1931 taxes due the County by A. H. Marks and that an order be given by J. R. Marks directing such transaction.

Ordered: That Clemmie Simmons, Old Dock, N. C., be allowed \$5.00 present relief and \$5.00 per month.

Ordered: That Mrs. T. J. Potters twenty-eight acres of land in Chadbourn Township be valued at \$1375.00 and that the taxes for 1930 and 1931 be separated so she may pay taxes for said years. The 1930 and 1931 taxes were listed in the name of J. C. Lennon.

Ordered: That Robert Pierce be allowed \$1.50 present relief and \$1.50 per month.

Ordered: That Jack Skipper be allowed \$2.00 present relief and \$2.00 per month.

Ordered: That the County pay not exceeding \$25.00 to build a voting place in Welches Creek Township.

Ordered: That petition presented by various parties for discontinuing certain offices be filed for consideration at a later date.

Ordered: That for a valuable consideration Columbus County hereby transfers its bid to L. R. Hobbs on land of Elizabeth Powell and husband, E. Powell.

Ordered: That \$50,000.00 Columbus County Note dated January 26, 1932, now in the North Carolina Bank & Trust Company made payable to BEARER at Waccamaw Bank & Trust Company and held by North Carolina Bank and Trust Company placed there by Waccamaw Bank & Trust Company as security for deposits in the said Waccamaw Bank & Trust Company be released,

and in lieu thereof renewal notes dated April 25, 1932, in the sum of \$50,000.00 be placed with said North Carolina Bank & Trust Company in place of the said \$50,000.00, note.

Whereas, certain citizens of Columbus County, and more particularly of Williams Township, have asked the Board of County Commissioners to recommend to the North Carolina State Highway Commission to take over, maintain and repair the five-tenths of one mile connecting a link of the "Ten Mile Hill Road" and Chadbourn and Tabor Highway intersecting at I. J. Spivey's home on the Chadbourn and Tabor Highway, said road being used for a mail route and school bus; and

Whereas, this Board deems it an important road and a saving to the state and county on school bus expense to maintain this short route:

Now, therefore, Be It Resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Columbus County that the State Highway Commission be requested to take over and maintain the said road above described; and

Be It Further Resolved that a copy of this resolution, together with the petition filed with this Board, be sent to the State Highway Commission in Raleigh, and a copy of this resolution be recorded on the minutes of this Board.

Whereas, certain residents and citizens of Tatum Township, Columbus County, have asked the Board of County Commissioners of Columbus County to recommend to the State Highway Commission that the said State Highway Commission take over and maintain a certain road known as the Robeson and Evergreen Lumber Company road, which begins on the Bladenboro and Evergreen Highway at Mack Lennon's and runs in an Easterly direction to the Bladenboro and Chadbourn Highway, a distance of about two miles; and

Whereas, this Board deems the said road a necessary and important one and one serving from twelve to fifteen families living on said road and which is used to travel to a school and church:

Now, therefore, Be It Resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Columbus County that the State Highway Commission be requested to take over and maintain the said road above described; and

Be It Further Resolved that a copy of this resolution together with the petition filed with this Board, be sent to the State Highway Commission in Raleigh, and a copy of this resolution be recorded on the minutes of this Board.

Whereas, the Board of County Commissioners of Columbus

County has been requested by petition of certain citizens of Columbus County to ask the State Highway Commission to take over and maintain a piece of road leading from State Highway #202 near Ned B. Yates' farm, running Southward to a road leading to Grist Station to Chadbourn, N. C.,; and

Whereas, said road was built by the Township Road Commission at a considerable cost and the said road would be a great benefit and an outlet to a large number of people:

It is now, therefore, resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Columbus County that the State Highway Commission be requested to take over and maintain the above described road; and

Be it further resolved that a copy of the petition submitted to the Board, together with a copy of this resolution, be sent to the State Highway Commission, and a copy of the resolution recorded on the minutes of this Board.
