The following motion was made by Commissioner Johnson:

While I am conscious of the law in regard to re-apportionment, and realize that re-apportionment will be necessary in the future, there has been no demand by the citizens of this County for re-apportionment until now, and since the date for filing for County Commissioner has already begun and some candidates have already filed, I feel that it would be for the best interest of all concerned - the candidates and the citizens of our County - to postpone the final consideration of re-districting until at least two months after the general election as there are many ways in which re-apportionment can be done:

Changing of Districts under the present Zones

County-wide elections of all Commissioners

Election only from separate zones or districts

therefore, this is something that should be very seriously considered and not acted upon hastily.

Therefore, Mr. Chairman, I move that the Board of County Commissioners postpone the final consideration until February 1973, and that a committee of 5 be appointed by this Board to study all avenues of re-apportionment and to make a recommendation to the County Board of Commissioners as to the action they deem to be the best interest of all the citizens of Columbus County.

The foregoing resolution was not passed upon the count of votes as follows:

The following resolution was introduced by Commissioner Watts:

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County is one in which, by law, residence in an area less than the whole County is a condition of eligibility of candidates for a seat on the Board; and, Columbus County is presently divided into five (5) Zones or Districts as follows:

Zone 1, composed of Ransom Township  
Bolton Township  
Waccamaw Township

Zone 2, composed of Tatum Township  
Western Prong Township  
Welches Creek Township

Zone 3, Composed of FAir Bluff Township  
Cerro Gordo Township  
Chadborn Township

Zone 4, composed of South Williams Township  
Bug Hill Township  
Williams Township

Zone 5, composed of Whiteville Township  
Bogue Township  
Lees Township

That the 1970 census of Columbus County asserts the fact that citizens of Columbus County are denied equal representation on the Board of Commissioners because of the degree of differences in the population of the now existing election of resident areas, the population of the Zones and respective townships within the zones are as follows:

NOW THEREFORE, it is ordered that the heretofore existing Columbus County Commissioners resident zones or districts be changed by deleting Bogue Township from the now existing Zone or District 5, and adding it to the now existing Zone or District 2; that Lees Township be deleted from the now existing ~~from the now existing~~ Zone or District 5, and be added to the now existing Zone or District 1;

And that the following Districts or Zones be established

Zone 1	Ransom Township Bolton Township Waccamaw Township Lees Township
Zone 2	Tatum Township Western Prong Township Welches Creek Township Bogue Township
Zone 3	Fair Bluff Township Cerro Gordo Township Chadbourn Township

And, residence in these so established Zones or Districts or areas, is a condition of eligibility for candidacy for a seat on the Board of County Commissioners of Columbus County.

This resolution is made pursuant to North Carolina General Statutes 153-5.1 to 5.8, and is to become effective as of February 7, 1972.

Upon motion of Commissioner Horry J. Watts, seconded by Commissioner Roland Gore the above Resolution was put to a vote and was adopted by the following vote:

Before the final decision was made on reapportionment of Columbus County there were views and suggestions made by interested citizens from Bogue Township, Lees Township, and Republican Party Chairman of Columbus County, Marion Davis. Mr. Davis read a resolution expressing the desires of the Republican Party for reapportionment.

Ordered: that the following tax releases be made upon the recommendation of the Tax Supervisor.

Taxes listed in the name of Clara McNeill Milliken, Fair Bluff Township, be reduced \$12.15 for the year 1971 due to a clerical error

Taxes listed in the name of Sam Scott, Jr., N. E. Ellis and J. S. Singletary, Fair Bluff Township, be cancelled for the year 1971 due to double listing.

ROAD PETITIONS: Lees Township - This Road is known as Dutchess Forest Road. It is .6 mile in length and has 10 occupied homes located on it.

Western Prong Township - This road is North from Mt. Olive School joining the Pittman Road. It is 1.3 miles in length and has 6 occupied homes located on it.

Bogue Township - This is a deletion of S. R. 1734 beginning at a point .5 mile from Highway 74-76 and extending North .6 mile.

A resolution was read from the Town of Whiteville by the Chairman as follows:

BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Whiteville requests the County Commissioners to enter into a joint project with other municipalities within the county to work together to solve the land fill problem.

After the reading of the Resolution the following action was taken:

Ordered: that Edward W. Williamson be appointed as the member of the Board of Commissioners to work with the Health Department and appointed members by the Mayors of each municipalities within the County to solve the land fill problem.

Ordered: That E. W. Williamson be allowed to sign the contract to purchase two voting machines for South Whiteville Township after it has been reviewed by the County Attorney.

Ordered: that Allen Price, from Moore & Price CPA, be notified to come before the Board to discuss auditing for Columbus County at the next meeting of the Board in answer to his letter.

The Chairman stated that William S. Edmunds had resigned as a member of the Board of the Columbus County Pollution Abatement and Industrial Facilities Financing Authority, whose term expired November 1, 1975.

Upon motion made by Commissioner Burns, seconded by Commissioner Watts, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board accept the resignation of William S. Edmunds as a member of the Columbus County Pollution Abatement and Industrial Facilities Financing Authority, and hereby appoints John Purvis Stevens, who is a qualified elector and resident of Columbus County, who shall continue in office for the unexpired term expiring November 1, 1975, and until his successor shall be duly appointed and qualified.

The above appointed Commissioner is neither an officer or employee of the State of North Carolina or any Political subdivision thereof, or of any agency of either.

Mr Stevens, Commissioner herein appointed, on entering upon his duties shall take and subscribe to an oath to execute the duties of his office faithfully and impartially, and a record of such oath shall be filed with the Board of Commissioners.

The Clerk of the Board of Commissioners is hereby directed to file a certified copy of this Resolution with the Authority. This resolution is effective immediately upon its passage.
