Minutes of the last meeting being read and approved, the following business was transacted:

Ordered: That taxes due on 11 acres of land in Bolton Township listed in the name of J. J. Harvey be separated from other taxes so said taxes on the 11 acres may be paid by Z. V. Jones, now owner of the land.

Ordered: that the 700 acres tract of land valued at \$8600.00 listed in the name of J. L. Ripple in Ransom Township, be separated as follows: 218 acres valued \$2700.00 And 482 acres valued \$5900.00. This separation is being made so mortgagees may pay their part of taxes.

Ordered: that the 49 $\frac{3}{10}$ acres tract of land listed by D. A. Burney Est. and sold to Cooper River Timber Company be valued at \$400.00 so said Company may pay their part of taxes.

Ordered: that H. D. Tedder be allowed a refund for paying 1932 Poll Tax on account of his being a disabled world war veteran.

Ordered: that Mary Boone be allowed \$2.00 present relief and \$2.00 per month.

Ordered: that Jennie Connor be allowed \$1.00 present relief and \$1.00 per month.

Ordered: that J. N. Bullard be allowed to pay taxes on \$1000.00 valuation for 1932 listed in the name of Mrs. Neta Lawson. Said J. N. Bullard being owner of one lot valued at \$1000.00.

Ordered: that M. J. Morgan be allowed \$1.50 present relief and \$1.50 per month.

Ordered: that number of acres in Ode Todd tax list in Waccamaw Township be changed from 3 acres to 2 acres.

Ordered: that number acres in S. W. Andrews tax list in Cerro Gordo Township be changed from 23 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres to 20 acres.

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Ordered: that W. M. Sibbett be allowed \$2.00 present relief and \$2.00 per month.

Ordered: that Annie Roberson be allowed \$1.50 present relief and \$1.50 per month.

Ordered: that in view of the Town of Whiteville having opened a street through the property listed in the name of Cleveland Smith, that all taxes against said property through 1932 be cancelled.

Ordered: that no changes be made in order passed May 31, 1933 as to Home Demonstration offices. All commissioners being present and voting therefor.

Ordered: that D. T. Lawson be appointed as County Home Keeper at a salary of \$75.00 per month.

Ordered: that Mary Allen be placed on outside poor list at \$2.00 per month.

Ordered: that George E. Dombhart & Company be given contract for auditing County records from December 1, 1932 until June 30, 1933 at the price of \$650.00. Said contract subject to the approval of the Board of County Commissioners, which is to ^{be} submitted later.

Ordered: that Henry Frank be allowed an exemption order from paying Poll tax during his disability.

Ordered: that D. L. Gore, tax collector, be authorized and instructed to collect Privilege tax on out of county and out of State Dry Cleaning and Laundry businesses operating in this county.

Ordered: that the Board of Health vouchers be signed.

The following business was transacted:

Ordered: that every person, firm, or corporation doing dry cleaning and/or pressing and/or hat blocking and/or laundry work or renting towels, shall pay the county the sum of \$50.00 per annum provided, however, this shall not apply to such persons, firms, or corporations with their places of business in Columbus County.

Ordered: that Bank of Columbus Bondsmen indebted to Columbus County on Notes and mortgages by reason of being such bondsmen, shall be allowed to pay the principal amount of said notes now owing, and the interest shall be waived, provided, however, settlement is made by October 1, 1933.

Ordered; that Collins Department Store be refunded sum of \$1.57 and Tax Collector use check now in his hands.

Ordered: that George E. Dombhart & Co. contract be signed to audit County books from December 1, 1932 to June 30, 1933, which includes settlement with Tax Collector on first Monday in October 1933, at a price of \$800.00.
