Ordered: that every person, firm, or corporation doing dry cleaning and/or pressing and/or hat blocking and/or laundry work or renting towels, shall pay the county the sum of \$50.00 per annum provided, however, this shall not apply to such persons, firms, or corporations with their places of business in Columbus County.

Ordered: that Bank of Columbus Bondsmen indebted to Columbus County on Notes and mortgages by reason of being such bondsmen, shall be allowed to pay the principal amount of said notes now owing, and the interest shall be waived, provided, however, settlement is made by October 1, 1933.

Ordered; that Collins Department Store be refunded sum of \$1.57 and Tax Collector use check now in his hands.

Ordered: that George E. Dombhart & Co. contract be signed to audit County books from December 1, 1932 to June 30, 1933, which includes settlement with Tax Collector on first Monday in October 1933, at a price of \$800.00.

Ordered: that contract be signed with T. A. Uzzell & Co. of Greensboro to refund \$175,000.00 County Bonds maturing next five years approximately

Ordered: that all persons, firms, or corporations now owing Columbus County on the fund known as the "Bank of Columbus Bondsmen" be allowed to pay the principal sum of their original notes and mortgages, waiving all interest payments, as provided in House Bill 1665, 1933 Session of the General Assembly. In the event any of the mortgagors, or any person for them, have paid any amount on their said notes secured by mortgages, and the said amount has been credited as interest, the records shall be changed so as to credit such payment on the principal amount of said notes, and when the balance due on the principal amount has been paid in full, then said notes and mortgages are to be properly cancelled.
