

The Honorable Board of County Commissioners met in their said office at 10:00 a.m., May 7, 1973, it being first Monday.

The meeting was called to order and Commissioner Brown gave the invocation.

The following business was transacted:

Four members of the Hospital Board of Trustees and Mr. Ralph Rogers came before the Board to discuss the needs of the Columbus County Hospital. Following the discussion a motion was made by Commissioner Buffkin, seconded by Commissioner Burns and unanimously adopted to grant the request of the Board of Trustees to consider holding a Bond Election to erect a new hospital at the cost of \$7,000,000.00.

A motion was made by Commissioner Buffkin, seconded by Commissioner Currie for the Chairman to execute the contract for the Engineer to prepare forms requesting funds to extend the present airport runway 500 feet. The funds are to be available without cost to the County.

Ordered: that the Acting Medical Examiner be given a key to the Commissioners office so he may have access to a telephone when holding an inquest.

Ordered: that the Chairman sign the Bond release effective May 27, 1973 covering James Woodrow Duncan who will no longer serve as a Special Deputy.

Ordered: that the Clerk request the Library Board to submit an amended budget before a decision is made to transfer funds from the Library Savings Account to the checking account as these funds were not approved in the present budget.

Ordered: that Mr. Horace Shaw be paid through June 30, 1973 at his regular salary.

Ordered: that Chairman Williamson contact various agencies to set up the Manpower Council Program for the summer. The County has been allotted 39,600.00 to implement and carry out the program.

The following budget request were presented for consideration for the Fy1973-74:

Board of Education, Presented by J. Homer Thomas and the Board of Education.  
Rural Police Commission, Presented by Chairman Elkins and other Board Members  
Airport Budget, Presented by letter by L. R. Bowers.

Members of the Board of Health came before the Board to request additional space for the Health Department. The suggestion was to purchase a trailer at the present time and apply for funds through C. O. G. for a future building. They also asked for an additional acre of land to be given to the Health Department for future expansion. The Commissioners advised the Chairman of the Health Board to submit their request to be considered in the budget now being prepared.

Rabbi Kesner and Sargent Dudley requested funds in the amount of \$5,000.00 to be

given to the Columbus County Youth Service, Inc. to help establish a recreation center for the youth of the County.

RESOLUTION ENTERING INTO CONTRACT WITH ENGINEER TO EXTEND AIRPORT RUNWAY

This agreement, made in Whiteville, North Carolina, this the 7th day of MAY, 1973, by and between the County of Columbus, located in North Carolina, hereinafter called the Owner and Engineering Consultants of Florence, South Carolina, hereinafter called the Engineer.

WITNESSETH:

THAT WHEREAS, the Owner intends to improve his existing airport by paving a 500 foot by 75 foot extension and light the extension, and;

WHEREAS, the Owner desires that the Engineer provide his professional services for the above named construction work, and;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of these premises and of the mutual covenants herein set forth, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. The Engineer agrees to furnish and perform for the above named work professional services as follows:
  - a. Plans and specifications
    1. Make all necessary preliminary site investigations.
    2. Make all construction surveys necessary to prepare plans and specifications.
    3. Prepare preliminary construction plans and specifications.
    4. Prepare final plans, specifications, contract documents, and other data required for the project.
  - b. Supervision and Construction: Following adoption by the Owner of the final plans and specifications, and their approval by any Federal, State, or local agencies having jurisdiction over such matters, the Engineer will:
    1. Advise and assist the Owner in the selection of the contractor or contractors.
    2. Attend bid openings and prepare and submit tabulations of bids.
    3. Inspect the actual construction. This would include staking out the work for contractor(s), and resident inspection of the contractor(s) site preparation activities, except clearing and grubbing, and clearing, and resident inspection of the paving and lighting.
    4. General supervision of the Project will consist of periodic visits to the site by the Engineer to observe the progress and quality of the executed work and determine in general if the work is proceeding in accordance with the contract documents. The Engineer's efforts will be directed toward providing assurance for the Owner that the completed project will conform to the requirements of the contract documents; however, he will not be responsible for the failure of the contractor to perform the work as required in the contract documents.
    5. Resident Engineer is defined as a person who daily represents the Owner on the Project, acting as an agent of the Engineer, and monitors, in detail the work performed by the Contractor.
    6. Review contractor's requests for periodic payments and issue certificates authorizing such payments.
    7. Make any necessary reports required of the Engineer in connection with ~~with~~ any Federal grant and/or loan.
    8. Issue final certificates upon completion of all work, provided, however, that no final certificates will be issued without first consulting the Owner.
    9. Keep the Owner informed of the contractor(s) progress.
    10. Perform soil compaction testing during construction of fill areas up to the final 12" of subgrades by Engineer's forces. All other testing will be performed by a licensed testing company.
  - c. Post Construction Services: After the project construction has been completed, the Engineer will:
    1. Furnish the Owner with "As-Constructed" drawings by revising the tracings of construction drawings to reflect any changes that were made during construction..
    2. Advise and assist the Owner in the enforcement of all guarantees made by each contractor under the terms of his contract.

II. It is agreed by the parties hereto that the following services performed by the Engineer are not included in the basic fee hereinafter set out and, if performed, the Engineer would be entitled to additional compensation for such services as outlined.

a. All land and property line surveys and plats and topographical surveys required in the acquisition and/or clarification of any land and right-of-way easements and clear zones will be charged at the following rates:

(1) 2-man party	\$15.00 per hour
(2) 3-man party	\$20.00 per hour
(3) 4-man party	\$25.00 per hour
(4) Drafting	\$10.00 per hour

Travel of the party shall be on the Owner's time and mileage shall be charged at 12¢ per mile and other expenses such as meals and motel shall be charged at the actual invoice price.

b. Reproduction of drawings and other printing costs: It is understood that the Basic Fee hereinafter set out includes the furnished to the Owner of ten(10) sets of specifications and contract documents and that this subsection alludes only to reproduction of drawings and other printing costs in excess of these quantities.

Should additional sets of construction drawings be required, then the additional compensation for such drawings shall be at the rate of 8¢ per square foot. Should additional sets of specifications and contract documents be required, then the additional compensation for such sets shall be at the rate of 50¢ per stencil, plus 1¢ per sheet.

c. Advertisement Costs: These will be billed to the Owner at the actual invoice price charged by the newspaper.

d. Material or Equipment Testing: This includes all soil, asphalt, and concrete testing required and will be billed at the actual invoice price.

e. Services During Litigations: The time required will be billed to the Owner at the rate of Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars per 8-hour day. Partial days will be billed at the rate of Twenty-Four (24.00) Dollars per hour with a minimum charge for any one day of One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars. Travel shall be on the Owner's time and with travel and other expenses borne by the Owner.

f. Resident Inspection services needed past the time limit of the construction time allotted to the contractor(s) shall be at the rate of \$12.00 per hour plus expenses as enumerated in Item II-a. These monies will be taken from the monies withheld from the contractor(s) under liquidated damages as stated in the construction specifications ~~the specifications.~~

g. Engineering services needed past the time limit of the construction time allotted to the contractor(s) shall be at the rate of \$20.00 per hour plus expenses as enumerated in Item II-a. These monies will be taken from the monies withheld from the contractor(s) under liquidated damages as stated in the construction specifications.

h. If the Project is abandoned or indefinitely postponed by the Owner, prior to completion of the engineering work by the Engineer, the Owner shall pay the Engineer an amount equal to the sum of all out-of-pocket expenses, and "Payroll Costs," times 1.5

III. The Owner agrees to pay to the Engineer as compensation for such professional engineering services as Basic Fee amounting to fifteen (15%) per cent of the project construction cost. Of this fee, the design fee shall be twelve (12%) percent and three (3) % shall be general and resident inspection and as built drawings for the duration of the project. This Design Fee is payable as the services are performed in accordance with the following schedule:

- a. Upon approval of the preliminary plans, a total of fifty (50%) percent of the Design Fee times the estimated construction cost.
- b. Upon approval of the final plans, a total of seventy-five (75%) percent of the Design Fee times the estimated construction cost.
- c. Upon receipt of bids, a total of one-hundred (100%) percent of the Design Fee times the successful contractor or contractors bid price or prices.

The remaining three (3%) percent fee shall be payable as follows:

- a. Upon submission of the contractor or contractors monthly estimate, a total of ninety (90%) percent of the three (3%) percent fee times the amount of the completed work.
- b. Upon the completion of the supervision of construction and the post construction services, a total of one-hundred (100%) percent of the three (3%) percent fee times the actual amount of completed work.
- c. The Owner will make prompt payments in response to the Engineer's detailed statement for all services rendered under this agreement and for reimbursable expenses incurred. If the Owner fails to make any payment due the Engineer within sixty days after receipt of the Engineer's statement, therefor, the amounts due the Engineer shall bear interest at the rate of eight percent (8%) per year after said sixtieth day. No deduction shall be made from the Engineer's compensation on account of penalty, liquidated damages, other amounts withheld from payments to the Contractor, or sales taxes recovered by the Owner.
