1. Subject to the terms and conditions (PWA Form No. 230 as amended to the

date of this offer) which are made a part hereof the United States of America, hereby offers to aid in financing the construction of a hospital building, including necessary equipment the acquisition of necessary land and the improvements of grounds [herein called the "Project"), by making a grant to the County of Columbus, North Carolina (herein called the "Applicant"), in the amount of 45 percent of the cost of the Project upon completion, as determined by the Federal Emergency Administrator of Public Works (herein called the "Administrator"), but not to exceed, in any event, the sum of \$45,000.00.

2.
