RESOLUTION OF BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF COLUMBUS

COUNTY ACCEPTING COUNTY HOME BUILDING

SEPTEMBER 24, 1937

The Board of Commissioners of Columbus County met on September 24th, 1937 for the purpose of making final inspection of the New County Home Building at Whiteville. The following members being present:

Mr. J. E. Williams, Resident Engineer Inspector, and Mr. C. F. Churchill, Travelling Engineer Inspector, and Leslie N. Boney, Architect, were also present.

Mr. Avant, the Chairman, called the meeting to order, and stated that the object of the meeting was to accept the New County Home building.

Mr. Boney reported to the Board that each of the three contracts, the General Contract, Heating contract and the Plumbing contract, had been completed in accordance with plans, specifications and the contract documents, and to the satisfaction of the Government Engineers and to the Architect, and recommended that these contracts be accepted as complete.

The following resolution was proposed by R. C. Benton:

"Resolved: that the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County, following the recommendation of the Architect, accept the three contracts, the General contract, the Heating contract and Plumbing contract, as complete, and immediately take over the building and make immediate plans to move the inmates from the old County Home building into the new building."
