

The Honorable Board of County Commissioners met in their said office at 10:00 a.m., February 3, 1975, it being first Monday.

The meeting was called to order and the invocation was give by Commissioner Brown.

The following business was transacted:

Ordered: that the minutes of the January 17th meeting be approved as recorded.

Ordered: that the Budget amendment request from the Board of Education be approved as filed with the Accountant and that the Chairman be authorized to sign the necessary forms to be filed with the State.

Ordered: that Billy Duncan write a letter to the State to request additional monuments be placed in Columbus County in the Geodetic Markers System which is now the sixth largest in the State. The County will assist in supplying the labor.

Ordered: that informal bids be obtained to purchase fire extinguishers and first aid kits for the County buildings. The bids are to be referred to the Chairman before any purchase is made.

Ordered: that a check for \$50.00 be written from the ODP Fund to Bill Burney for immediate relief.

Ordered: that the resignation of Mary Floyd, effective March 31st, be accepted with regret.

Ordered: that a letter be written to the Association of County Commissioners stating the opinion of the Board concerning the School Budget and Fiscal Control Act. The Board expresses their view as follows: We find the Act very little difference from the present practises of Columbus County Board of Commissioners and the Board of Education. Fiscal uniformity throughout North Carolina administrative units would have many desirable advantages, The Bill may have some objectionable changes which we have not detected and we would like for the Association to consider the pros and cons to determine if the Act would be best throughout the entire State.

Ordered: that a request be made to the Dept. of Transportation to add the road leading into the industrial site of Eaton-Towns-Yale to the State system. The road is approximately 875 feet in length leading off SR#1339 in Whiteville Township.

Ordered: that the following tax releases be made upon the recommendation of the Tax Supervisor:

That the 1974 taxes listed in the name of Herbert B. Fowler, Whiteville Township, be cancelled due to double listing.

That the 1974 taxes listed in the name of Jerald D. Mayes, Jr., Tatum Township, be released on the valuation of \$7,010. due to a house not being completed when listed.

That a refund check in the amount of \$12.83 be written to Peter & Esther Simmons, Rt. 4, Box 193, Whiteville, N. C., Less Township, for the year 1974 due to error in value on personal property.

The following Resolution supporting Revenue Sharing Program was unanimously passed by the Board upon motion by Commissioner Brown and seconded by Commissioner Marlowe:

WHEREAS, in 1972 Congress enacted legislation setting up a Revenue Sharing Program and has thereunder funded this program and has distributed to local governments throughout the nation monies which have been used generally for needed capital improvements and extended services; and

WHEREAS, the Revenue Sharing Program will expire in 1976 unless the 94th Congress sees fit to extend the effective date of said program and also provide funds for it; and

WHEREAS, Columbus County has already received over two million dollars in actual revenue payments; and

WHEREAS, much of the funds have been allocated to the public schools and community college in Columbus County for capital improvements; and

WHEREAS, the County has been able to establish, equip and operate a solid waste disposal system throughout the County from Revenue Sharing Funds, without an additional tax burden to local property owners; and

WHEREAS, plans are being formulated to establish a Day Care Center for exceptional children not included in other facilities; and

WHEREAS, towns within the County have likewise received monies to make capital improvements which were greatly needed; and

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County that additional improvements and services are needed and that the County cannot afford to increase the local tax rate at this critical time with unemployment at a high rate.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County respectfully request the continuation of the Revenue Sharing Program to help meet the needs of said County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution be sent to Senators Robert Morgan and Jesse Helms and Congressman Charles Rose.

Mr. Mills, District Engineer, DOT, Met with the Board and again requested that containers on the State right-of-way that are in dangerous locations be moved and permits be obtained for others that may remain on the right-of-way. The Chairman and Rhone Anderson are to meet jointly with Mr. Mills to correct this situation in the immediate future.

The Board discussed the Emergency Job Program and instructed the Accountant to choose a qualified person to be hired as a clerk to help administer the EJP as a temporary employee, and that all CETA employees be classified as temporary employees.
