Ordered: that Fannie Warren be allowed \$1.50 present relief and her allowance be increased to \$4.00 per month.

After Mr. H. D. Browning Jr., Secretary, had delivered the favorable report from the Board of County Commissioners to the effect that they had approved request for funds for the erection of new schools, additions to old school buildings, all as requested by this Board on May 27th, and having reported that the Commissioners voted to include necessary funds to erect a consolidated school building to take care of the needs of the Old Dock-Nakina School District, provided the way is clear.

Resolved that the Board of Education of Columbus County finds as a fact that erection of a school building adequate to house the school children of the Old Dock-Nakina School District is necessary, in order that six months school term, as provided by the Constitution, may be efficiently operated, and we respectfully request that your Board of County Commissioners of Columbus County provide funds necessary for this project, in the amount of \$45,000.00.

After having re-surveyed the needs of the County schools with respect to additional class rooms and the need of other physical equipment, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

" Resolved that the Board of Education of Columbus County after carefully checking over the school needs of said county as presented to the Honorable Board of County Commissioners on May 27th, 1935, begs leave to request that the additional sum of five thousand (\$5,000.00) Dollars be included in the project for the Tabor City Schools (as presented to the said Board by the said Board of Education on May 27th, 1935) in order that two additional class rooms may be added to the said Tabor City project."

"We find as a fact that this additional class room space is a necessary expense in order that a six months school term may be operated economically, adequately, and efficiently as provided by the Constitution."
