APPLICATION RESOLUTION

Resolution No. 1

A resolution authorizing Columbus County, North Carolina, to file an application to the United States of America through the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works for a loan and grant to aid in financing the construction of thirteen public school projects for Columbus County, named and described in Exhibits A to M, inclusive, herewith attached, and designating A. W. Baldwin, Clerk to Board, to furnish such information as the Government may request.

Be it resolved by the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County, North Carolina:

Section 1. That A. W. Baldwin, Clerk to the Board, be and he is authorized to execute and file an application on behalf of Columbus County to the United States of America for a loan and grant to aid in financing the construction of thirteen public school projects for Columbus County, named and described in Exhibits A to M, inclusive, herewith attached.

Section 2. That A. W. Baldwin, Clerk to the Board, be and he is hereby authorized and directed to furnish such information as the United States of America through the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works may reasonably request in connection with the application which is herein authorized to be filed.

APPLICATION FOR LOAN AND GRANT

The Board of Commissioners of Columbus County, North Carolina, (herein called the "Applicant"), hereby makes application to the United States of America through the Federal Emergency Administration of Public Works (herein called the "Government"), for a loan and a grant for the purpose of aiding in financing the construction of thirteen (13) Public School projects for Columbus County, North Carolina, named and described in Exhibits A to M, inclusive, (herein called the "Project") the total cost of which is estimated to be \$301,000.00.

In the event this application is approved and the Government offers to assist in financing the construction of the Project, the Applicant, if it accepts such offer, will sell its obligations in an amount which, together with the grant, will, in the judgement of the Applicant and the Federal Emergency Administrator of Public Works, be sufficient to construct the Project, such obligations to be secured in such manner, to bear interest at such rate, to be in such form, to be payable at such time or times and at such place or places, to be in such denominations and to have such registration privileges as may be satisfactory to the Applicant and to said Administrator.

It is expressly understood that if the Government makes the above requested loan and grant, the Applicant, in accepting such loan and grant proceeds, in expending the same, and in carrying out the construction of the Project, will abide by all the rules and regulations prescribed by the Government.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Applicant has caused this application to be duly executed in its name, this the 17th day of June, 1935.

Exhibits from A to M as follows:

Exhibit A: Williams Township Consolidated School, to be located in Williams Township, Columbus County, North Carolina, on ~~the~~ site selected by County Board of Education and approved by authorized representative of State Board of Education. This building to be of brick and frame construction, containing twenty three classrooms, auditorium, office, library, sanitary plumbing system, steam heat, electric lights, furniture, equipment and purchase of site. Total complete cost - \$75,000.00

Exhibit B: New Hope School, to be located in Whiteville Township, Columbus County, North Carolina, on site to be selected by County Board of Education and approved by authorized representative of State Board of Education. This building to be of brick and frame construction, containing ten classrooms, auditorium, office, library, sanitary plumbing system, steam heat, electric lights, furniture, equipment, and purchase of site. Total complete cost - \$30,000.00.

Exhibit C: Hallsboro School, located in Bogue Township, Columbus County, North Carolina, on present site and adjacent to present school building. This building to be of brick and frame construction, containing three classrooms, library, two sanitary toilet rooms and septic tank, steam heat, electric lights, furniture and equipment. Total complete cost - \$12,000.00.

Exhibit D: Whiteville High School, to be located in the Town of Whiteville, Columbus County, North Carolina, on site to be selected by County Board of Education and approved by authorized representative of State Board of Education, site already owned by the County. This building to be of brick and frame construction containing fourteen classrooms, gymnasium, office, library, four sanitary toilet rooms, steam heat, electric lights, furniture and equipment. Total complete cost - \$60,000.00.

Exhibit E: Old Dock-Nakina School, to be located in Lees Township, Columbus County, North Carolina, on site to be selected by County Board of Education and approved by authorized representative of the State Board of Education. This building to be of brick and frame construction, containing fourteen classrooms, auditorium, office, library, sanitary plumbing system, steam heat, electric lights, furniture, equipment and purchase of site. Total complete cost - \$45,000.00.

Exhibit F: Tabor City School addition and repairs, located in Tabor City, Columbus County, North Carolina, on present site, to be an addition to present one story school building. The addition to be of brick and frame construction, containing six class rooms, extension of heating plant, electric lights, furniture and equipment. Addition and repairs to old two story brick building to include two steel fire escapes, approved by State Insurance Department, two sanitary toilet rooms, steam heat, and repairs to old building. Total complete cost - \$20,000.00.

Exhibit G: Chadbourn Agriculture and Home Economics building, to be located in the Town of Chadbourn, Columbus County, North Carolina, on present school site. This building to be of brick and frame construction, containing agriculture classroom and shop, and two home economics rooms, steam heat and electric lights. Total complete cost - \$9,000.00.

Exhibit H: Evergreen School addition, to be located in Tatum Township, Columbus County, North Carolina, on present school site, being an addition to the present Evergreen two story school building. Addition to be of brick and frame construction, containing two classrooms, two sanitary toilet rooms, extension of steam heat and electric lights, furniture and equipment. Total complete cost - \$7,000.00.

Exhibit I: Acme-Delco School, located in Ransom Township, Columbus County, North Carolina, on present school site and adjacent to present school building. This building to be of brick and frame construction, containing one gymnasium room, two locker and shower rooms, and electric lights. Total complete cost - \$5,000.00.

Exhibit J: Fair Bluff School building to be located in the Town of Fair Bluff, Columbus County, North Carolina, on present school site. Agriculture building to be of brick and frame construction, containing agriculture classroom and shop, extension from old building of steam heat and electric lights. Steam heat plant and two sanitary toilet rooms for old building. Total complete cost - \$12,000.00.

Exhibit K: Western Prong Consolidated School, to be located in Western Prong Township, Columbus County, North Carolina, site to be selected by County Board of Education and approved by authorized representative of State Board of Education. This building to be of brick and frame construction, containing four classrooms, auditorium, office, library, steam heat, electric lights, two sanitary toilet rooms, furniture, equipment and purchase of site. Total complete cost - \$12,000.00.

Exhibit L: Guideway School addition, located in Bug Hill Township, Columbus County, North Carolina, on present school site. Two classrooms addition of brick and frame construction, extension of present steam heat plant and electric light system, furniture and equipment. Total complete cost - \$5,000.00.

Exhibit M: Cerro Gordo Agriculture and Home Economics building, to be located in Cerro Gordo Township, Columbus County, North Carolina, on present school site. This building to be of brick and frame construction, containing agriculture classroom and shop, and two home economics rooms, steam heat and electric lights. Total complete cost - \$9,000.00.
