IN WITNESS WHEREOF the County of Columbus has caused its corporate name to be signed hereto by the Chairman of its Board of County Commissioners and the corporate seal to be hereto affixed and attested by the Clerk to the Board of County Commissioners, this September 16, 1932.

Ordered: That Robert L. Hilburn, disabled World War Veteran, be granted license free to peddle in Columbus County for a period of thirty days.

Whereas, certain citizens and taxpayers of Columbus County have petitioned the Board of County Commissioners of Columbus County to request the State Highway Commission to take over and maintain the old Chadbourn-Peacock Road leading from the Chadbourn-Tabor Highway Southwest to the Peacock Road at V. P. Sellars' place, extending on to the Sellars' road which leads from the Whiteville-Tabor Highway into the Peacock Road:

Whereas, a large number of citizens of the Counties of Columbus, Bladen and Pender have petitioned the Board of County Commissioners of Columbus to request the State Highway Commission to make improvements on a highway already existing, or to construct a new highway from a point on State Highway # 21 about two miles West of Acme in Columbus County to a point on the South bank of the Cape Fear River opposite Canetuck Landing; and

Whereas, said citizens have also requested that the State Highway Commission construct and place in operation a cable operated ferry between Canetuck Landing and the terminus of above described road; and

Whereas, said road and ferry would be a great benefit in particular to the people of Columbus, Bladen and Pender Counties:

Now, therefore, Be It Resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Columbus County that the State Highway Commission be requested to either take over the old road or construct a new road as above described and place in operation a ferry sufficient to take care of ordinary traffic; and

Be It Further Resolved that a copy of this resolution together with the petition submitted to this Board be sent to the State Highway Commission and a copy recorded on the minutes of this Board.
