The above note bearing interest at the rate of six (6%) per-cent per annum, interest payable at maturity; both principal and interest of said note payable to BEARER at the Cabarrus Bank and Trust Company, Concord, N. C. in anticipation of a Bond issue and that said note be sold or hypothecated and the proceeds thereof turned into the General Fund of said County of Columbus.
