Ordered: that J. Q. Piver be allowed an exemption order from paying Poll tax on account of his being a World War Veteran drawing compensation.

Ordered: that S. C. Oliver be allowed to trade the old Allen adding Machine from his office.

Ordered: that B. S. Thompson be allowed to pay on J. K. Council's note and mortgage to Columbus County, \$1,000.00 at once and \$1,000.00 on September 15th, 1939, and the balance due on September 15th, 1940.

Ordered: that J. E. Rooks be allowed to peddle newspapers in Columbus County without buying license on account of his being a Spanish-American War Veteran.

Ordered: that J. N. Coburn's three (3) notes in the sum of \$3,288.00 secured by V. E. Smith's notes and mortgage for \$2,000.00 and Leonard Carter's notes and mortgage for \$2,900.00 as additional security to his notes be accepted in settlement of J. A. Baldwin and wife notes and mortgage. Said notes of J. N. Coburn due as follows: \$1,000.00 due Sept. 15, 1939, \$1,000.00 due Sept. 15th, 1940 and \$1,288.00 due Sept. 15th, 1941, plus interest.

Being the road leaving the State Highway #701 between the land of O. Z. Faircloth and J. R. Spivey, and entering the Clarendon Road between the land of S. P. Faircloth and F. F. Edge Estate, being a distance of one and one-half miles:

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Columbus County that the State Highway and Public Works Commission be and it is hereby requested to take over and maintain said road; and,

Being a section of road leading from Pieway and Tabor Road at or near D. L. Spivey's

residence, and running near a West course to the State line at or near Dexter Fowler's residence, and being a distance of about one mile:

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Board of County Commissioners of Columbus County that the State Highway and Public Works Commission be and it is hereby requested to take over and maintain said road; and,

RESOLUTION
