- The Honorable Rex Gore, District Attorney, stated the following:
- I was very glad to hear the County Commissioners decided to keep the Manager Form of Government;
 - It was nice to hear the Board had established a full-time County Attorney position;
 - I think it was a nice move to hire a local person; **and**
 - I have worked with Mr. Varner in Brunswick County and he will bring vision and lots of energy to Columbus County.

Agenda Item #3: PRESENTATION - RE-CERTIFICATION of COLUMBUS COUNTY as STORM READY COUNTY:

Tom Matheson, National Weather Service, presented a certificate of re-certification to Columbus County as a Storm Ready County and stated the following:

- We are from Wilmington;
- Yesterday was the 9th anniversary of Hurricane Fran;
- Hurricane Hazel occurred on October 15, 1954;
- We started a much-needed program called Storm Ready which originated in Oklahoma
- There are six (6) points to remember in a good Storm Ready Program as follows:
 - Twenty-four (24) hour warning posted;
 - County to monitor conditions closely;
 - Have a good Emergency Services Director in place;
 - There are a number of ways for warnings to get rapidly relayed;
 - Weather radios to be situated around the county;
 - Conduct a number of community preparedness talks; **and**
 - Have a Hazard Weather Operations Plan in place.
- This is actually a re-recognition for Columbus County; **and**
- There are nine hundred (900) counties and communities to be recognized around the country.

Agenda Item #5: NORTH CAROLINA FOREST SERVICE - APPROVAL of AGREEMENT for the PROTECTION, DEVELOPMENT and IMPROVEMENT of FOREST LAND in COLUMBUS COUNTY:

Shane D. Hardee, District Forester, requested Board approval of the following Agreement for the Protection, Development and Improvement of Forest Land in Columbus County.

**AGREEMENT FOR THE PROTECTION, DEVELOPMENT AND IMPROVEMENT OF
FOREST LAND IN COLUMBUS COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA**

THIS AGREEMENT, made under authority of "An act to authorize Counties to cooperate with State in Forest Protection, Reforestation and promotion of Forest Management," (Section 113-59 of the general Statutes of North Carolina - 1943), and also under authority of another Section of the General Statutes, namely Section 113-54, by the North Carolina Department of Environment & Natural Resources (hereinafter Called the Department), party of the first part, and the Board of Commissioners of Columbus in the State of North Carolina (hereinafter called the Board), party of the second part, witnesseth:

That WHEREAS the said Board, recognizing the need for active forest protection, development, reforestation, management and improvement in Columbus County, has accepted the offer of the Department for cooperation in accomplishing this object:

Now THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants hereinafter set forth, the said parties contract and agree to maintain a legally appointed and equipped Forest Ranger organization in said county at the joint cost of the State and County, insofar as the joint funds will permit, as follows:

I. THE DEPARTMENT AGREES:

1. To select, employ and appoint, after consultation with the Board, a County Forester or County Forest Ranger for the purposes of controlling forest fires in said County; for detecting and extinguishing fires that break out; for investigating the origin of forest, woodland and field fires; for enforcing State forest fire laws; for taking such preventative measures, educational and otherwise, as shall seem necessary to prevent forest fires; for developing and improving the forests through reforestation promotion and practice of Forest Management practices; and for protection from insects and diseases.
2. To furnish to each Forester or Forest Ranger so employed a badge of office, stationery and report forms, instructional posters for use in the County, leaflets for distributing to landowners and others; to purchase necessary equipment, communication systems, and other Forestry improvements deemed necessary insofar as the joint funds will permit.
3. To pay the Forester or Forest Ranger for all official services rendered, at a fair rate of pay. Rates of pay are to be established by the Department in accord with existing State salary schedules.
4. To direct supervise, instruct, and inspect, through its agents, the work and conduct of the Forester or Forest Ranger, to discipline and, when necessary, discharge such Forester or Forest Ranger.
5. To submit to the Board of Commissioners monthly (or at other mutually satisfactory intervals) an itemized statement of all monies to be paid by the County and those paid by the Department for proper conduct of the work within said County.
6. To make available annually from State, Federal, and other funds allotted to it, the sum of one hundred forty-three thousand, two hundred twenty-seven dollars (\$143,277.00), as *it* share of an annual budget of \$358,066.00 for carrying the work in said County.

Part II. THE BOARD AGREES:

1. To pay to the Department 40% of the total cost of the Forester or Forest Ranger salaries and expenses and of other proper expenditures made in connection with the over-all Forestry program in said County, upon receipt and consequent approval of the periodic statements

submitted by the Department.

- 2. To appropriate annually the sum of one hundred forty-three thousand, two-hundred twenty-seven dollars (\$143,277.00) which sum shall be available for expenditure under the terms of this Agreement, and shall represent the County’s share of the annual budget.

Part III. IT IS EXPRESSLY AGREED AND UNDERSTOOD BY BOTH PARTIES:

- 1. That this Agreement becomes effective July 1, 2005.
- 2. That the annual appropriations as set forth above may be revised by mutual agreement between the Department and the Board, based on the amount of annual appropriation desirable for the proper conduct of the Forestry work, such revision to become effective at the beginning of a given Fiscal Year. Any unused balance of County funds remaining at the end of a Fiscal Year shall revert to said County unless otherwise mutually agreed upon by both parties.
- 3. That the Board reimburse the Department as provided in Part II, Item 1, by forwarding a county voucher drawn in favor of the Department for the amount of the County’s share of expenditures as set forth in the Department’s periodic statement to the Board. That such payments be made by the Board within thirty days following receipt of the Department’s billing.
- 4. That title to all improvements and equipment purchased and/or constructed in connection with this agreement will rest with the Department; such materials or their equivalent will remain in the County as long as this agreement is in effect, or as long as they are needed by the Department for the proper conduct of the work therein.
- 5. That the Forester or Forest Ranger periodically or at the request of the Board, shall present to the Board statements of the work being done within the County, so that said Board may be fully informed at the times regarding the Forestry finances and activities within the County.

Mr. Hardee stated the following:

- A problem arose yesterday in that the trucks did not arrive;
- The budget did not cover the cost of these trucks;
- The position I had requested was not approved by the General Assembly;
- We could use the money in the budget for this position to pay for the trucks; **and**
- I would like to thank the Health Department for their quick response in providing us with the required vaccinations we needed before we went to Louisiana.

Vice Chairman Godwin made a motion to approve the Agreement for the Protection, Development and Improvement of Forest Land in Columbus County, North Carolina, contingent on the approval of Steven W. Fowler, Columbus County Attorney, seconded by Commissioner Prevatte. The motion so carried.

Agenda Item #6: COLUMBUS COUNTY HUMANE SOCIETY - PERMISSION to REMOVE ANIMALS from COLUMBUS COUNTY ANIMAL SHELTER at no COST:

Morris Strickland, President of Columbus County Humane Society, requested Board permission to remove animals from the Animal Shelter, at not cost, for adoption of the same. Mr. Strickland stated the following:

- We would like to be exempt from the adoption fee that is being charged at the Animal Shelter. The eight to ten and 00/100 (\$8.00 to \$10.00) dollars could be use for paying the veterinarians in the treatment they need;
- Our goal is to acquire one (1) animal per week from the Animal Shelter;
- We got twelve (12) kittens and five (5) dogs from the Animal Shelter this year so far;
- All of our animals have been spayed or neutered;
- We are a non-profit organization;
- We totally depend on donations;
- When we acquire animals, we get them a checkup, and if sick, we get them treated before they are adopted out;
- We have twelve (12) foster houses that keep these animals;
- We screen the people who want to adopt our animals before we adopt them out;
- We do not sell the animals;
- There will be no liability to Columbus County; and
- Our adoption fee is fifty and 00/100 (\$50.00) dollars for cats and ninety and 00/100 (\$90.00) dollars for dogs.

Jim Varner, Interim Columbus County Manager, asked Rossie Hayes, Animal Control Officer, if the animals in the Animal Shelter were spayed or neutered before they were adopted out or euthanized. Mr. Hayes replied stating no they were not, they give a certificate to the person who adopts the animal to take to a veterinarian to do so.

Commissioner Prevatte asked Mr. Hayes how many animals were euthanized per year. Mr. Hayes stated that approximately two thousand eight hundred (2,800) animals were being euthanized.

Lengthy discussion was conducted relative to the advantages and disadvantages of allowing the Columbus County Humane Society to remove animals from the Animal Shelter at no cost.

Vice Chairman Godwin suggested that a compromise be reached for the Columbus County Humane Society be allowed to remove one (1) animal, at no cost, per week, for one (1) year to see how this will work.

Commissioner McKenzie made a motion to allow the Columbus County Humane Society to remove one (1) animal, at no cost, per week, for one (1) year to see how this will work, seconded by Vice Chairman Godwin. The motion so carried.

Agenda Item #7: AIRPORT - APPROVAL of BLOCK GRANT AGREEMENT AIR 21, Project Number: 36237.53.2.1:

Phil Edwards, Airport Director, requested Board approval of Block Grant Agreement, Vision 100, Project Number: 36237.53.2.1, in the amount of one hundred fifty and 00/100 (\$150,000.00) dollars, with a ten (10%) county match of sixteen thousand, six hundred sixty-seven and 00/100 (\$16,667.00) dollars. A copy of this document will be kept on file in Minute Book Attachments #2, "Exhibit A", in the Office of the Clerk to the Board for review.

Commissioner Memory asked Mr. Edwards what the situation of the aviation fuel at the Airport. Mr. Edwards replied the fuel was adequate but not plentiful and the price was three and 30/100 (\$3.30) dollars per gallon.

Commissioner McKenzie made a motion to approve the Block Grant Agreement, Vision 100, Project Number: 36237.53.2.1, contingent on the approval of Steven W. Fowler, Columbus County Attorney's, approval, seconded by Commissioner Memory. The motion so carried.

Richard Gore, Tax Administrator, requested Board approval of the Bankruptcy Pay-off Agreement for K-Mart.

Agenda Item #9: RESOLUTION - RESOLUTION of ADOPTION, COUNTY of COLUMBUS HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN:

Ronnie Hayes, Emergency Services Director, requested Board approval and adoption of the following Resolution of Adoption, County of Columbus Hazard Mitigation Plan.

**RESOLUTION OF ADOPTION
County of Columbus
Hazard Mitigation Plan**

WHEREAS, the citizens and property within Columbus County are subject to the affects of natural hazards and man-made hazard events that pose threats to lives and cause damages to property, and with the knowledge and experience that certain areas, i.e., flood hazard areas, are particularly susceptible to flood hazard events; **and**

WHEREAS, the County desires to seek ways to mitigate situations that may aggravate such circumstances; **and**

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of North Carolina has in Part 6, Article 21 of Chapter 143; Parts 3, 5, and 8 of Article 19 of Chapter 160A; and Article 8 of Chapter 160A of the North Carolina General Statutes, delegated to local governmental units the responsibility to adopt regulations designed to promote the public health, safety, and general welfare of its citizenry; **and**

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the State of North Carolina has in Section 1 Part 166A of the North Carolina General Statutes (adopted in Session Law 2001-214—Senate Bill 300 effective July 1, 2001), states in Item (a) (2) “For a state of disaster proclaimed pursuant to G.S. 166A-6(a) after November 1, 2004, the eligible entity shall have a hazard mitigation plan approved pursuant to the Stafford Act”; **and**

WHEREAS, Section 322 of the Federal Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 states that local government must develop an All-Hazards Mitigation Plan in order to receive future Hazard Mitigation Grant Program Funds, **and**

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Board of Commissioners of Columbus County to fulfill this obligation in order that the County will eligible for state assistance in the event that a state of disaster is declared for a hazard event affecting the County;

NOW, therefore, be it resolved that the Board of Commissioners of the County of Columbus hereby;

- Adopts the County of Columbus Hazard Mitigation Plan; and
- Vests the County Manager with the responsibility, authority, and the means to:
 - (A) Inform all concerned parties of this action.
 - (B) Cooperate with Federal, State and local agencies and private firms which undertake to study, survey, map, and identify floodplain or flood-related erosion areas, and cooperate with neighboring communities with respect to management of adjoining floodplain and/or flood-related erosion areas in order to prevent aggravation of existing hazards.
 - (C) Adjust the boundaries of Columbus County and the municipal planning jurisdiction whenever a municipal annexation or extraterritorial jurisdiction revision results in a change whereby the municipality assumes or relinquishes the authority to adopt and enforce floodplain management regulations for a particular area in order that all

Flood Hazard Boundary Maps (FHBMs) and Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) accurately represent current planning jurisdiction boundaries. Provide notification of boundary revisions along with a map suitable for reproduction, clearly delineating municipal corporate limits and extraterritorial jurisdiction boundaries to all concerned parties.

- Appoints the County Manager to assure that the Hazard Mitigation Plan is reviewed annually and in greater detail at least once every five years to assure that the Plan is in compliance with all State and Federal regulations and that any needed revisions or amendments to the Plan are developed and presented to the County of Columbus Board of Commissioners for consideration.
- Agrees to take such other official action as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the objectives of the Hazard Mitigation Plan.

Commissioner Norris made a motion to approve the Resolution by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Columbus, seconded by Commissioner McKenzie.

Commissioner Prevatte stated he had a problem with the utilization of The Adams Company for these grants, with emphasis being placed on the usage of high-range figures during the bid process, and stated there were several problems in the way this company handled the CHAF Program.

Commissioner McKenzie stated that in defense of The Adams Company, they set up a meeting with the State representative present to work out these problems.

Darren Currie, Assistant County Manager, stated the following:

1. This grant will be for six (6) rehabilitations and one (1) replacement;
2. You are dealing with forty to sixty (40-60) year old houses; **and**
3. You have extra costs for asbestos tests and lead-paint tests.

Commissioner Memory stated he had a problem with only seven (7) houses being done for four hundred thousand and 00/100 (\$400,000.00) dollars.

After additional discussion was conducted, a poll vote was taken with the following results:

AYES: Chairman Jacobs, Commissioners Memory, Norris and Dutton

NAYS: Vice Chairman Godwin, Commissioners Memory and Prevatte.

The motion passed on a four (4) to three (3) vote.
