Agenda Item #5: AGING - DEPARTMENTAL UPDATE:

Ed Worley, Aging Director, delivered the following Departmental Update to the Board:

1. We are heavily involved in the Prescription Program and it is going well;
2. We have saved one million, seven hundred seventy thousand, and 00/100 (\$1,770,000.00) dollars for the senior citizens through our Prescription Program from July 01, 2005 until the present time;
3. The Ensure Program is very strong, and we are saving the senior citizens thirty and 00/100 (\$30.00) dollars per case;
4. We are selling Ensure at the Whiteville Location and two (2) other locations;
5. Our Needy Program is very successful;
6. The exercise equipment we have is state-of-the-art;
7. The Columbus County Aging Department serves as a role model for the State;
8. Telephone calls are increasing relative to problems our senior citizens are having, and we try to handle all the ones we can;
9. For the first time ever, we had a wedding which entailed a gentleman eighty (80) years of age and a lady which is fifteen (15) years his senior;
10. We are very proud of our senior population; **and**
11. We really appreciate the support we receive from the Board of County Commissioners and Administration.

PROCLAMATION
by the COLUMBUS COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

WHEREAS, the County of Columbus is joining the Nation in declaring November as **Family Caregivers Month 2005** to honor and support the tremendous contributions family caregivers make every day; **and**

WHEREAS, **Family Caregivers' Month** spotlights the fact that most people who need care rely on family and friends for their support; **and**

WHEREAS, according to the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services, more than one in four adult Columbus Countians are caring for a person age 60 with almost one in two caring for someone with a memory disorder; **and**

WHEREAS, according to the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services, Columbus Countians who care for a person over age 60 join over 22.9 million American households providing personal assistance to adult family members or friends with a disability or chronic illness; **and**

WHEREAS, family care giving often comes with great personal sacrifice in terms of job and financial security, social life, and physical, mental and emotional health; **and**

WHEREAS, many businesses are realizing the value in providing support to employees who are family caregivers; **and**

WHEREAS, Columbus County's caregivers are diverse in their characteristics and circumstances but share the common goal of enabling their family member or friend to stay functioning in the community whenever possible; **and**

WHEREAS, according to the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services, the number of people age 70 and older who need assistance with activity limitations is expected to grow substantially during the next several decades as our senior population increases; **and**

WHEREAS, families should be able to enter into care giving with the knowledge and assurance that they can call upon the business, faith, and health and human service communities to assist with information, counseling, respite and formal services when needed; **and**

WHEREAS, the Columbus County Department of Aging and Adult Services, the Area Agencies on Aging, and many other human service agencies are committed to increasing the awareness of caregivers needs and continue to work to meet these needs.
