

The Honorable Board of County Commissioners met in their said office March 31, 1944, according to adjournment. Members of the Board present:

The following business was transacted.

Ordered: that J. H. Gainey be allowed to settle taxes due of Mary J. Knowles, Ransom Township, on a per annum valuation of \$265 at \$1.34 rate, at par plus excepting years 1937, 1938, 1939, 1940 and 1943 which are to be paid regular 6% ~~per~~ and; it is further ordered that a non-suit be taken on suit started.

Ordered: that 8 acres of county farm be allocated to the Federal Government for the location of a war prisoner site.

Ordered: that the 1944-1945 Old Age Assistance budget as presented by the Welfare Board be approved.

Ordered: that the Aid to Dependent Children budget for 1944-1945 as presented by the Welfare Board be approved.

Ordered: that funds not to exceed \$1200 be set up for the purpose of purchasing boilers for various schools in the county by the School Fund, and said amount to be reimbursed by the School Fund out of the 1944 school budget.

Ordered: that General County voucher for \$95.23 be paid to the tax collector for taxes charged against him on Riley T. Freeman, Bolton Township for years 1935, 1936, 1937, 1941, 1942 and 1943, as Riley T. Freeman tax deed has been settled and all taxes paid to date in said sale.

Ordered: that the recommendation and appointment of Archie Rushing as electrical inspector of Columbus County by Mr. N. E. Cannady, State Electrical Inspector, be approved.

On motion, meeting was adjourned until Monday, April 3, 1944.
