The following business was transacted:

The Honorable Wendell Prescott, Mayor of Lake Waccamaw, appeared before the Board to discuss the effect the Friar Swamp Project could have on the Lake Waccamaw Area. He stated the people of said area would like clearance from State officials assuring that the project would not adversely affect the Lake. No further action was taken on this business at this meeting and no decision was made on the loan to the Friar Swamp Project.

Ordered: that Dr. J. R. Black be appointed to serve as county official to supervise and direct the removal and reinterment of graves in accordance with G.S. 65-13 (g).

Ordered: the the resignation of Connie Ray Campbell, Asst. County Agent, be accepted with regrets. Mr. Campbell is advancing to Forage Research in Salisbury, N. C.

Ordered: that the property valuation listed in the name of H. G. Walters, Bogue Township, be reduced from \$4320 to \$2160 due to a clerical error in listing lots in Block D at the value of lots in Block A.

Ordered; that the information requested by John C. Lennon, representative from Financial Security Agency, be provided so he may present a proposal for various insurances to county employees.

Ordered: that the bond for Beasley Strickland be approved as to form for Mr. Strickland to serve as Treasurer of Gapway Drainage District effective 11-20-71.

Ordered: That Chairman Williamson be appointed to contact SENCland Community Action in trying to secure funds to aid GAPway Drainage District in sodding their canal.

Mr. Alton Edwards, Jerry Porter and Ronald Hunt, representing Riegelwood Fire District came to ask for a referendum for said District to set up a 10¢ levy to pay expenses for operation of the Fire District. The County Attorney will take the necessary steps to persue this action.

Mrs. Marie Suggs from the Red Cross office came to comment on the duties of the Red Cross and the Civil Defense in case of disaster. She asked for a meeting of several county and city officials to discuss this matter.

ROAD PETITION: Ranson Township - This road is a Dead End Road #SR1819. It is one mile in length and has 7 occupied homes located on it.

Ordered: that the Surety Bond for Mr. James C. Rabon be terminated on November 20, 1971.

The following resolution was unanimously passed with all members of the Board present. Commissioner H. J. Watts introduced the following resolution which was read:

RESOLUTION CREATING THE COLUMBUS COUNTY POLLUTION ABATEMENT AND INDUSTRIAL FACILITIES FINANCING AUTHORITY

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners for the County of Columbus:

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners has determined and does hereby declare:

(a) That under and pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 159A of the General Statutes of North Carolina (the "Act") the Board of Commissioners has filed with the Department of Conservation and Development of the State of North Carolina and the Local Government Commission of North Carolina notice of its intention to create, in accordance with the provisions of the Act, "The Columbus County Pollution Abatement and Industrial Facilities Financing Authority."

(b) That the County has determined to create said Authority in order to prevent, control and eliminate pollution in the County of Columbus and to alleviate unemployment, below average manufacturing wages and below average per capita income by maintaining employment at a high level and by creating, attracting and developing industrial facilities which provide job opportunities, higher skills and better wages than those prevalent in the County of Columbus.

Section 2. There is hereby created under and pursuant to the provisions of the Act a political subdivision and body corporate and politic of the State of North Carolina known as "The Columbus County Pollution Abatement and Industrial Facilities Financing Authority" (the "Authority").

Section 3. The Authority is hereby authorized to issue its bonds from time to time for pollution control purposes and industrial facility financing, pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of the Act, as it may in its discretion determine.

Section 4. The names and addresses of the first members of the Board of Commissioners of the Authority are, respectively, as follows, each of whom is a qualified elector and resident of Columbus County and each of whom shall continue in office for the term expiring on the date set opposite his name and until his successor shall be duly appointed and qualified:

A RESOLUTION PROPOSING AN ALTERNATE FOR I-40

WHEREAS, the southern area of North Carolina has marginal transportation route facilities with the Central Piedmont region; and

WHEREAS, a major ground transportation route connecting the Wilmington-Fayetteville axis with the Central Piedmont area is necessary for the movement of people, goods, and materials; and

WHEREAS, a transportation link (I-40) extending from Greensboro to Wilmington via Sanford and Fayetteville would open up the great economic potential between those points; and

WHEREAS, such a route of transportation would compliment and supplement the navigable water-way between the seaport city of Wilmington and the inland port city of Fayetteville; and

WHEREAS, other areas northeast of the Cape Fear River now possess existing or developing east-west transportation routes of a major nature; and

WHEREAS, the development of Southeast North Carolina is dependent upon arteries of transportation sufficient to carry the traffic which exists to the south and west of the Cape Fear River;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the North Carolina Highway Department be apprised of the transportation needs of Southeastern North Carolina and that the Department be strongly encouraged to construct a major traffic artery (I-40) extending from the Greensboro area to the Fayetteville-Wilmington complex.
