Agenda Items #1, #2 and #3: <u>MEETING CA</u>

MEETING CALLED to ORDER, INVOCATION and PLEDGE of ALLEGIANCE:

At 6:30 P.M., Chairman James E. Prevatte called the September 15, 2008 Columbus County Board of Commissioners Regular Session to order. The invocation was delivered by Commissioner Ronald Gore. Everyone in attendance stood and pledged Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America, which was led by Vice Chairman Bill Memory.

RE-ARRANGEMENT of AGENDA;

Chairman Prevatte stated due to a request made by Ms. Doris Dees, he is requesting that Agenda Item #12 be moved to Agenda Item #8.

MOTION:

Commissioner Bullard made a motion to move Agenda Item #12 to Agenda Item #8, seconded by Commissioner McKenzie. The motion unanimously passed. The following Agenda items will be numbered accordingly.

Agenda Item #4: <u>BOARD MINUTES APPROVAL</u>:

Commissioner Norris made a motion to approve the September 02, 2008 Regular Session Board Meeting Minutes, as recorded, seconded by Commissioner McKenzie. The motion unanimously passed.

Agenda Item #5: <u>AMENDMENT - JULY 21, 2008 REGULAR SESSION BOARD</u> <u>MEETING MINUTES</u>:

Leroy Sellers, Public Utilities Director, requested Board approval of the following amendment to the July 21, 2008 Regular Session Board Meeting Minutes for clarification purposes **only.**

Existing Verbiage (Page 683):

A brief discussion was conducted, among the Board members, relative to the amount expended per household would be in excess of forty-one thousand and 00/100 (\$41,000.00) dollars, and the <u>fact</u> that after the original thirty (30) houses were hooked onto the sewer line with the grant funds, the hookup fee would be seven thousand, five hundred and 00/100 (\$7,500.00) dollars, which amount could be financed by the County over an extended number of years.

<u>Recommended Amended Verbiage</u> (Page 683):

A brief discussion was conducted, among the Board members, relative to the amount expended per household would be in excess of forty-one thousand and 00/100 (\$41,000.00) dollars, and <u>the</u> original thirty (30) houses will be hooked onto the sewer line with CDBG grant funds. A hook

up fee of seven thousand, five hundred, and 00/100 (\$7,500.00) dollars would be required for some customers not on a CDBG grant, which could be financed by the County over an extended number of years.

Vice Chairman Memory made a motion to approve the amendment to the July 21, 2008 Columbus County Board of Commissioners Regular Session Board Meeting Minutes, seconded by Commissioner Norris. The motion unanimously passed.

Agenda Item #6: <u>PUBLIC INPUT</u>

Chairman Prevatte opened the floor for comments that anyone would like to make. The following spoke:

Sammie Hinson: stated the following:

- 1. I would like to thank the Board for moving forward with the re-districting issue;
- 2. This needed to be done a long time ago; and
- 3. All we are asking for is equal representation.

Agenda Item #7:RE-DISTRICTING ISSUES - PRESENTATION by ATTORNEYANITA EARLS:

Attorney Earls will made the following presentation to the Board relative to the re-districting issues. Ms. Earls stated the following:

- 1. I am pleased to be here and was here for the first time twenty (20) years ago when I litigated the Ward versus Columbus County Case;
- 2. I would like to commend you on the progress that I have seen in the County;
- 3. I want to talk to you tonight on the re-distircting issue.
- 4. I want to talk about two (2) issues:
 - a. In particular the Voting Rights Act and your obligation in re-districting under the Federal Voting Rights Act; **and**
 - b. The One-Person One-Vote requirement which is again a federal Constitutional requirement of Equal Protection Law;
- 5. In looking at this, I want to talk to you about a small problem that you have now which I think I can help you solve, and a problem that you could have that I know I can help you avoid;
- 6. In terms of the **Voting Rights Act**, there are **two (2) parts** of the Voting Rights Act:
 - a. **Section Two** which covers all the country, the entire country, so it applies everywhere in the nation, and it says that every person should have equal opportunity to participate in the political process. It is that part of the Voting Rights Act that the Federal Court back in 1991 said that the at-large system of election, the way it operates in Columbus County, violates that part of the Voting Rights Act. It denies minority voters equal opportunity to participate in the election process, the at-large system, combined with the voting patterns and the history of elections in the County. So, in light of that, the Federal Court said that the Plaintiff, in that case, the Citizens for Better Government of Columbus County, the group that I represented as Plaintiffs then, and the group that I still represent today. The Court said that those voters are entitled to a remedy that fully flaws the violation of the Voting Rights Act, and then held a hearing and plans were presented, and a seven (7) member district plan was adopted by the Court as a remedy for that Section Two Voting Rights Act violation. That is the plan that is currently still in effect today.
 - b. The second part of the Voting Rights Act, that I will touch on briefly, is **Section 5** of the Voting Rights Act. That is the part of the act that covers only part of the country. It is a temporary provision. It was just recently renewed by Congress for another twenty-five (25) years. Columbus County is one of the forty (40) counties in North Carolina that is covered by Section 5, and that requirement says that any change affecting voting, anything from moving a polling place to changing how you elect your Governing Body, any change has to be submitted to the Justice Department for what is called pre-clearance. There is an alternative you can go to the D.C. District Court and ask them to approve your change, but you have to do one (1) of those things before you can put the change into effect. So, any change affecting voting, including any change in the re-distircting plan, or any change in how you do re-distircting has to be pre-cleared by the Justice Department. When the

Justice Department considers whether or not to pre-clear a change, what they ask is if the change is retrogressive, and what retrogressive is, it is a legal term that means essentially - does the new practice or the new policy make minority voters worse off. If it does, then it is retrogressive, and the Justice Department will not approve it. A good example of the operation of Section 5 comes recently from the City of Fayetteville where they did try to change their method of electing the City Council. They were an all district system and they tried to go to a combined single district and some seats at large. The problem was that would decrease the ability of African-American voters in the city to elect a candidate of their choice and the Justice Department objected to their change, and they have to remain an all district, and that happened in 2006-2007. Just recently, after the new act was re-authorized, the Justice Department has objected to changes in North Carolina under Section 5 of the Voter Rights Act. I think what that means to your redistricting, is that you are governed by two (2) standards:

- There is a Federal Court Order that says you have to comply with Section 2 because the completely at-large system would violate Section Two; **and**
- You are governed by Section Five which says that any change has to be precleared by the Justice Department, so you have to keep in place a system that continues to provide minority voters an opportunity in two (2) of your seven (7) districts in order to receive pre-clearance.
- 7. Those are the problems I believe you can avoid, and you avoid them by keeping in place a plan that in at least two (2) districts continue to have a majority of African-American voters.
- 8. The problem that you have is the one-person one-vote problem. Your districts, under the Federal Constitution, need to be roughly the same size, so that each voter in each district has their vote carried the same way. The constitutional standard is that the overall deviation, in the size of the districts, should normally not be more than an overall ten (10%) percent. There are exceptional circumstances where because of geography or some other reason you have to have a higher deviation, but for the most cases, and throughout the country, and this is a constitutional standard so that it applies everywhere, you have to be within that ten (10%) percent overall deviation.
- 9. What happened to your districts, due to population shifts when the 2000 Census was taken, if you use the 2000 Census data with your current districts, the overall deviation is 18.31%, so you are above that ten (10%) percent threshold.
- 10. You could try to justify to a Court why you need to have that deviation, but it is very rare. There is very few places around the country where the Court will approve a greater than ten (10%) percent deviation.
- 11. The challenge that you are facing is how to get that deviation below the ten (10%) percent threshold, using the 2000 Census data.
- 12. There is an endless number of variations on districts, but let me talk about two (2) possible solutions to this problem:
 - a. The first is to re-draw the districts, and, on behalf of my clients, we enlisted the help of Bill Cooper who is a demographer, and he has come up with a couple of different alternatives for how you could re-draw the districts and try to respect to the extent of the core of your current districts, but re-draw them so that you meet the One-Person One-Vote Standard and you continue to have two (2) districts that provide for minority representation.
 - b. Second Alternative make a minor modification and get that deviation below ten (10%) percent. The modification involves two (2) steps:
 - First you would have to decide that in your re-districting plan you don't want 1. to count the prison population because there is a prison farm account in District 7 that's about, at least, and all of this is based on the 2000 Census data, and using the 2000 Census data, I believe is six hundred eighty-six (686) people. We know that they are not voters, and so a number of Federal Courts have said that it is permissible to discount a prison population because they are not voters, and so in calculating your One-Person One-Vote balance so that each voter's vote has equal weight, it is permissible to not count that prison population. Around the country, practice varies. A lot of larger districts, or Congressional districts, it really doesn't make a difference one way or the other because you are talking about a district of over one hundred thousand (100,000) people, and six hundred eighty-six (686) people don't make the deviation up. But when you are talking small jurisdictions, small number of people, seven (7) districts, then six hundred eighty-six (686) people actually does make a lot of difference, and when you don't count that population; and

- 2. You move two or three (2 or 3) precincts that you would need to move in Whiteville, from out of District II because it is slightly over populated, and move into District IV. If you make those two (2) changes 1) don't count the prison population; and, 2) move a few precincts in Whiteville, then you would get the overall deviation under ten (10%) percent, and you would be legal under the One-Person One-Vote Standard. The important thing to remember is that whatever you do, you will have to re-evaluate the districts following the 2010 Census. So, whatever you do to the 2010 election, you will have something different by 2012. The 2010 Census data will come out in early 2011, and you will have to evaluate the One-Person One-Vote requirement at that point.
- 13. There is a lot of justification for making a minor modification now, keeping the districts essentially as they are and then re-evaluate based on the 2010 Census Data.
- 14. I will talk about how to make this as low cost and low burden as possible. We are very willing to, my clients are very willing to make Mr. Cooper available to you with re-drawing the districts, and whatever arrangements seem to make sense. He has already done a lot of work with the maps in the County and has had some discussions with the folks that have the data here in the County, so if there is any way that working with him can be helpful to you, we really would like to offer that.
- 15. It is still very important to my clients that they continue to have a voice in the Local Government, and they continue to have an opportunity to elect candidates of their choice, and so, whatever you do, they will be working with me to make sure it complies with the Voting Rights Act and that it is consistent with the Court Order that was obtained back in 1991.

QUESTIONS and ANSWERS / COMMENTS:

Commissioner McKenzie: Is the minor modification between District II and District IV the least expensive way we could go?

Anita Earls: Absolutely, because it is the least expensive on a number of levels. I believe it would involve very little work with the demographer so his time would not be that expensive and it also means very little changing of districts for voters so you don't have to send out new voter cards to people and you don't have to suffer election administration costs.

Commissioner Gore: With the two (2) alternatives that you were talking about earlier, eliminating the prison population and moving two or three (2 or 3) precincts out of Whiteville, what kind of time frame are we looking at, if we start that process and we decide that is the way we want to go, to get all this completed, and I know we got to petition the Court to start with?

Anita Earls: The process is as follows:

- 1. There is also the sixty (60) day period for review by the Justice Department, but my sense is that it should not take too long to get a hearing, especially if all the parties are coming to Court saying that we both agree and this is the right thing that needs to be done, then it should not take long for a Court to review it and approve it. If you have a requirement for an expedited consideration, sometimes it takes less than sixty (60) days, but the regulations, under Section 5, require them to issue a determination within sixty (60) days.
- 2. At the end of that process, then there is also the time it takes to implement it by the Board of Elections, and I don't know what they would say on how long they would need, but I think you are looking at four to six (4-6) months for your part of the process, and then the Board of Elections.

Commissioner Gore: How many months would it take for the Board of Elections, possibly a year? **Anita Earls:** I don't think the Board of Elections would take that long, but then again it depends on how much of a change you are making. If you are only moving a couple of census blocks, then you are only affecting one or two (1 or 2) precincts, and it would not take them long to put the changes into their system.

Vice Chairman Memory: Ms. Earls, who do you work for?

Anita Earls: Columbus County Concerned Citizens for Better Government.

Vice Chairman Memory: We are going to have to do this in 2011, and at that time we will have ten (10) years of change for the 2012 election, is that correct?

Anita Earls: That is correct. However the population grew or shifted between 2000 and 2010 is what you have to take into consideration.

Vice Chairman Memory: If the minorities in the County had shifted, then the districts would need to be re-drawn to ensure minority representation on the Board, is that correct? **Anita Earls:** That is correct.

Vice Chairman Memory: We can spend a lot less money in 2008 than in 2011, and come within the One-Person One-Vote Act.

Anita Earls: What it will costs is the demographer's time.

Vice Chairman Memory: We are going to need a demographer for sure in 2011, and spend a lot less money in 2008.

Commissioner Bullard: It is my opinion that if the two (2) alternatives you have suggested will keep in the legal requirements, we should do them, and I want to be fair to everyone and be in compliance with the law.

Commissioner Norris: What is the estimated price that you think it will cost us to do this? **Anita Earls:** That depends on whether you feel the need to have the demographer to come down and meet with you in person or whether you are comfortable with him talking with your County Planning Department which can give him data to replicate his maps, and you feel confident for him just to talk to them, he will not charge you just to do that part of it. It could cost as much as whatever time your County Planning Department time is valued at to five to six thousand and 00/100 (\$5,000,00 to \$6,000.00) dollars for Bill Coopers's outside, to come in at his travel costs and his time to meet with you, and you can get other estimates for this service.

Chairman Prevatte: My biggest concern is that the maps that we received in February showed the lines being drawn right through some people's yards. If moving some parts of the districts into other districts would mean that we would be in legal compliance, then I don't have a problem with that. Does that mean the maps we got in February are accurate, or are we looking at something different, then we need to have the demographer come down here and talk to us face-to-face and we can ask questions of him, and that way he could give us an estimate of how much it would cost. Is that correct?

Anita Earls: If there is any problems with the data that he had not matching up with the County's physical features, then those need to be corrected. I don't know if he has to come here to correct them. I think what he can do effectively in person is to answer your questions, and in particular if he suggests one change and you want to look at what the different changes are. The maps that we submitted earlier were a suggestion. We just ask him to redraw the plan taking into account traditional re-districting criteria and also maintain the two (2) districts to continue to be effective districts for African-American voters. That is all we ask him to do. He said it was possible to do that with the 2000 Census data. It could have been the case that the changes were big enough that he couldn't keep the two (2) districts, or that amount is just intended to show it really is possible to keep those two (2) districts.

Commissioner McKenzie: On that map that we received, it is recommending taking Fair Bluff and Cerro Gordo out of District II, did he send that recommendation to you or did you make that recommendation?

Anita Earls: Our only instructions to him were is it possible to use the 2000 Census data, and we just ask him to apply traditional re-districting principles where you try to keep precincts together as much as possible, you try to respect subdivision boundaries as much as possible. If you don't have to split a town, you try not to. We just said follow the traditional re-districting principles to the extent that you can. Keep the districts as close to what they are now as you can, although they are changes, and see if it's possible to continue to have two (2) districts that provide for minority population. There are a number of different variations. He has looked at another draft since the February draft that would put parts of Cerro Gordo back into District I. Once you go to substantial re-drawing instead of minor change, then the options are kind of endless and you need to know what the impact is on the numbers, including the impact on the overall deviation to make various changes. If he were to come with his computer with the map on it, and he could make changes as you are talking, then he could tell you what the impact of that change verses the impact of another change. But, we did not give him anything specific beyond what I said earlier.

Commissioner Gore: We have got to maintain the integrity of the minority districts, and that is a must. I also think we need to look at the least expensive way to get out of this problem, because we will have to look at this again in the near future. If we can make two (2) minor changes, and take care of the prison population and move two or three (2 or 3) voting precincts around., then we need to go in this direction.

Commissioner McKenzie: We need to maintain the minority districts.

Vice Chairman Memory: I do agree that we should choose the least expensive method at this time, knowing that this will have to be repeated in eighteen (18) months.

Commissioner Bullard: Any time you look at re-dstricting, it will affect each Commissioners's district, but we need to strive to do what is right for the citizens, and to not interfere with the demographer.

Commissioner McKenzie: As a result of a court case, there are two (2) districts in which a minority can get elected, whereas, in the other five (5) districts, they probably would not. We do need to stay in compliance with the legal requirements and choose the most effective way for this to work at the least expensive cost.

Vice Chairman Memory: For clarification purposes, is this the proper procedure to follow:

- 1. This Board meets and decides which way we would like for this to be done;
- 2. We bring our decision to you as attorney for the Plaintiffs, and our attorney, for the Ward versus Columbus County Case;
- 3. After this has transpired, it goes to the Justice Department and ask them for approval;
- 4. After approval by the Justice Department, then our Board of Elections makes the necessary changes they need to make.

Is this correct?

Anita Earls: Yes, except there is an added step that we would want to go to the Federal Court as well to let them know that we agree on this modification of the districts.

Vice Chairman Memory: And you think all of this can be done in four to six (4-6) months? **Anita Earls:** Yes., I believe it could be.

MOTION:

Vice Chairman Memory made a motion to accept the information that has been given to the Columbus County Board of Commissioners, and that at a future date the Chairman and the Clerk get together with the demographer and set up a time when he can come, and each Board member be informed when that date will be, seconded by Commissioner Norris. The motion unanimously passed.

Agenda Item #8: <u>BICENTENNIAL COMMITTEE - UPDATE</u>:

Doris Dees, member of the Bicentennial Committee, delivered the following update to the Board on this committee.

- 1. I serve on the Bicentennial Committee representing Southeastern Community College;
- 2. The Committee is doing well but could be doing better if we had more warm bodies and some green backs;
- 3. We are having a parade and we need money to sponsor some of the bands for their travel expenses;
- 4. We will have two (2) stages of entertainment going on at the same time and these festivities will be held at the Columbus County Fairgrounds, we will have church choirs and dance groups;
- 5. Some of your appointees have never attended a meeting and we are having trouble getting a quorum, and I would like for you to contact your appointees;
- 6. We will have fireworks, but the chair of that sub-committee stopped coming and we don't know the inside details yet;
- 7. We will have all of the church bells, in the county, ringing at certain times;
- 8. We will have displays of Crusoe dug-out canoes
- 9. There will be essay contests for 4th graders and 8th graders, and we hope we will be able to get prizes for them;
- 10. We have a pictorial book, traveling historic plaque display, blue grass performance, historic book which has already been published;
- 11. Visiting dignitaries;
- 12. Historic costumes;
- 13. Possible display and presentation by each town/city;
- 14. Presentation by county churches;
- 15. We will have forestry machinery, classic tractors, classic cars, impersonation of Christopher Columbus, native American dances, local artist displays, book displays, museum displays, historical radios and televisions, tree plantings and a time capsule;
- 16. We plan for this to be a fun day and we would like for everyone to be present; and
- 17. This has been scheduled for November 22, 2008, at 10:00 A.M., possibly.

Agenda Item #9:ESTABLISHMENT of PUBLIC HEARING for CDBG (2006) GRANT
NUMBER 06-C-1507 - APPROVAL of PROGRAM AMENDMENT:

Floyd Adams, The Adams Company, Incorporated, requested the Board to establish a Public Hearing for October 06, 2008, at 7:00 P.M., for the approval of a Program Amendment to the CDBG (2006) Grant Number 06-C-1507. In the absence of Floyd Adams, Chairman Prevatte stated the following:

- 1. This grant has had several houses drop out for various reasons;
- 2. Excess funds are being projected;
- 3. In order to reallocate these funds to do additional work, the County must submit a Program Amendment; **and**
- 4. The process will require a Public Hearing.

Vice Chairman Memory made a motion to establish October 6, 2008, at 7:00 P.M., as the date and time for a public hearing to be held for the CDBG (2006) Grant Number 06-C-1507 Program Amendment, seconded by Commissioner Norris. The motion unanimously passed.

Agenda Item #9: SOCIAL SERVICES - DESIGNATION of STANDARD or ELECTING STATUS for the WORK FIRST PROGRAM:

Linda Fry, Social Services Director, requested the Board to designate the status of Columbus County as a Standard or Electing county for the Work First Program.

Commissioner Gore made a motion to designate the status of Columbus County as a Standard county for the Work First Program, seconded by Commissioner McKenzie. The motion unanimously passed.

Agenda Item #11: <u>FINANCE - RECOMMENDATION on BANKING SERVICES</u>:

Bobbie Faircloth, Interim Finance Director, presented the following recommendation to the Board on the banking services for Columbus County. Ms. Faircloth stated the following:

- 1. I sent out the packages for the banking services;
- 2. We had four (4) banks to respond;
- 3. Out of the four (4) banks that responded, it is my recommendation that we remain with BB&T due to the greater interest rate they are providing to Columbus County on the funds that are sitting in the accounts;
- 4. The other banks did propose no fees on anything, but BB&T provides this same service and does not charge us for stop payment on our checks, and provides us checks and deposit slips free of charge; **and**
- 5. The basic services that we get from any bank are uniform as to the kind of accounts we can have.

Commissioner Bullard made a motion to accept Ms. Faircloth's recommendation of remaining with BB&T for the banking services for Columbus County, seconded by Commissioner Gore. The motion unanimously passed.

Agenda Item #12:GOVERNING BODY - APPROVAL of AMENDMENTS to RULES of
PROCEDURE - RULES 8 and 10:

Chairman Prevatte requested Board approval of the following two (2) amendments to the Rules of Procedure for the Columbus County Board of Commissioners. (**This will be the second reading.**)

RULE 8: PUBLIC ADDRESS TO THE BOARD

There shall be a time set aside at each regular meeting of the Board of Commissioners for public comment. The meeting Agenda shall be followed as outlined in the Columbus County Commissioner's Board Package and as posted on the Public Agenda prior in the meeting room, unless modified by the Chairman, with the consent of the majority of the Board of Commissioners. The following procedure will be followed for public comment on any agenda or non-agenda items at meetings of the Board of Commissioners.

- 1. The Board shall allow public comment. The maximum amount of time set aside for public comment shall be thirty (30) minutes.
- 2. **Regardless of whether a topic is on or not on the Agenda**, anyone wishing to speak shall complete an index card supplied by the County, on which they will provide their name, address and telephone number. They shall identify the topic they wish to address, *indicate whether the topic is on or not on the Agenda*, and include all pertinent information. These cards are to be presented to the County Clerk, who will give each card a number in the order in which it is received.
- 3. When the Board reaches that portion of the meeting when public comments are permitted, the Chairman will recognize those wishing to speak in the numerical order shown on the cards. Individuals who are recognized will come to the podium and give their name and address. They will then be allowed three (3) minutes in which to present comments and the County Attorney will keep the time for that period. A person may only speak once during the period allotted for all comments. There shall be no yielding of time or allowance for one speaker to utilize another's time when addressing the Board of Commissioners. One must speak on his or her concern, or the concern of the general public as a whole. Only an attorney who represents that person may address the Board of Commissioners about a specific problem of another individual.
- 4. The Board is not required to comment on matters brought to the Board during this time, **da** may decline to take action on a request which is presented during the public comment portion of the meeting. Such request may instead be referred to the County Administrator, the County Attorney or other appropriate individual for investigation and action, or for a future report back to the Board.
- 5. Proper order will be maintained at all times during the meeting and the members of the audience shall be polite and courteous to all speakers at all times, regardless of their respective position. Only the speaker at the podium will be allowed to address the Board of Commissioners, or to make comments during the presentation.
- 6. The Chairman, at his/her discretion, may recognize persons to speak during the regular Agenda who did not speak or are not scheduled to speak during the Public Input portion of the Agenda. The Chairman shall make a reasonable effort to recognize reasonably perceived opponents and proponents of a particular measure, if applicable.

(Adopted 2-2-04; Revised 09-15- 2008)

RULE 10: POWERS OF THE CHAIRPERSON

The Chairman of the Board shall be elected annually for a term of one (1) year and shall not be removed from the office of chair unless he or she becomes disqualified to serve as a member of the Board.

The Chairperson shall preside at meetings of the Board. In the Chairperson's absence, the Vice-Chairperson shall preside and shall have all the powers specified herein. If the Chairman and Vice-Chairman are both absent from the meeting, the Columbus County Attorney shall convene the meeting and the remaining members shall elect a Board member to preside for that meeting or until either the Chairperson or Vice-Chairperson appears. A member must be recognized by the Chairperson in order to address the Board. The Chairperson shall have the following powers:

- 1. To rule motions in or out of order, including the right to rule out of order any motion patently offered for obstructive or dilatory purposes;
- 2. To establish time restraints for discussion, except for matters requiring a quasi-judicial public hearing;
- 3. To determine whether a speaker has gone beyond reasonable standards of courtesy in his/her remarks and to entertain and rule on objections from other members on this ground;
- 4. To entertain or refer to the County Attorney questions of parliamentary law or procedure;
- 5. To call a brief recess when needed;

- 6. To adjourn in an emergency;
- 7. To conduct public hearings as otherwise provided for herein; and
- 8. To direct any person to leave the meeting when the person willfully interrupts, disturbs, or disrupts the meeting. Any person who fails to leave the meeting after being directed to do so by the Chairman shall be removed by the Sheriff and charged with a misdemeanor pursuant to applicable North Carolina law.
- 9. The Chairman, at his/her discretion, may recognize persons to speak during the regular Agenda who did not speak or are not scheduled to speak during the Public Input portion of the Agenda. The Chairman shall make a reasonable effort to recognize reasonably perceived opponents and proponents of a particular measure, if applicable.
